

# Regulations & Curriculum for Bachelor of Science Degree Courses In

### **B.Sc Radiography**

#### Courses offered in Allied Health Sciences:

- B.Sc Medical Lab Technology.
- B.Sc Radiography.

### A. INTRODUCTION

B.Sc (Allied Health Sciences) course is aimed at training students to prepare them as qualified physician assistants who will be able to meticulously assist the concerned specialist in handling the various illnesses. This program is a taught course that covers relevant topics and specialized areas of knowledge as opted. The aim of this B.Sc Program is to provide a through training to the candidates through formal lectures and or seminars and practical programs which culminate in a internship course that finally prepares the student for the rigors of the medical world.

### B. SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

These	Regulations shall be called the "Regulations for B.Sc (Allied Health Sciences)
Cours	e". These regulations shall be deemed to have come into force from the academic
year	. These regulations are subject to modifications as may be
approv	ved by the concerned faculty / Board of studies from time to time.

### C. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

a) A candidate seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science Degree Courses in the Allied Health Sciences course from St.No. 1 to 8 shall have passed the 10+2 or equivalent examination from a recognized Board / University with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principle subjects of study.

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b) Lateral entry to second year for allied health science courses for candidates who have passed diploma program from the Government Boards and recognized by Jammu and Kashmir State Paramedical Council and shall have passed 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principal subjects and these students are eligible to take admission on lateral entry system only in the same subject studied at diploma level.

### NOTE:

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- a. The candidate shall have passed individually in each of the principal subjects.
- b. Candidates who have completed diploma or vocational course through Correspondence shall not be eligible for any of the courses mentioned above.
- c. A candidate should have completed the age of 17 Years as on 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission.

### D. DURATION OF THE COURSE

Duration shall be for a period of three and half years including six months of Internship.

#### E. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

### F. SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION

The University shall conduct two examinations annually at an interval of not less than 4 to 6 months as notified by the university from time to time. A candidate who satisfies the requirement of attendance, progress and conduct as stipulated by the university shall be eligible to appear for the university examination. Certificate to that effect shall be produced from the head of the institution along with the application for examination and the prescribed fee.

### G. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

There shall be three examinations one each at the end of 1 st , 2nd and 3rd year.

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### ➡ ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:

The Examination each year shall be open to :

- a) A regular student who produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College:
  - Certificate of good character.
  - ii. Certificate that the student attended the required number of lectures as prescribed under statutes.
  - Certificate that the student has qualified the sessionals / Clinicals etc.
- **b)** A candidate who has otherwise eligible to appear in the Examination in the particular year but :
  - Could not appear due to genuine reason (to be certified by an appropriate authority.
  - ii. Was unable to pass the examination in any paper (s).

### H. ATTENDANCE

Every candidate should have attended at least 80% of the total number of classes conducted in an academic year from the date of commencement of the term to the last working day as notified by university in each of the subjects prescribed for that year separately in theory and practical. Only such candidates are eligible to appear for the university examinations in their first attempt. A candidate lacking in prescribed percentage of attendance in any subjects either in theory or practical in the first appearance will not be eligible to appear for the University Examination in that subject. The discretionary power of condonation of shortage of attendance to appear for University Examination rests with the University.

#### **★** CONDONATION:

Not with standing anything contrary contained in any provision of these statutes where any candidate falls short of attendance in any year it may be condoned after sufficient cause is shown by him/her in writing in this regard:

a) By the Head of the Department / Principal of the College up to maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered in all the papers. In addition to this a maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered may also be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.

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Provided that np condition in shortage shall be permitted by the Vice-Chancellor unless endorsed and recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College.

### **↓ PARTICIPATION IN SPORTS EVENTS:**

- i. Not with standing anything contrary contained in these statutes, where a candidate participates in any one or more of the activities as specified in the University statutes, he/she may be treated as present on all working days not exceeding 30 days in one academic year.
- ii. The Candidate participating in such event must produce a copy of certificate to the Head of the Department / Principal of the College within seven days from the end of the event, failing which no such benefit shall be given.
- iii. The authority competent to issue the candidate participation certificate shall bring to the notice of the Head of the Department, name, roll no. of the candidate and the date(s) on which the activities were conducted within a week's period from the end of the event.

### I. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT (IA)

Theory - 20 marks.

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Practical - 10 marks. [Lab work- 06 marks and Record-04 marks]

There shall be a minimum of two periodical tests preferably one in each term in theory and practical of each subject in an academic year. The average marks of the two tests will be calculated and reduced to 20. The marks of IA shall be communicated to the University at least 15 days before the commencement of the University examination. The University shall have access to

the records of such periodical tests.

The marks of the internal assessment must be displayed on the notice board of the respective colleges with in a fortnight from the date test is held.

If a candidate is absent for any one of the tests due to genuine and satisfactory reasons, such a candidate may be given a re-test within a fortnight.

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### \* There shall be no University Practical Examination in First year.

### J. CURRICULUM

### Subject and hours of teaching for Theory and Practicals

The number of hours of teaching theory and practical, subject wise in first year, second year and third year are shown in Table-II, Table-III and Table-III

Main and Subsidiary subjects are common in first year for all the courses in Allied Health Science.

The number of hours for teaching theory and practical for main subjects in first, Second and Third year are shown in Table-I, II and III.

### K SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

There shall be three examinations, one each at the end of I, II and III year. The examination for both main and subsidiary subjects for all courses in Allied Health Sciences shall be common in the first year. Distribution of Subjects and marks for First Year, Second year & Third year University theory and practical Examinations are shown in the Table - IV, V & VI.

### First year examination:

The University examination for 1st year shall consist of only theory examination and there shall be no University Practical Examination.

#### Second & Third year examination:

The University examination for 2nd and 3rd year shall consist of Written Examination & Practical.

#### Written Examinations consists of :

04 papers in the 2nd Year

02 papers in the 3rd Year.

#### Practical examination:

One combined practical examination, at the end 2<sup>nd</sup> Year and one combined practical examination at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Year.

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<sup>\*</sup> There shall be no University Practical Examination in First year.

### BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

- i. Subject to the provisions of these statutes and regulations made thereunder, there shall be a Board of Examiners to conduct viva- voce at the end of every year to evaluate the understanding and comprehension of a candidate in subject(s) taught during that year.
- ii. The Board of examiners shall consist of
  - a. Dean of the Faculty or his/her nominee.
  - b. Head of the Department / Principal of the College.
  - c. External Examiners(s)
- iii. The external examiner shall be chosen out of the panel recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
- iv. The quorum for the conduct of examination by the Board of Examiners shall be at least 2 including External Examiners.

