REVISED STATUTES GOVERNING BASIC B.SC. NURSING DEGREE PROGRAM AS PER INDIAN NURSING COUNCIL (INC revised regulations and curriculum, 2020 notified vide dated 5<sup>th</sup> July 2021 in gazette of India: extraordinary part III-section 4)

# 1. ADMISSION TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Subject to the provisions of the Act and the general policy of the University, the admission to the course shall be open to the candidates having:

# 1.1 Minimum Educational Qualification:

- a. Passed the qualifying 12<sup>th</sup> standard (10+2) examination or an equivalent examination from a recognized board and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together and passed in English individually. However candidates claiming under reserved categories SC/ST/OBC/PWD, the minimum required percentage for admission shall be 40%.
- b. Candidates are also eligible from state open school recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government having Science subjects and English only.

c. English is Compulsory subject in 10+2 for being eligible for admission to B.Sc Nursing.

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#### 1.2 Medical Fitness

- a. Candidates shall be medically fit.
- b. Colour blind candidates are eligible provided that colour corrective contact lens and spectacles are worn by such candidates.
- 1.3 Married candidates are also eligible for admission.
- 1.4 Students shall be admitted once in a year.
- 1.5Age:

The minimum age for Admission shall be 17 Years on 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year in which admission is sought. The maximum age limit for admission shall be 35 Years.

- 1.6 Selection for Admission to BSc Nursing
- a. Selection of candidates shall be based on the merit of the entrance examination and entrance test shall comprise of
  - Aptitude for Nursing- 20 Marks
  - Physics- 20 Marks
  - Chemistry- 20 Marks
  - Biology 20 Marks
  - English 20 Marks
  - b. The minimum qualifying criteria of entrance test for admission to B.Sc Nursing is as under:
    - General 50<sup>th</sup> percentile
    - SC/ST/OBC- 40<sup>th</sup> percentile
    - General PWD 45<sup>th</sup> percentile
    - SC/ST/OBC- PWD 40<sup>th</sup> percentile

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### 1.7 Reservation Policy:

Admission under the reserved quota shall be subject to reservation policy and eligibility criteria for SC/ST/OBC/EWS (Economically Weaker Section)/PWD (Person With Disability) prescribed by the Central Govt./State Govt./ Union Territory as applicable to the College concerned.

a. Reservation for Persons with SC/ST/OBC:

In respect of candidates belonging to SC/ST/OBC the marks obtained in 3 subjects Physics, Chemistry, Biology shall be 40% and passed in English individually.

- b. Reservation for Persons With Disability (PWD):
- 5% Disability reservation to be considered for disabled candidates with a
  disability of loco-motor to the tune of 40% to 50% of the lower extremity
  and other eligibility criteria with regard to qualification will be same as
  prescribed for general category candidates. The upper age limit shall be
  relaxed by 5 years for disabled candidates.
  - A committee to be formed consisting of medical officer authorized by medical board of state government and a nursing expert in the panel which may decide whether the candidates have the disability of loco-motor to the tune of 40-50% of lower extremity.
  - Reservation shall be applicable within the sanctioned number of seats.

  - Examination and Preparatory Holidays: 2 weeks

#### **5 EXAMINATION REGULATIONS:**

- 5.1Applied Anatomy and Applied Physiology: Question paper will consist of Section –A Applied Anatomy of 37 marks and Section – B Applied Physiology of 38 marks.
- 5.2 Applied Sociology and Applied Psychology: Question paper will consist of Section –A Applied Sociology of 37 marks and Section – B Applied Psychology of 38 marks.
- 5.3 Applied Microbiology and Infection Control including Safety: Question paper will consist of Section-A Applied Microbiology of 37 marks and Section –B Infection Control including Safety of 38 marks.
- 5.4 Applied Biochemistry and Applied Nutrition and Dietetics: Question paper will consist of Section –A Applied Biochemistry with 25 marks and Section- B Applied Nutrition and Dietetics with 50 marks.
- 5.5 Pharmacology, Genetics and Pathology: Question paper will consist of Section-A of Pharmacology with 38 marks, Section -B of Pathology with 25 marks and Genetics with 12 marks.

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- 5.6 Nursing Research and Statistics: Nursing Research should be of 55 marks and Statistics of 20 marks.
- 5.7 A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in each course/subject for appearing for examination.
- 5.8 A candidate must have 100% of attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.
- 5.9 Following exams shall be conducted as College exams. The minimum pass marks percentage is 50% except for Communicative English. The marks for all the college exams listed below alongside all other University exams must be sent to the University for Inclusion in the mark sheet and shall be considered for calculating aggregate and ranking for awards by University.
  - a. Communicative English
  - b. Health/Nursing Informatics and Technology
  - c. Professionalism ,Professional Values and Ethics including Bioethics
  - d. Introduction to Forensic Nursing & Indian Laws

Award of rank will not be considered for those who fail in one or more courses and must have completed the program by 4 years.

