### PROPOSED STATUTES GOVERNING INTEGRATED PROGRAMME IN ENGLISH

### **SESSION 2020 ONWARDS**

### 1. INTRODUCTION

In a globalised society, the English language has assumed a great significance. Consequently a wide gamut of literature is available in English, most created in it as first or second language and some translated into it. English Literature, therefore, has become a repertoire of world culture, knowledge and communication. It has become indispensable for professional competence and growth. In keeping with the requirements of the current global job market, the M.A English (Integrated) Programme aims to strengthen the understanding and broaden the horizon of the students with respect to literatures across the world and also develop a knowledge base that cuts across disciplines. Further it aims to strengthen their self expression, orally as well as in writing, which is invaluable in every aspect of life. The possible avenues for these graduates are Mass Communication, Civil Services, Creative Writing, Teaching, Law, Human Resource Department in MNCs, MBA, Fine Arts and Performing Arts, Tourism, Trade & Hospitality.

### 2. PROGRAMME and NOMENCLATURE

There shall be an integrated Programme in English (hereinafter referred to as M.A English (Integrated) Programme.

The UG component of MA English (Integrated) Programme shall deemed to be complete if a student has earned a total of 140 credits in all 26 papers: 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 4 papers of Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) and 4 papers of the subject selected as Generic Elective (GE).

The PG component of the MA English (Integrated) Programme shall be deemed to be complete if the candidate has earned 104 credits.

The student will have to earn 24 credits from each semester including the Core Courses and Elective Courses (Each course would carry 6 credits) and 8 credits from open/ Swayam Courses.

The term end paper and presentation is compulsory and an external examiner would be mandatory in evaluating the presentation of the student.

### 3. DURATION

The M.A English (Integrated) Programme shall be of the duration of five academic years, comprising of ten semesters, with an option to exit after completing three years of study (Module I). One academic year shall comprise of two semesters and each semester will have minimum of 90 working days. Examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester.

### 4. INTAKE, ELIGIBILITY, ADMISSION PROCEDURE and FEE

### 4.1 INTAKE

The number of seats in the first year of the M.A. English (Integrated) Programme in an academic year shall not exceed thirty (30).

### 4.2 ELIGIBILITY

Students who have secured at least 50% marks (Without rounding) in 12<sup>th</sup> class examination of JKBOSE or in any other equivalent examination, will be eligible for English Aptitude Test/JUET

### 4.3 ADMISSION PROCEDURE

The admission to the M.A English (Integrated) Programme will be through an entrance test, English Aptitude Test /JUET.

### STRUCTURE OF ENGLISH APTITUDE TEST/JUET

- 1. The eligible applicant shall be allowed to appear in the English Aptitude Test/JUET.
- 2. The composition of the written English Aptitude Test/JUET will be as under:



There shall be 50 objectives/multiple choice answer questions to be answered in 02 hours. The break-up of 50 questions is given below.

SECTION I consisting of 30 questions will be from literary component of XII class syllabus of English (J&K board and CBSE).

SECTION II consisting of 20 questions will be from language skills and grammar.

### CONDUCT OF ENGLISH APTITUDE TEST/JUET

The English Aptitude Test/JUET shall be conducted by the Central Admission Committee comprising Dean Academic Affairs, Head and Faculty of the Dept. of English, University of Jammu.

The final merit of the candidates qualifying the English Aptitude Test/JUET shall be calculated on the basis of the composite merit of the written test and marks of 12<sup>th</sup> Class examination as mentioned below.

- **a.** 70% weight age will be given to the marks scored in 12<sup>th</sup> class or equivalent examination.
- b. 30% weight age will be given to marks scored in the written test.

### **4.4 FEE**

The fee for admission to the course shall as per the University norms.

- In addition to these, the student shall be required to earn additional eight credits from Open/Swayam Courses to become eligible for the award of the Master's Degree.

### 7. ELIGIBILITY TO THE SEMESTER-END EXAMINATION

Examination of M.A English (Integrated) Programme shall be open to a regular student who fulfills the following conditions:

- a. Has attendance not less than 75% of the lectures delivered in the semester and also has the certificate of participation in extension lectures/ in-house seminars and other extension activities from the HOD M.A English (Integrated) Programme of the concerned college in consultation with the teachers concerned.
- b. Has been a person of good conduct and has performed the work of the class satisfactorily.
- c. Has paid the prescribed fees. The application on the prescribed form duly filled in and accompanied by the prescribed fees and certificates must be submitted by the candidate in time to be forwarded to the controller of Examinations.
- **d.** Last date for receipt of forms and Fees in the University Office For examination to be held in December will be 15 September and for examination to be held in June will be 15 February.
- e. Whenever the application or fee or both of a candidate is received after the last date prescribed above, he/she shall also pay late fee as per university rules in vogue from time to time.

### 7.1 Shortage of Attendance

The Head of the University Department/Institution /Principal of college may condone shortage in attendance of a student in a semester for special reasons to be recorded in writing up to five lectures in each course separately. A student whose deficiency in lectures in a course is not condoned by the Head of the Department/ Principal of College or is



not condonable shall not be eligible to appear in the semester examination in that course.