## M APPOINTMENT AND ELIGIBILITY OF EXAMINERS:

No person shall be appointed as an examiner in any of the subjects of the professional examinations leading to the award of the degree unless:

- a) He / She has at least five years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a College affiliated to a recognized University as a Faculty member.
- b) If of the rank of an Associate Professor or equivalent and above, with the requisite qualification and experience as given in above sub – clause

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- a. Provided that when an Associate Professor or equivalent and above are not available, an Assistant Professor of 5 Years standing as an Assistant Professor with requisite Qualification and Experience in the subject may be appointed as examiner.
- C) There shall be at least four examiners for upto 100 Students, out of whom not less than 50% must be external examiners. Of the four examiners, the senior most internal examiner will act as the Chairman and Co-Coordinator of the whole examination programme so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidate is maintained. Where candidates appearing are more than 100, two additional examiners (One external and one Internal) for every additional 50 or part thereof appearing, appointed. However, for students upto 50 there shall be two examiners one external and one internal.
- d) Notwithstanding the number of candidates registered for the examination, one external examiner and one internal examiner who shall be the senior of the two internal examiners, in case of more than 100 students, will set and assess one question paper each (Where there are two papers in a subject) or one part of a question paper (where there is only one question paper in the subject). Senior most internal examiner of affiliated College shall be Chairman of the board of paper setters and act as moderator by rotation for one year.
- e) The external examiner shall ordinarily be an in-service teacher in the subject or an allied subject from any college affiliated to a recognized University (Other than Jammu University) Post Graduate Institute.
- f) External examiners (s) shall rotate after two years.
- g) In the case of non-availability of an examiner in a subject, a retired teacher with requisite qualification and teaching experience may be appointed either as external or internal examiner within seven years of super annuation.
- h) The Practical / Clinical and oral examination in each subject shall be conducted jointly by the external and internal examiner(s) and the award sheet containing the marks of practical and / or clinical (including the internal assessment) shall be compiled and signed by all the external and internal

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- examiner(s) before it is submitted to the University by the senior-most internal examiner of each affiliated college.
- i) Award sheet containing marks of theory along with duly evaluated and signed answer scripts shall be submitted to the University separately by each examiner.
- External examiner(s) shall rotate after two years.
- k) External examiners shall not be from the same University.
- Interpretation, if any shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.


### N PASS CRITERIA

First year examination.

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed in a subject, if he/she secures, 50% of marks in University Theory exam and internal assessment added together.
- b. **Subsidiary Subjects:** The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the Commencement of the University examination.

### Second and Third year Examination

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed the Examination in a subject if he/she secures 50% of the marks in theory and 50% in practical separately. For a pass in theory, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the University conducted written examination, and 50% in aggregate in the University conducted written examination, internal assessment and Viva-Voce added together and for pass in Practical, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the university conducted Practical/Clinical examination and 50% in aggregate i.e.University conducted Practical/Clinical and Internal Assessment. In the third year a candidate is declared to have passed only if he/she passes all the two theory papers and one practical examination in a single attempt failing which where in the candidate fails in one or more theory papers and /or practical examination he/she will have to re appear for all the two theory papers and the practical examination in the subsequent attempt.
- b. Subsidiary Subjects: The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks



obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the commencement of the University examination.

# C. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

a) A candidate seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science Degree Courses in the Allied Health Sciences course from Sl.No. 1 to 8 shall have passed the 10+2 or equivalent examination from a recognized Board / University with Physics, Munni Dher (Sonam SHARMA) Kreenger (MR. J. C. FRANK)

b) Lateral entry to second year for allied health science courses for candidates who have passed diploma program from the Government Boards and recognized by Jammu and Kashmir State Paramedical Council and shall have passed 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principal subjects and these students are eligible to take admission on lateral entry system only in the same subject studied at diploma level.

### NOTE:

- a. The candidate shall have passed individually in each of the principal subjects.

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### L BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

- i. Subject to the provisions of these statutes and regulations made thereunder, there shall be a Board of Examiners to conduct viva- voce at the end of every year to evaluate the understanding and comprehension of a candidate in subject(s) taught during that year.
- ii. The Board of examiners shall consist of
  - a. Dean of the Faculty or his/her nominee.
  - b. Head of the Department / Principal of the College.
  - c. External Examiners(s)

- c) There shall be at least four examiners for upto 100 Students, out of whom not less than 50% must be external examiners. Of the four examiners, the senior most internal examiner will act as the Chairman and Co-Coordinator of the whole examination programme so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidate is maintained. Where

# C. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

a) A candidate seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science Degree Courses in the Allied Health Sciences course from Sl.No. 1 to 8 shall have passed the 10+2 or equivalent examination from a recognized Board / University with Physics. (Sovansmana)

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Kheengeskry Chemistry & Biology as principle subjects of study.

(MR. J.C. FRANK)

b) Lateral entry to second year for allied health science courses for candidates who have passed diploma program from the Government Boards and recognized by Jammu and Kashmir State Paramedical Council and shall have passed 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principal subjects and these students are eligible to take admission on lateral entry system only in the same subject studied at diploma level.

## NOTE:

- a. The candidate shall have passed individually in each of the principal subjects.
- b. Candidates who have completed diploma or vocational course through Correspondence shall not be eligible for any of the courses mentioned above.
- c. A candidate should have completed the age of 17 Years as on 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission.

# D. DURATION OF THE COURSE

Duration shall be for a period of three and half years including six months of internship.

# E. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

# F. SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION

The University shall conduct two examinations annually at an interval of not less than 4 to 6 months as notified by the university from time to time. A candidate who satisfies the requirement of attendance, progress and conduct as stipulated by the university shall be eligible to appear for the university examination. Certificate to that effect shall be produced from the head of the institution along with the application for examination and the prescribed fee.

# G. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

There shall be three examinations one each at the end of 1 st, 2nd and 3rd year.

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# **↓** ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:

The Examination each year shall be open to:

- a) A regular student who produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College;
  - Certificate of good character.
  - Certificate that the student attended the required number of lectures as prescribed under statutes.
  - iii. Certificate that the student has qualified the sessionals / Clinicals etc.
- **b)** A candidate who has otherwise eligible to appear in the Examination in the particular year but :

### H. ATTENDANCE

Only such candidates are eligible to appear for the university examinations in their first attempt. A candidate lacking in prescribed percentage of attendance in any subjects either in theory or practical in the first appearance will not be eligible to appear for the University Examination in that subject. The discretionary power of condonation of shortage of attendance to appear for University Examination rests with the University.

### **↓** CONDONATION:

Not with standing anything contrary contained in any provision of these statutes where any candidate falls short of attendance in any year it may be condoned after sufficient cause is shown by him/her in writing in this regard :

a) By the Head of the Department / Principal of the College up to maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered in all the papers. In addition to this a maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered may also be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.

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Provided that np condition in shortage shall be permitted by the Vice-Chancellor unless endorsed and recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College.