The mark sheet with grades and grade point average shall be given by the University for all courses.

Communicative English and Elective modules are not included for calculating Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA).

5.10Minimum Pass mark percentage shall be 40% for Communicative English and

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in each of the Elective modules. All Elective modules must be completed as indicated in specified semester and pass marks sent to University before appearing for final examination.

- 5.11 Minimum Pass marks percentage shall be 50 % in each of the Theory and practical paper separately except in English.
- 5.12The candidate has to pass in all mandatory modules placed within courses and the pass mark percentage for each module is 50%.
- 5.13A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
- 5.14If a candidate fails either in theory or practical, he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical).
- 5.15If the candidate has failed in only one subject and has passed in all the other subjects of a particular semester and Grace marks of up to 5 marks to theory marks can be added for one course / subject only, provided that by such an addition the student passes the semester examination.
- 5.16The candidate shall appear for exams in each semester.
  - a. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examinations before appearing for fifth semester examination. However, the candidate shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
  - b. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examinations before appearing for the seventh semester examination. However, the candidate shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
  - c. The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examinations before appearing for eighth semester.
  - d. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.

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- 5.17The candidate has to pass separately in internal and external examination (shall be reflected in the marks sheet). No institution shall submit average internal marks of the students not more than 75 % (i.e. if 40 students are admitted in a course the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75% of the total internal marks).
- 5.18At least 50% of the Non- nursing subjects like Applied Anatomy & Physiology, Applied Biochemistry, Applied Psychology & Sociology, Applied Microbiology, Pharmacology, Genetics, Nutrition & Dietetics, Communicative English and Health /Nursing Informatics & Technology should be taught by the Nursing teachers. Teachers who are involved in teaching non- nursing subjects can be the examiners for the program.
- 5.19Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day. Particular semester and of same institution batch shall be examined by the same set of examiners.
- 5.20 All practical examinations shall be held in the respective clinical areas.
- 5.21 One internal and one external examiner shall jointly conduct practical examination for each student.
- 5.22An examiner for theory and practical /OSCE examination shall be an Assistant Professor or above in a College of Nursing with M.Sc (Nursing) in concerned subject and minimum 3 years of teaching experience. To be an examiner for Nursing Foundation course, the faculty having M.Sc. (Nursing) with any specialty shall be considered.
- 5.23 Examiner for Competency Assessment- VIII Semester: There must be a total of five examiners, one from each specialty i.e. External examiners- 2 and Internal examiners-3. The internal examiners may be from the college faculty or from hospital with the required qualification and experience i.e. M.Sc

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(Nursing) in respective specialty with minimum three years of teaching experience.

#### 6 ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

## 6.11 Grading of Performance

Based on the performance, each student shall be awarded a final grade at the end of the semester for each course. Absolute grading is used by converting the marks to grade, based on predetermined class intervals.

# 7 EXAMINATION:

7.11 There shall be one regular examination after completion of each semester on such dates as approved by the Controller of examinations.

# 7.12 Examination forms and fee:

- a. The examination forms prescribed by the University along with the prescribed fee must reach the Controller of Examinations at least one month before the date of commencement of the regular examination. Late fee shall be charged if the forms and the fee are received thereafter.
- b. The fee so prescribed is subject to the change as per the University notification from time to time.

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### 7.13 Eligibility for the examination:

- Regular candidate shall produce the following three certificates signed by the Principal of the College:
  - Certificate of good character.
  - Certificate that the candidate attended the required number of lectures as prescribed under statutes.
  - Certificate that the candidate has qualified the sessionals/ clinicals etc.
- b. The candidate who was otherwise eligible to appear in the regular examination in particular semester but:
  - Could not appear or fill the examination form due to genuine reason (to be certified by an appropriate authority)
  - Was unable to pass the examination in any paper(s) can appear in the next semester examination along with the regular semester examination.
- c. The candidate who does not have adequate attendance to appear in the regular examination will take up the said examination in the next semester examination after acquiring the required attendance.

