Sh B R Sharma, IAS (Retd), Chairman Public Service Commission and Chairman of IIPA, J&K Regional Branch and Dr. Ashok Bhan, IPS (Retd), Patron of IIPA, J&K Regional Branch also attended the prize distribution function. Mrs. Swarna Aivalli along with her family joined the event from Delhi and conveyed their wishes. Sh. While speaking on the topic of the debate, he was of the view that a hybrid model of learning can enhance the teaching –learning process in the long run. Prof Manoj Dhar in his address while the pandemic has forced the educational institutions to move to online mode, the joy of learning in the physical mode cannot be replaced.