# **♣ PARTICIPATION IN SPORTS EVENTS:**

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## L BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

- i. Subject to the provisions of these statutes and regulations made thereunder, there shall be a Board of Examiners to conduct viva- voce at the end of every year to evaluate the understanding and comprehension of a candidate in subject(s) taught during that year.
- ii. The Board of examiners shall consist of
  - a. Dean of the Faculty or his/her nominee.
  - b. Head of the Department / Principal of the College.
  - c. External Examiners(s)

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### N PASS CRITERIA

First year examination.

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed in a subject, if he/she secures, 50% of marks in University Theory exam and internal assessment added together.
- b. **Subsidiary Subjects:** The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the Commencement of the University examination.

## Second and Third year Examination

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed the Examination in a subject if he/she secures 50% of the marks in theory and 50% in practical separately. ## O CARRY OVER BENEFIT

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# L BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

- Subject to the provisions of these statutes and regulations made thereunder, there shall be a Board of Examiners to conduct viva- voce at the end of every year to evaluate the understanding and comprehension of a candidate in subject(s) taught during that year.
- ii. The Board of examiners shall consist of
  - a. Dean of the Faculty or his/her nominee.
  - b. Head of the Department / Principal of the College.
  - c. External Examiners(s)
- The external examiner shall be chosen out of the panel recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
- iv. The quorum for the conduct of examination by the Board of Examiners shall be at least 2 including External Examiners.

# M APPOINTMENT AND ELIGIBILITY OF EXAMINERS:

No person shall be appointed as an examiner in any of the subjects of the professional examinations leading to the award of the degree unless:

- a) He / She has at least five years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a College affiliated to a recognized University as a Faculty member.
- b) If of the rank of an Associate Professor or equivalent and above, with the requisite qualification and experience as given in above sub -- clause
  - a. Provided that when an Associate Professor or equivalent and above are not available, an Assistant Professor of 5 Years standing as an Assistant Professor with requisite Qualification and Experience in the subject may be appointed as examiner.
- c) There shall be at least four examiners for upto 100 Students, out of whom not less than 50% must be external examiners. Of the four examiners, the senior most internal examiner will act as the Chairman and Co-Coordinator of the whole examination programme so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidate is maintained. Where candidates appearing are more than 100, two additional

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- examiners (One external and one Internal) for every additional 50 or part thereof appearing, appointed. However, for students upto 50 there shall be two examiners one external and one internal.
- d) Notwithstanding the number of candidates registered for the examination, one external examiner and one internal examiner who shall be the senior of the two internal examiners, in case of more than 100 students, will set and assess one question paper each (Where there are two papers in a subject) or one part of a question paper (where there is only one question paper in the subject). Senior most internal examiner of affiliated. College shall be Chairman of the board of paper setters and act as moderator by rotation for one year.
- e) The external examiner shall ordinarily be an in-service teacher in the subject or an allied subject from any college affiliated to a recognized University (Other than Jammu University) Post Graduate Institute.
- f) External examiners (s) shall rotate after two years.
- g) In the case of non-availability of an examiner in a subject, a retired teacher with requisite qualification and teaching experience may be appointed either as external or internal examiner within seven years of super annuation.
- h) The Practical / Clinical and oral examination in each subject shall be conducted jointly by the external and internal examiner(s) and the award sheet containing the marks of practical and / or clinical (including the internal assessment) shall be compiled and signed by all the external and internal examiner(s) before it is submitted to the University by the senior-most internal examiner of each affiliated college.
- Award sheet containing marks of theory along with duly evaluated and signed answer scripts shall be submitted to the University separately by each examiner.
- External examiner(s) shall rotate after two years.
- k) External examiners shall not be from the same University.
- Interpretation, if any shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.

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### N PASS CRITERIA

### First year examination.

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed in a subject, if he/she secures, 50% of marks in University Theory exam and internal assessment added together.
- b. **Subsidiary Subjects**: The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the Commencement of the University examination.

## Second and Third year Examination

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed the Examination in a subject if he/she secures 50% of the marks in theory and 50% in practical separately. For a pass in theory, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the University conducted written examination, and 50% in aggregate in the University conducted written examination, internal assessment and Viva-Voce added together and for pass in Practical, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the university conducted Practical/Clinical examination and 50% in aggregate i.e. University conducted Practical/Clinical and Internal Assessment. In the third year a candidate is declared to have passed only if he/she passes all the two theory papers and one practical examination in a single attempt failing which where in the candidate fails in one or more theory papers and /or practical examination he/she will have to re appear for all the two theory papers and the practical examination in the subsequent attempt.
- b. **Subsidiary Subjects:** The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the commencement of the University examination.

## O CARRY OVER BENEFIT

## First year examination:

A candidate who fails in any two of the five main subjects of first year shall be permitted to carry over those subjects to second year. However, he/se must pass the carry over subjects before appearing for second year examination; otherwise he/she shall not permitted to proceed to third year.

Second year examination.

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A candidate is permitted to carry over any one main subject to the third year but shall pass this subject before appearing for the third year examination

# P ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE

A candidate shall have passed in all the subjects of first, second and third year to be eligible for award of degree.

#### A. INTRODUCTION

B.Sc (Allied Health Sciences) course is aimed at training students to prepare them as qualified physician assistants who will be able to meticulously assist the concerned specialist in handling the various illnesses. This program is a taught course that covers relevant topics and specialized areas of knowledge as opted. The aim of this B.Sc Program is to provide a through training to the candidates through formal lectures and or seminars and practical programs which culminate in a internship course that finally prepares the student for the rigors of the medical world.

### **B SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT**

### C. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

a) A candidate seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science Degree Courses in the Allied Health Sciences course from Sl.No. 1 to 8 shall have passed the 10 +2 or equivalent examination from a recognized Board / University with Physics Chemistry & Biology as principle subjects of study.

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b) Lateral entry to second year for allied health science courses for candidates who have passed diploma program from the Government Boards and recognized by Jammu and Kashmir State. Paramedical Council and shall have passed 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principal subjects and these students are eligible to take admission on lateral entry system only in the same subject studied at diploma level.

#### NOTE:

- a. The candidate shall have passed individually in each of the principal subjects.
- b. Candidates who have completed diploma or vocational course through Correspondence shall not be eligible for any of the courses mentioned above.
- c. A candidate should have completed the age of 17 Years as on 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission.

### D. DURATION OF THE COURSE

Duration shall be for a period of three and half years including six months of Internship.

### E. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

### F. SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION

The University shall conduct two examinations annually at an interval of not less than 4 to 6 months as notified by the university from time to time. A candidate who satisfies the requirement of attendance, progress and conduct as stipulated by the university shall be eligible to appear for the university examination. Certificate to that effect shall be produced from the head of the institution along with the application for examination and the prescribed fee.

#### G. SCHEME OF EXAMINATION

There shall be three examinations one each at the end of 1 st., 2nd and 3rd year.