#### 8 ATTENDANCE:

- 8.1 Subject to the Provisions of these statutes no candidate shall be eligible to appear in the examination unless he/she has minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of the absence in theory and practical/clinical in each subject for appearing in the examination).
- 8.2 For award of degree unless he/she has 100% attendance in each of practical/clinical areas.
- 8.3 The teacher concerned shall submit the attendance statement of the concerned students to the Head of the Department/Principal within 5 days after the class

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work of the semester is over.

#### 8.4 Condonation:

When any candidate falls short of attendance in any semester it may be condoned after sufficient cause is shown by him/her in writing in this regard:

- a. By the Principal of the College up to Maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered in all the papers.
- b. In addition to above a maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered may also be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor only when it is endorsed and recommended by the Principal of the College.

# 9. PARTICIPATION IN SPORT EVENTS:

- 9.1 The candidate who participates in any one or more of the activities/events as specified in the University Statues shall be treated as present on all working days not exceeding 15 days in one semester. The candidate must produce a copy of the certificate to the Head of the Department/ Principal of the College within seven days from the end of the activity/event, failing which no such benefit shall be given.
- 9.2 The authority competent to issue the candidate participation certificate shall bring to the notice of the Head of the Department, name, roll no. of the candidate and the date(s) on which the activities were conducted within a week's period from the end of the event.

#### 10. PROMOTION:

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- 10.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in the statute or regulation, promotion to the next higher class shall be made from the next day following completion of each semester examination.
- 10.2 The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examinations before appearing for fifth semester examination. However, the candidates shall be permitted to attend the consecutive classes.
- 10.3 The candidate shall have cleared all the previous examination before appearing for seventh semester examination. However, the candidate shall be permitted to attend the consecutive semesters.
- 10.4 The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years.

#### 11. REEVALUATION/RETOTALING OF ANSWER PAPERS:

Reevaluation of answer scripts is not permitted. Only re-totaling of marks of theory papers is allowed in the failed subject sand that too if only if it is applied through the college.

#### 12. GRACE MARKS:

If the student has failed in only one subject and has passed in all the other subjects of particular semester and grace marks up to 5 marks to theory marks can be added for one course/subject only provided that by such an addition the student passes the semester examination.

# 13. APPOINTMENT AND ELIGIBILITY OF THE EXAMINERS:

13.1Evaluation will be done by Nursing teachers only.

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- 13.2An examiner for theory and practical/ OSCE examination shall be an Assistant Professor or above in a College of Nursing with M.Sc Nursing in concerned subject and minimum 3 years of teaching experience. To be an examiner for Nursing Foundation course, the faculty having M.Sc Nursing with any speciality shall be considered.
- 13.3 There shall be separate set of practical examiners (Internal & External) for each Nursing College with internal examiner from the concerned College/ Institution.
- 13.4One internal and one external examiner shall jointly conduct practical examination for each student and the award sheet containing the marks of practical examination shall be compiled and signed by the external and internal examiners before it is submitted to the University.
- 13.5 All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.
- 13.6Maximum number of candidates for practical examination shall not exceed 20 per day and all the candidates of same institution batch shall be examined by the same set of examiners.
- 13.7The examiner can be appointed from the same/other university as external examiner if she/he meets the criteria.
- 13.8 Award sheet containing marks of theory along with answer sheets duly evaluated and signed by the external examiner shall be submitted to the University.
- 13.9External Examiner shall rotate at an interval of three years.
- 13.10The external and internal examiners shall be appointed by the University from the panel of examiners (external & internal) submitted by the respective Nursing College.

13.11Interpretation if any shall be determined by the Vice- Chancellor in

- 17.1 Mercy chance will only be applicable to those candidates who have completed the Nursing course (Theory and Practical Hours) in prescribed maximum time limit (double the duration of the course) but unable to clear the final year examinations of the respective course within the prescribed maximum duration.
- 17.2 Mercy chance is not applicable to those candidates who discontinue or rejoin the course.
- 17.3 The candidate is eligible to appear in the mercy chance examination to be conducted by the University after she/he shall qualify the Basic mercy chance examination conducted by the State Nursing Council.
- 17.4 The candidate shall be granted maximum of two attempts for University examinations.
- 17.5 If the candidate unable to qualify the University examination within two attempts then no further mercy chance will be allowed.
- 17.6 The Basic mercy chance examination shall be conducted by State Nursing Council.

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- a. The maximum number of attempts for basic mercy chance examination conducted by State Nursing council shall be two only.
- b. The candidate shall qualify the University examinations within a period of one year of passing the basic mercy chance examination conducted by State Nursing Council.
- c. Duration of the basic mercy chance examination to be conducted by the State Nursing Council shall be 2 (Two) Hours.
