MoU between High Altitude Warfare School (HAWS) & University of Jammu(UoJ) dated 03 May 2023.

GENERAL

HAWS conducts Mountain/ Winter Warfare (Basic) & Mountain/ Winter Warfare (Advance) Courses for service personals from Indian Army, Indian Air Force, Indian Navy, Central Armed Police Forces and Friendly Foreign Countries. Details of the courses conducted are as under:-

These courses are conducted in Mountainous, Extreme High Altitude Area, Glaciated and Snow Bound Terrains. By the end of the course the students are proficient enough to undertake any kind of missions including Humanitarian Assistance & Disaster Relief (HADR) operation in these areas. By the virtue of the practical nature of training and dynamic state of environmental condition the instructors of this establishment are highly trained and proficient in negotiating these unforgiving terrains for undertaking disaster relief and rescue activities. Apart from conducting the regular courses, instructors are regularly employed in training Avalanche Rescue Teams and Mountain Rescue Teams of the Armed Forces. Since its inception High Altitude Warfare School has undertaken a number of disaster relief and rescue operations along with civil administration. This varied and continuously growing expertise of HAWS in the field of Disaster Management provides an upper edge to the personnel and students of this establishment for operation in the mountainous terrain. Grant of civilian certificate, diploma or degree to these qualified personnel and students of High Altitude Warfare School in the subject of Disaster Management from a recognized University of India will result in enhancement of individual academic qualification of immense benefit. Such an affiliation with a recognized University of India will also enhance this establishment's domain expertise from mutual interactions with academic faculty of the University.

UoJ, an 'A+' Grade NAAC Accredited University, runs academic programmes in Disaster Management and is most suited for mutual beneficial affiliation for grant of academic qualification in the subject to the personnel and students of High Altitude Warfare School.On 3rd May 2023, a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) was signed between HAWS and UoJ which allowed students undergoing Mountain Warfare and Winter Warfare Courses at HAWS to be awarded Certificate/Diploma in Mountain Craft & DisasterManagement/Snow Craft & Disaster Management by UoJ. Also the posted instructor staff involved in training will be awarded Under Graduate (UG)/ Post Graduate (PG) Degree on successful completion of laid down tour of duty & successfully passing the prescribed examination.

AIM

To lay down the procedure for award of Diploma to students undergoing Mountain/ Winter Warfare Courses at HAWS.

Jammu University Component

The Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) outlines the collaborative role of University of Jammu and the HAWS in the awarding of diploma to the trainees at HAWS. The University faculty (Disaster Management Centre, Department of Geology) will serve as key contributors in curriculum development, ensuring that the program incorporates the latest research findings and best practices in the field. University faculty members shall also engage in teaching (Blended mode) and mentoring students, imparting theoretical insights and experience of the University faculty alongside the specialized training provided by the HAWS.

Besides, the faculty members of the Geology Department in collaboration with HAWS shall formulate/design comprehensive and thorough examination processes for various courses to be run under MOU. They will contribute their academic expertise to ensure that the examination format make parallels with standards of the University to uphold academic integrity and assesses the students' knowledge and skills effectively. The University faculty shall be also involved in creating examination papers, marking schemes, and grading criteria, ensuring fairness and accuracy in the evaluation process and also providing valuable insights for continuous improvement from time to time.

ELIGIBILITY & REGISTRATION

Eligibility

<u>Eligibility for Diploma</u>: All service personnel nominated to undergo Mountain/ Winter Warfare Course will be eligible for registering for award of Diploma.

Admission/ Registration Form

Enrolment

The admission form of the candidate must be verified by the Incharge training officer at HAWS and sent to the "The Director, Disaster Management Centre, Department of Geology, University of Jammu, Jammu-180006".

The prescribed fee as given under along with Admission Form fee of ₹1000 (Rupees One Thousand Only) will be deposited through Net Banking/ UPI into Bank Account of 'Faculty of Study, HAWS', while filling the Admission Form. Remittance of the prescribed fee to UoJ will be done by HAWS.

AWARD OF ACADEMIC CREDENTIALS

Mode of Examination

The mode of examination for the Diploma courses for HAWS trainers shall be of continuous mode which refers to an assessment method that emphasizes regular evaluation and ongoing assessment throughout a given period of the course which is contrary to a single final examination at the end of a course. This approach aims to assess students' progress and learning outcomes consistently and it involves various evaluation components such as assignments, projects, presentations, and periodic tests (bi-monthly), and spread throughout the duration of the course. The basic purpose and emphasis on continuous mode of examination is to assess students continuously keeping in mind the courses which have practical applicability and to move away from memorization to a deeper understanding of the subject matter, promoting a more comprehensive learning experience and to get timely feedback and address any gaps in understanding.

Award of Diploma

A service personal successfully qualifying on both Mountain/ Winter Warfare (Basic) Course as well as Mountain/ Winter Warfare (Advance) Course will be awarded Diploma. The credit point equivalence of syllabus and duration of Mountain Warfare (Basic & Advance) Course and Winter Warfare (Basic & Advance) Course makes the student eligible for award of "Diploma in Mountain Craft & Disaster Management". Credit Points equivalence for these courses is attached as Appendix 'B'.

The students will undergo both theory & practical tests for the subjects as laid down in the syllabus. The record of the same will be forwarded by training team to Department of Geology, University of Jammu for authentication. The record of award of marks, question papers & answer sheets of the students will be preserved at HAWS for five years.