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#### ↓ ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:

The Examination each year shall be open to:

- a) A regular student who produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College:
  - Certificate of good character.
  - ii. Certificate that the student attended the required number of lectures as prescribed under statutes.
  - iii. Certificate that the student has qualified the sessionals / Clinicals etc.
- b) A candidate who has otherwise eligible to appear in the Examination in the particular year but :
  - Could not appear due to genuine reason (to be certified by an appropriate authority.
  - ii. Was unable to pass the examination in any paper (s).

#### H. ATTENDANCE

Every candidate should have attended at least 80% of the total number of classes conducted in an academic year from the date of commencement of the term to the last working day as notified by university in each of the subjects prescribed for that year separately in theory and practical. Only such candidates are eligible to appear for the university examinations in their first attempt. A candidate lacking in prescribed percentage of attendance in any subjects either in theory or practical in the first appearance will not be eligible to appear for the University Examination in that subject. The discretionary power of condonation of shortage of attendance to appear for University Examination rests with the University.

#### **♣** CONDONATION:

Not with standing anything contrary contained in any provision of these statutes where any candidate falls short of attendance in any year it may be condoned after sufficient cause is shown by him/her in writing in this regard:

a) By the Head of the Department / Principal of the College up to maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered in all the papers. In addition to this a maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered may also be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.

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Provided that np condition in shortage shall be permitted by the Vice-Chancellor unless endorsed and recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College.

Where candidates appearing are more than 100, two additional

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- examiners (One external and one Internal) for every additional 50 or part thereof appearing, appointed. However, for students upto 50 there shall be two examiners one external and one internal.
- d) Notwithstanding the number of candidates registered for the examination, one external examiner and one internal examiner who shall be the senior of the two internal examiners, in case of more than 100 students, will set and assess one question paper each (Where there are two papers in a subject) or one part of a question paper (where there is only one question paper in the subject). Senior most internal examiner of affiliated College shall be Chairman of the board of paper setters and act as moderator by rotation for one year.
- e) The external examiner shall ordinarily be an in-service teacher in the subject or an allied subject from any college affiliated to a recognized University (Other than Jammu University) Post Graduate Institute.
- f) External examiners (s) shall rotate after two years.
- g) In the case of non-availability of an examiner in a subject, a retired teacher with requisite qualification and teaching experience may be appointed either as external or internal examiner within seven years of super annuation.
- h) The Practical / Clinical and oral examination in each subject shall be conducted jointly by the external and internal examiner(s) and the award sheet containing the marks of practical and / or clinical (including the internal assessment) shall be compiled and signed by all the external and internal examiner(s) before it is submitted to the University by the senior-most internal examiner of each affiliated college.
- Award sheet containing marks of theory along with duly evaluated and signed answer scripts shall be submitted to the University separately by each examiner.
- j) External examiner(s) shall rotate after two years.
- k) External examiners shall not be from the same University.
- Interpretation, if any shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.

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## N PASS CRITERIA

## First year examination.

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed in a subject, if he/she secures, 50% of marks in University Theory exam and internal assessment added together.
- b. **Subsidiary Subjects**: The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the Commencement of the University examination.

## Second and Third year Examination

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed the Examination in a subject if he/she secures 50% of the marks in theory and 50% in practical separately. For a pass in theory, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the University conducted written examination, and 50% in aggregate in the University conducted written examination, internal assessment and Viva-Voce added together and for pass in Practical, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the university conducted Practical/Clinical examination and 50% in aggregate i.e.University conducted Practical/Clinical and Internal Assessment. In the third year a candidate is declared to have passed only if he/she passes all the two theory papers and one practical examination in a single attempt failing which where in the candidate fails in one or more theory papers and /or practical examination he/she will have to re appear for all the two theory papers and the practical examination in the subsequent attempt.
- b. Subsidiary Subjects: The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the commencement of the University examination.



## C. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

a) A candidate seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science Degree Courses in the Allied Health Sciences course from Sl.No. 1 to 8 shall have passed the 10 + 2 examination or equivalent examination from a recognized Board / University with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principle subjects of study.

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b) Lateral entry to second year for allied health science courses for candidates who have passed diploma program from the Government Boards and recognized by Jammu and Kashmir State Paramedical Council and shall have passed 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principal subjects and these students are eligible to take admission on lateral entry system only in the same subject studied at diploma level.

#### NOTE:

- a. The candidate shall have passed individually in each of the principal subjects.
- b. Candidates who have completed diploma or vocational course through Correspondence shall not be eligible for any of the courses mentioned above.

#### H. ATTENDANCE

Every candidate should have attended at least 80% of the total number of classes conducted in an academic year from the date of commencement of the term to the last working day as notified by university in each of the subjects prescribed for that year separately in theory and practical. Only such candidates are eligible to appear for the university examinations in their first attempt. A candidate lacking in prescribed percentage of attendance in any subjects either in theory or practical in the first appearance will not be eligible to appear for the University Examination in that subject. The discretionary power of condonation of shortage of attendance to appear for University Examination rests with the University.

#### **↓** CONDONATION:

Not with standing anything contrary contained in any provision of these statutes where any candidate falls short of attendance in any year it may be condoned after sufficient cause is shown by him/her in writing in this regard :

a) By the Head of the Department / Principal of the College up to maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered in all the papers. In addition to this a maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered may also be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.

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Provided that np condition in shortage shall be permitted by the Vice-Chancellor unless endorsed and recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College.

## **↓** PARTICIPATION IN SPORTS EVENTS :

## L BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

a) A candidate seeking admission to the Bachelor of Science Degree Courses in the Allied Health Sciences course from Sl.No. 1 to 8 shall have passed the 10 +2 or equivalent examination from a recognized Board / University with Physics Chemistry & Biology as principle subjects of study.

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b) Lateral entry to second year for allied health science courses for candidates who have passed diploma program from the Government Boards and recognized by Jammu and Kashmir State Paramedical Council and shall have passed 10+2 with Physics, Chemistry & Biology as principal subjects and these students are eligible to take admission on lateral entry system only in the same subject studied at diploma level.

#### NOTE:

- a. The candidate shall have passed individually in each of the principal subjects.
- b. Candidates who have completed diploma or vocational course through Correspondence shall not be eligible for any of the courses mentioned above.
- c. A candidate should have completed the age of 17 Years as on 31<sup>st</sup> December of the year of admission.

## D. DURATION OF THE COURSE

Duration shall be for a period of three and half years including six months of Internship.

