## 72<sup>nd</sup> Republic Day of India Celebrations at University of Jammu.

The 72<sup>nd</sup> Republic Day of India was celebrated at the University of Jammu with great enthusiasm & patriotic fervour, it was attended by teaching faculty, officers, staff and students of the University of Jammu. Prof. Manoj K.
