- d) Viva Voce

The students will carry out the research work with the supervisor. The student shall prepare a dissertation based on the synopsis approved by the College Research Committee. Students are required to submit two copies of dissertation based on the topic assigned to them. It should have certification by the supervisor concerned authenticating that the work has been done by the candidate and it should be submitted to the department before the commencement of end semester examination.