## E. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction and examination shall be in English.

# F. SCHEDULE OF EXAMINATION

The University shall conduct two examinations annually at an interval of not less than 4 to 6 months as notified by the university from time to time. A candidate who satisfies the requirement of attendance, progress and conduct as stipulated by the university shall be eligible to appear for the university examination. # L BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

- i. Subject to the provisions of these statutes and regulations made thereunder, there shall be a Board of Examiners to conduct viva- voce at the end of every year to evaluate the understanding and comprehension of a candidate in subject(s) taught during that year.
- ii. The Board of examiners shall consist of
  - a. Dean of the Faculty or his/her nominee.
  - b. Head of the Department / Principal of the College.
  - c. External Examiners(s)
- iii. The external examiner shall be chosen out of the panel recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
- iv. The quorum for the conduct of examination by the Board of Examiners shall be at least 2 including External Examiners.

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#### M APPOINTMENT AND ELIGIBILITY OF EXAMINERS:

No person shall be appointed as an examiner in any of the subjects of the professional examinations leading to the award of the degree unless:

- a) He / She has at least five years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a College affiliated to a recognized University as a Faculty member.
- b) If of the rank of an Associate Professor or equivalent and above, with the requisite qualification and experience as given in above sub clause
  - a. Provided that when an Associate Professor or equivalent and above are not available, an Assistant Professor of 5 Years standing as an Assistant Professor with requisite Qualification and Experience in the subject may be appointed as examiner.
- c) There shall be at least four examiners for upto 100 Students, out of whom not less than 50% must be external examiners. Of the four examiners, the senior most internal examiner will act as the Chairman and Co-Coordinator of the whole examination programme so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidate is maintained. Where candidates appearing are more than 100, two additional examiners (One external and one Internal) for every additional 50 or part thereof appearing, appointed. However, for students upto 50 there shall be two examiners one external and one internal.
- d) Notwithstanding the number of candidates registered for the examination, one external examiner and one internal examiner who shall be the senior of the two internal examiners, in case of more than 100 students, will set and assess one question paper each (Where there are two papers in a subject) or one part of a question paper (where there is only one question paper in the subject). Senior most internal examiner of affiliated College shall be Chairman of the board of paper setters and act as moderator by rotation for one year.
- e) The external examiner shall ordinarily be an in-service teacher in the subject or an allied subject from any college

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- affiliated to a recognized University (Other than Jammu University) Post Graduate Institute.
- f) External examiners (s) shall rotate after two years.
- g) In the case of non-availability of an examiner in a subject, a retired teacher with requisite qualification and teaching experience may be appointed either as external or internal examiner within seven years of super annuation.
- h) The Practical / Clinical and oral examination in each subject shall be conducted jointly by the external and internal examiner(s) and the award sheet containing the marks of practical and / or clinical (including the internal assessment) shall be compiled and signed by all the external and internal examiner(s) before it is submitted to the University by the senior-most internal examiner of each affiliated college.
- i) Award sheet containing marks of theory along with duly evaluated and signed answer scripts shall be submitted to the University separately by each examiner.
- j) External examiner(s) shall rotate after two years.
- k) External examiners shall not be from the same University.
- Interpretation, if any shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.

#### N PASS CRITERIA

#### First year examination.

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed in a subject, if he/she secures, 50% of marks in University Theory exam and internal assessment added together.
- b. **Subsidiary Subjects:** The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the Commencement of the University examination.

#### Second and Third year Examination

a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed the Examination in a subject if he/she secures 50% of the marks in theory and 50% in practical separately. For a

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pass in theory, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the University conducted written examination, and 50% in aggregate in the University conducted written examination, internal assessment and Viva-Voce added together and for pass in Practical, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the university conducted Practical/Clinical examination and 50% in aggregate i.e.University conducted Practical/Clinical and Internal Assessment. In the third year a candidate is declared to have passed only if he/she passes all the two theory papers and one practical examination in a single attempt failing which where in the candidate fails in one or more theory papers and for practical examination he/she will have to re appear for all the two theory papers and the practical examination in the subsequent attempt.

### Second & Third year examination:

The University examination for 2nd and 3rd year shall consist of Written Examination & Practical.

### Written Examinations consists of :

04 papers in the 2nd Year

02 papers in the 3rd Year.

#### Practical examination:

Two practical examinations, at the end 2nd Year and one practical examination at the end of the  $3^{\rm rd}$  year.

## L BOARD OF EXAMINERS FOR PRACTICALS:

- i. Subject to the provisions of these statutes and regulations made thereunder, there shall be a Board of Examiners to conduct viva- voce at the end of every year to evaluate the understanding and comprehension of a candidate in subject(s) taught during that year.
- ii. The Board of examiners shall consist of
  - a. Dean of the Faculty or his/her nominee.
  - b. Head of the Department / Principal of the College.
  - c. External Examiners(s)
- iii. The external examiner shall be chosen out of the panel recommended by the Head of the Department / Principal of the College and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
- iv. The quorum for the conduct of examination by the Board of Examiners shall be at least 2 including External Examiners.

### M APPOINTMENT AND ELIGIBILITY OF EXAMINERS:

No person shall be appointed as an examiner in any of the subjects of the professional examinations leading to the award of the degree unless:

- a) He / She has at least five years teaching experience in the subject concerned in a College affiliated to a recognized University as a Faculty member.
- b) If of the rank of an Associate Professor or equivalent and above, with the requisite qualification and experience as given in above sub clause

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- a. Provided that when an Associate Professor or equivalent and above are not available, an Assistant Professor of 5 Years standing as an Assistant Professor with requisite Qualification and Experience in the subject may be appointed as examiner.
- C) There shall be at least four examiners for upto 100 Students, out of whom not less than 50% must be external examiners. Of the four examiners, the senior most internal examiner will act as the Chairman and Co-Coordinator of the whole examination programme so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidate is maintained. Where candidates appearing are more than 100, two additional examiners (One external and one Internal) for every additional 50 or part thereof appearing, appointed. However, for students upto 50 there shall be two examiners one external and one internal.
- d) Notwithstanding the number of candidates registered for the examination, one external examiner and one internal examiner who shall be the senior of the two internal examiners, in case of more than 100 students, will set and assess one question paper each (Where there are two papers in a subject) or one part of a question paper (where there is only one question paper in the subject). Senior most internal examiner of affiliated College shall be Chairman of the board of paper setters and act as moderator by rotation for one year.
- e) The external examiner shall ordinarily be an in-service teacher in the subject or an allied subject from any college affiliated to a recognized University (Other than Jammu University) Post Graduate Institute.
- f) External examiners (s) shall rotate after two years.
- g) In the case of non-availability of an examiner in a subject, a retired teacher with requisite qualification and teaching experience may be appointed either as external or internal examiner within seven years of super annuation.
- h) The Practical / Clinical and oral examination in each subject shall be conducted jointly by the external and internal examiner(s) and the award sheet containing the marks of practical and / or clinical (including the internal assessment) shall be compiled and signed by all the external and internal

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- examiner(s) before it is submitted to the University by the senior-most internal examiner of each affiliated college.
- Award sheet containing marks of theory along with duly evaluated and signed answer scripts shall be submitted to the University separately by each examiner.
- j) External examiner(s) shall rotate after two years.
- k) External examiners shall not be from the same University.
- Interpretation , if any shall be determined by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences and the decision taken shall be final and binding on all concerned.