- 7.2 On duty: Any student who participates in games, cultural and other cocurricular activities as defined below with the prior approval of the
  Head of the Institution / Principal of College shall, for the purpose of
  condoning deficiency in attendances incurred by him/her on account of
  such participation, be treated as present on all the working days during
  the days of his/her absence on such account for a period of not
  exceeding 8 working days in a semester:
  - 1) State representation in International/All India Competitions organised by agencies which are recognised by the Board of Sports and Youth Welfare / any other co curricular meet.
  - 2) Participation in Inter-University Competitions held under the auspices of a University or any other recognised institution as a member of the University team.
  - 3) Participation in Inter-Collegiate Competitions organised by the University as a member of the teams of participating institutions.
  - 4) Participation in the N.C.C., N.S.S., Bharat Scouts & Guides and National Integration Samitis activities as a member of the recognised institutions.
  - 5) Participation in the Coaching Camps/Rehearsals prior to participation as a member of State or University team in the National/All India/Inter-University Competitions.
  - 6) Participation in the Mountaineering/Hiking/ Trekking/Skiing/Rock climbing or other such activities organised under the auspices of the State Government/University as a member of the Institution affiliated/recognised by the University.

Notwithstanding anything contained in these Statutes, the Syndicate shall have the power to exclude any candidate from appearing in any examination if it is satisfied after issuing a show-cause notice to the candidate and holding an inquiry, that such a candidate is not a fit person to be admitted to the programme.

### 7.3 Examination

The final examination of M.A English (Integrated) Programme semester I, III, V, VII, & IX shall be conducted in the month of December by the college and of semester II, IV & VI, VIII & X in the month of May by the University of Jammu. The final result will be declared by the University of Jammu.

### 7.4 Examination Fee

The examination fees payable by each candidate appearing in a semester examination for five year M A English (Integrated) Programme shall be as per University notifications issued from time to time.

### 8. ADMISSION TO SEMESTER III, V, VII AND IX

Admission of a candidate to III and V, VII and IX semester shall be as under:

- a. Semester III: A candidate who has passed 50% subject (2 papers) of the M.A English (Integrated) Programme of I semester and has appeared in all the subjects prescribed for II Semester.
- **b.** Semester V: A candidate who has passed 60% subject (3 papers) of M.A English (Integrated) Programme of III semester and has appeared in all the subjects prescribed for IV Semester.
- c. Semester VII: A candidate who has passed 60% subject (3 papers) of M.A English (Integrated) Programme of V semester and has appeared in all the subjects prescribed for VI Semester.
- **d.** Semester IX: A candidate who has passed 60% subject (3 papers) of M.A English (Integrated) Programme of VII semester and has appeared in all the subjects prescribed for VIII semester.

### 9. Completion of the Programme

A candidate who completes the minimum attendance requirement but does not appear in the examination in that semester or, having appeared, fails in a course or courses in a semester examination may appear in the examination in such course or courses when it is held



subsequently by the University so as to complete the programme within the maximum period of 2 years counted from the date of the completion of the session the student is enrolled in.

### 10. Admission after a gap

A student who has been on the rolls of the College in the odd semesters of five year M A English (Integrated) Programme and earns eligibility to join the Even Semester of the Programme, as the case may be, but fails to join the Semester when he/she was due to join it or discontinues his/her studies for any reasons whatsoever, may be considered for admission to the semester concerned if he/she submits application to this effect before the commencement of the Semester concerned, provided a seat and other facilities for the courses offered by the student are available in the Semester concerned and the student seeks admission within a period of two years from the date he/she discontinued his/her study. The final decision regarding admission of such a student shall be taken by the Head of the institute/Principal of the college concerned.

### 11. Eligibility to earn the Degree

In order to be eligible for five year M A English Integrated Degree, a student must pass all courses with not less than C Grade in semester courses provided by the University spread over to not less than ten semesters. However, there is a provision of exit after three years i.e. six semesters. Candidate who has passed all the courses of first six semesters and does not want to continue will be declared eligible for earning the graduation degree.

### 12. Issuance of Marks Sheet

A Marks Sheet shall be issued to a student in respect of his/her performance in each semester after evaluation of the semester

examination is done. The Marks Sheet shall indicate grade obtained in the internal assessment as well as semester examination in each course.

### 13. Award of Degree

After a candidate has appeared and passed in all courses-of study offered by him/her in the six semesters and has earned credits of six semester Examinations in accordance with these Statutes, his/her result shall be assessed and he/she shall be declared successful in the three year B A English Honours Degree in the Faculty of Arts. After completion of all ten semesters the candidate shall be declared successful in the five year M A English (Integrated) Programme. He/she shall be awarded a degree stating the grade in which he/she has passed in the following manner:-

### 14. Examination for Reappear/failure candidates

Reappear/failure candidates shall have to appear in the end Semester Examination as per the syllabi in vogue at the time of examination and fulfillment of other statutory conditions.



### 15. Reappear for Grade Improvement

A candidate who has passed the M A English (Integrated) Programme and is desirous of improving his/her Grade shall have the option to improve his/her Grade after paying the normal fee prescribed by the University for the purpose up to a period of four years after having passed the Integrated M A English Programme. For this purpose he/she may appear in the consecutive examinations in the courses as per his/her choice. The Grade already earned by the candidate in other courses in which he/she does not re-appear shall be carried forward. The result of such a candidate shall be declared if he/she improves the Grade, otherwise no modification of result will be notified. Such a candidate shall have to return the Graduation Degree and marks sheet, in original, to the University if issued to him/her, in case of a positive change in Grade.

### 16. Authority to interpret Statutes

The Vice-Chancellor shall interpret and remove any difficulty arising in the application and implementation of these Statutes and shall decide forms and procedures for the same.
