Three-Day 'Online Painting Workshop' organized by the Department of Students Welfare, University of Jammu concluded today with the exhibition of the artistic work created by children during the workshop. Prof. Manoj K. Dhar, Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu was the Chief Guest at the occasion who not only appreciated the creative works presented by children but also complimented their parents for utilizing the time of their wards in constructive pursuits.