### N PASS CRITERIA

First year examination.

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed in a subject, if he/she secures, 50% of marks in University Theory exam and internal assessment added together.
- b. Subsidiary Subjects: The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the Commencement of the University examination.

### Second and Third year Examination

- a. Main Subjects: A candidate is declared to have passed the Examination in a subject if he/she secures 50% of the marks in theory and 50% in practical separately. For a pass in theory, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the University conducted written examination, and 50% in aggregate in the University conducted written examination, internal assessment and Viva-Voce added together and for pass in Practical, a candidate has to secure a minimum of 40% marks in the university conducted Practical/Clinical examination and 50% in aggregate i.e.University conducted Practical/Clinical and Internal Assessment. In the third year a candidate is declared to have passed only if he/she passes all the two theory papers and one practical examination in a single attempt failing which where in the candidate fails in one or more theory papers and /or practical examination he/she will have to re appear for all the two theory papers and the practical examination in the subsequent attempt.
- b. Subsidiary Subjects: The minimum prescribed marks for a pass in subsidiary subject shall be 35% of the maximum marks prescribed for a subject. The marks

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obtained in the subsidiary subjects shall be communicated to the University before the commencement of the University examination.

### O CARRY OVER BENEFIT

#### First year examination:

A candidate who fails in any two of the five main subjects of first year shall be permitted to carry over those subjects to second year. However, he/se must pass the carry over subjects before appearing for second year examination; otherwise he/she shall not permitted to proceed to third year.

#### Second year examination.

A candidate is permitted to carry over any one main subject to the third year but shall pass this subject before appearing for the third year examination

## P ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE

A candidate shall have passed in all the subjects of first, second and third year to be eligible for award of degree.

ITEM No.40

To confirm the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in according 4% reservation to the Pahari Speaking People for admission to the various UG/PG courses under the ambit of JUET for the Session 2020-21.

#### NOTE:

The University of Jammu had been providing admission to the candidates for various UG/PG courses under the ambit of JUET as Open Merit/General Category seats (67%) and also under Reserved Category seats (33%) till the Session 2019-20. Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the University had to approach the Hon'ble Chancellor for continuation of the existing Reservation Policy for admission to the various UG/PG courses for the session 2020-21 due to limited time frame and urgency of the matter.

The Hon'ble Chancellor vide communication No. LGS/4/JUET/ JU/2020/3204 dated 12/03/2020 intimated that the University may proceed as per the existing Reservation Policy for admission to the various programmes for the Academic Session 2020-21 (Annexure-I)

Accordingly, the University proceeded for admissions to the various UG/PG courses as per the existing Reservation Policy. In the meantime, various representations were received from the Pahari Speaking People seeking 4% reservation for their wards for admission to the various UG/PG courses as per the Reservation Policy notified under SO 127 dated 20<sup>th</sup> April, 2020 as applicable to the Professional courses by the Govt of J&K, Social Welfare Department, Civil Secretariat, J&K Jammu and its implementation in the Admission Statutes/process.

The University approached the office of the Hon'ble Chancellor dated 17.09.2020. The Chancellor office vide letter No.LGS/4/JUET/JU/2020/9805 dated 18 November, 2020 has intimated the approval to the aforesaid proposal, during the ongoing session as a special case. (Annexure-II).

Accordingly the decision of 4% reservation to the Pahari Speaking People over and above the existing intake capacity of the Department by increasing the number of seats proportionately as a special case, as one time exception for the Academic Session 2020-21 and these seats shall be non-convertible in nature, was implemented by the University.

The same is submitted to the Academic Council for ratification.

#### ITEM No.41

To consider the request of Mr. Amit Ranjan (13-MCA-2K04) to carry out his 6<sup>th</sup> semester project work in order to complete his MCA course.

#### NOTE:

Mr. Amit Ranjan bearing roll no. 13-MCA-2K04 requested to be allowed to complete his project work of MCA 6<sup>th</sup> semester which he did not join after successfully completing 5<sup>th</sup> semester.

Mr. Amit Ranjan was admitted to MCA programme in the year 2004. As per the statutes governing the MCA programme he was eligible to be permitted to join the sixth semester within two years of his passing the fifth semester, however, he was to pass the course within six years of initial admission.

One time special chance was given by the resolution of 84<sup>th</sup> meeting of the University Council dated 10.04.2018 vide ITEM NO. 84.36 to the candidates to clear their backlogs where their chances or time period debars further appearance.

Mr. Amit Ranjan had paid admission fee in the in the fifth semester at that time which is charged for the year but did not deposit the fee required to join sixth semester which includes Computer Fee, Information Fund, Examination Fee, Examination Maintenance Fund, Practical Fee and Science Fee.

The entire 6<sup>th</sup> (last) semester of MCA course is based on the project work that a student has to carry out at his own in the guidance of a teacher allotted by the department on the allotted real life problem without undergoing any class work or practical work in the department and the evaluation of the work carried out by the student is done by the internal and external examiners.

The 6<sup>th</sup> semester project work may kindly be considered as backlog and in the light of the resolution of 84<sup>th</sup> meeting of the University Council the case of Mr. Amit Ranjan may kindly be considered for further permission to carry out his project work after completing requisite formalities.

#### ITEM No.42

To consider the request of Ms. Richa Gupta (10-MCA-2K15) to carry out 4<sup>th</sup> semester dissertation work to complete her M. Tech. (CS) course.

#### NOTE:

Ms. Richa Gupta bearing roll no. 10-MTECH-2K15 requested to be allowed to complete her dissertation work of M. Tech. (CS) 4<sup>th</sup> semester which she discontinued in between because of her personal problems.

Ms. Richa Gupta was admitted to 2 years' M. Tech. (CS) course in the year 2015 and as per statutes governing M. Tech. (CS) course she was to complete the course within a maximum period of 4 years from the date she was admitted.

One time special chance was given by the resolution of 84<sup>th</sup> meeting of the University Council dated 10.04.2018 vide ITEM NO. 84.36 to the candidates to clear their backlogs where their chances or time period debars further appearance.

The entire 4<sup>th</sup> (last) semester of M. Tech. (CS) course is based on the dissertation work that a student has to carry out under the supervision of a teacher allotted by the department without undergoing any class work or practical work in the department and the evaluation of the work carried out by the student is done by the internal and external examiners.

Ms. Richa Gupta successfully entered in the 4<sup>th</sup> semester by fulfilling all conditions and started working on the dissertation under the supervision of a teacher allotted to her. Subsequently, she discontinued due to her personal problem as mentioned above and did not complete her dissertation.

The 4<sup>th</sup> semester dissertation may kindly be considered as backlog and in the light of the resolution of 84<sup>th</sup> meeting of the University Council the case of Ms. Richa Gupta may kindly be considered for further permission to continue her dissertation work.

#### ITEM No.43

To consider the charging of University fee for admission to P.G. Diploma in Bioinformatics (One Year) under UGC Innovative Program.

#### NOTE:

The UGC had sanctioned P.G. Diploma in Bioinformatics (one year) under Innovative Programme at the School of Biotechnology, University of Jammu for a period of five (05) years i.e. 01.04.2013 to 31.03.2018 vide letter No. F.14-11/2013 (Inno/ASIST) dated: 30-03-2018.

As per the fee structure approved for the course by the University a student has to pay ₹ 23,960/- fee. Over the years the response of the students for the said program has remained poor. One of the reasons stated by the prospective students has been the high fee. Since Post Graduate Diploma in Bioinformatics was UGC funded course and the basic infrastructure for running the course has been developed over the years by the School and the tenure of the course with UGC has been completed on 31.03.2018, therefore, it is proposed that we may be allowed to charge the same fee as in M.Sc. Biochemistry and M.Sc. Microbiology i.e. ₹ 14,400/- for the current academic session: 2021. It may be mentioned that Bioinformatics is considered as Science of the Century and gradually the scope for this subject is increasing. The technically qualified candidate can get absorbed in various companies involved in BIG DATA analysis. The reduction in the fee may help in attracting good numbers of students for this program.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

#### **ITEM No.44**

To confirm the action taken by BORS allowing Mr. Ashish Singh Sambyal for Course work Examination in relaxation of statute 4(v) of the statutes governing Ph.D Degree.

#### NOTE:

Mr. Ashish Singh Sambyal was admitted in the Department of Electronics as a Ph.D Scholar on 15.10.2018 under the supervision of Prof. Rakesh Vaid through entrance test held on 7<sup>th</sup> of Sep., 2018. As per record course work of the said scholar started w.e.f. 15<sup>th</sup> of Oct. 2018. The examination of the Course work was held on 10.05.2019 & 14.05.2019. The DRC at its meeting held on 21.06.2019 got the answer sheets of the Course work Examination evaluated. The DRC at its meeting held on 23.09.2019 recommended his case for Ph.D registration w.e.f. 15.10.2018. Accordingly the case of Mr. Ashish Singh Sambyal was placed before the BORS at its meeting held on 09.12.2019 and it was resolved that the case be referred back to DRC for recasting. Revised synopsis be sent to next BORS.

When the revised synopsis of the said candidate was sent to the office of DRS again, on scrutiny of documents it was observed that the said candidate has not passed the Course No: PSELTC702, Title: Research methodology and computational techniques and has got 34 marks out of 75 in the said Course whereas statute 4 (iv) of the statutes governing Degree of Doctor of philosophy prevalent at the time of his admission reads as under:-

"The HOD shall notify the dates for the conduct of the examination on completion of class work, and get papers evaluated. Qualifying marks in each paper shall be 50%. The students getting 50% or more in each paper shall be declared qualified for final registration to Ph.D course". The concerned Department was informed accordingly telephonically.

In the BORS at its meeting held on 03.11.2020, it was resolved that the case shall be considered in the next BORS meeting after he qualifies the Course work examination. Accordingly the re-examination of the said candidate for the Course No: PSELTC702 was held on 24.11.2020 by the concerned department.

Statute 4(v) of the statutes governing Degree of Doctor of Philosophy reads as under:-

"If student is not able to pass a Paper, he/she shall be allowed to reappear in the examination to be held in the next semester (maximum 1 year)".

The Course work Examination of the candidate was held on 10.05.2019 & 14.05.2019 and re-examination of the paper failed was held on 24.11.2020 i.e. after a period of 2 &1/2 years.

Hence, the matter is submitted to the Academic Council for consideration of the resolution of the BORS at its meeting held on 03/11/2020 wherein it has resolved that:-

"the case shall be considered in the next BORS meeting after he qualifies the Course work examination" in relaxation of the statute 4(v) as mentioned above, as one time exception not to form precedence in future.

#### **ITEM No.45**

To consider the matter with regard to the execution and smooth functioning of SWAYAM MOOCs in the University of Jammu and its Affiliated Colleges.

#### NOTE:

The National Education Policy 2020, and the experience of recent COVID 19 Pandemic, and consequent shifts to the Online Mode of teaching-learning, has emphasized the growing importance of online education in India. Extensive use of technology in teaching and learning, removing language barriers, increasing access to DIVYANG students and streamlining educational planning and management have also been emphasized in NEP 2020. Focus on learner centered pedagogy and blended approach, to address the social, affective and psychomotor dimensions of learning has also been emphasized, to improve the quality of teachers and teaching.

Since the whole world is going through a pandemic, a situation which necessitated that the educational institutions be closed down, it has become imperative that we should be ready with some alternative mode of education and this is where online education platforms like SWAYAM have become more important than before. SWAYAM caters to all learning needs during the pandemic.

As a part of Digital Initiatives 17/17 of the then MHRD, now Ministry of Education, the University of Jammu has already adopted the online courses through the SWAYAM since 2017. The University Council has endorsed the adoption and other modalities of the implementation of SWAYAM (Attached), but the review is held frequently, based on the feedback from the stakeholders-Departments of University, Affiliated Colleges and the students, and the status of SWAYAM is tabled at every University Council meeting.

On the directions of the Vice Chancellor, the Guidelines for Implementation of SWAYAM in the University of Jammu and its affiliated colleges were prepared by the team comprising the UGC SWAYAM Coordinator and the UGC SWAYAM Mentors and the above Guidelines were deliberated in a meeting held under the Chairmanship of Vice Chancellor, where the following issues were discussed:

#### A. Academic Issues:

1. Defining a minimum limit of credits to be earned through SWAYAM, since the maximum limit has been set at 10% by the 86th University Council held on 11.09.2020 vide: Resolution No: 86.26:

The matter was discussed and a conclusion was arrived at that a minimum of 4% and a maximum 10% of the total credits should be earned before the commencement of final semester by all students, from SWAYAM MOOCs. It was further discussed that candidates may choose to earn more Credits from SWAYAM Platform, to improve their knowledge, job profile or to become eligible for some advanced Degree or Course, but earning a minimum 4% of the maximum credits limit (e.g. If the maximum credit limit of a particular course is 96 credits, 10% would round off to 10 credits and 4% to 4 credits) of that particular course is a must in order to obtain the University Degree

and the candidates will have to submit an undertaking (given in the SWAYAM Guidelines) regarding these at the time of admission, which shall be incorporated in the statutes governing admission in the University of Jammu and its affiliated colleges.

Hence it is proposed that a minimum of 4% be fixed as the lower limit of credits to be earned through SWAYAM MOOCs i.e. one minimum course of 2/4 credits, as the case may be.

2. Defining whether the credits earned by the stakeholders would be within the maximum credit limit of their course or over and above:

The discussion led to the conclusion that for the time being these credits will be over and above the maximum credits to be earned for the particular course. This decision would be reviewed from time to time, as the case may be.

Hence it is proposed that for the present semester the credits earned from SWAYAM be counted over and above the maximum credits to be earned from that particular course.

3. To approve the Weightage for Credits earned by the student on SWAYAM MOOC Course. To give benefit, and due weightage to the credits earned by the student from SWAYAM platform, the following is recommended, which needs to be placed for approval in the forthcoming Academic Council Meeting, in continuation to the SWAYAM Items already sent, as was decided in the review meeting held in the Office Chambers of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor on 15th December 2020. The Scheme is thus presented here for approval at the behest of the DAA and for presentation in the Academic Council Meeting.

The following scheme was proposed for approval at Academic Council meeting.

i) A student is required to complete at least one 4-credit course of his/her choice, from the courses notified by the UGC for that semester, successfully, before the commencement of final semester.

ii) This will be in addition to the open elective course offered, by the

University, in the 3rd and 4th semesters.

iii) Both the courses shall be treated as mandatory, SWAYAM MOOC as well as Open Elective course of 3rd/4th semesters, and must be completed successfully.

iv) The grades/marks/ credits earned from SWAYAM MOOCs shall be reflected in the final semester mark/grade sheet of the student.

v) However, in order to give the weightage for the SWAYAM MOOC credits/marks/grades earned by the student, the following procedure shall be adopted:

a) Credits/marks/grades obtained by the student from SWAYAM MOOCs shall be counted in their final CGPA only if they are better than the Open Elective (Offered by the University) course score, i.e., best of the two; otherwise, MOOC Credits/marks/grades shall not be counted in the determination of CGPA.

b) However, the title, score/grade, credits earned by the student in MOOC shall be, in any case, reflected in the final marks/grade sheet.
c) The HOD, Departmental Course Coordinator and the student shall

decide the better of the two, and the student shall be required to give an

undertaking regarding this, in order to avoid disputes.

4. To approve the SWAYAM Hand-book Guide which contains summary of Guidelines issued from MHRD and FAQ's.

The National Education Policy 2020, and the experience of recent COVID 19 Pandemic, and consequent shifts to the Online Mode of teaching-learning, has emphasized the growing importance of online education in India. Extensive use of technology in teaching and learning, removing language barriers, increasing access to DIVYANG students and streamlining educational planning and management have also been emphasized in NEP 2020. Focus on learner centered pedagogy and blended approach, to address the social, affective and psychomotor dimensions of learning has also been emphasized, to improve the quality of teachers and teaching.

On the directions of the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor Comprehensive SWAYAM Handbook Guide is prepared for the internal use and not for sale for the departments of University of Jammu and its affiliated colleges, Offsite Campuses by the team comprising of UGC SWAYAM Coordinator and the UGC SWAYAM Mentors. A meeting was held under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, for its consideration and later same is submitted as per the directions sent to the DAA for approval for presentation in the

Academic Council Meeting.

It is proposed that the SWAYAM Handbook Guide (Annexure-I) be placed for approval in Academic Council meeting.

5. Approval of SWAYAM Courses by the Academic Committees: As the courses are notified after every 6 months, they cannot be approved for 3 years as is the convention for academic courses in the University.

Hence it is proposed that the BOS may authorize the Convener to get the courses selected and approved in consultation with the Departmental SWAYAM Coordinators (DSC), who have been nominated by their respective HODs, or College SWAYAM Coordinators (CSC) nominated by the Principal as the case be. This process of approval has to be repeated after every 6 months, when the new courses are notified by UGC and Action Taken may later on be whetted by the Academic Council.

- 6. Keeping the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ's) and difficulties/problems faced/raised from different quarters from stakeholders, in continuation to the Resolution No: 86.26 of the University Council held on 11.09.2020, the following Norms need to be adopted strictly by all Departments/Colleges from the Academic Session 2020-21 onwards, till further any new amendments/notifications issued:
  - Henceforth, MOOCs through SWAYAM platform shall be mandatory for all students enrolled for a Bachelor's or Master's Degree programme in the University of Jammu or in the affiliated colleges of Jammu University, from the current academic session 2020-21 onwards.

2. A minimum of one course of either 4 Credit for PG or 2-Credit for UG has to be earned, subject to the maximum of 10% of total Credits for the completion of degree by all regular students of PG/UG stream from the SWAYAM platform depending upon the availability of courses as notified by UGC generally on predefined dates 1st June or 1st November respectively, every

3. Courses must be identified by all departments duly approved by Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) or by Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) as the case be, twice a year as per notification by UGC. The complete information of list of courses opted by the each student of each batch within a weeks time after the commencement of Final Semester, must be sent to the DEAN

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS office.

4. Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) / Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) must be empowered for the selection of MOOCs by Convenor, BOS in anticipation to the competent authority (DAA) and it shall be placed in the Academic council as a standing item.

5. While selecting the course from Swayam platform, the DSC or CSC must ensure a minimum of 6 weeks (32 hrs) and 12 weeks (72 hrs) course to qualify for the 2-credit or 4-credit course respectively.

6. MOOCs will be counted as add-on course as of now till further any

new directions in this regard.

7. The student must complete the SWAYAM course successfully before the

commencement of the final semester of a stream or discipline.

8. Students can select the MOOC course of their choice from a pool of courses selected by the Departments or Colleges, of any stream or any other course of their choice with prior information to Departmental College or (DSC) Coordinator **SWAYAM** Coordinator (CSC) and it shall be the duty of the Departmental **SWAYAM** College (DSC) or Coordinator **SWAYAM** Coordinator (CSC) to forward these selected approved new courses through the Convener, BOS, under information to Dean Academic

 Departments/ Colleges must ensure that all logistic support whatever is required by the student, must be supplemented/extended.

10. Student ideally should not select self-paced courses and courses selected must be different from one offered in the course curriculum of semesters as it will lead to duplication of same course and will become irrelevant i.e null and void

11. The student must fill an undertaking form, as given in the brochure, and submit the same after duly filled form to their respective

Departments/ Colleges for future reviews and record purposes.

12. Students must follow the schedule of the host institution in completing the course successfully and for all doubts must contact the Course Coordinator or the Departmental/ College SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC/CSC).

13. The student must keep a note of and also supply the information such as registration date/enrolment id, email-id, phone, name, semester etc. to

their respective DSC/CSC.

14. SWAYAM Examination fees (if any) or any other fee

prescribed shall be borne by the students only.

15. The student must submit a course completion certificate as a proof (Photocopy/ print copy) to their respective DSC/CSC before the beginning of the final semester, failing which their degree will be withheld.

17. There shall be a provision in the final semester marks sheet for incorporating marks/grades earned by the student (For Examination

Section only).

18. All records of MOOCs related information must be preserved for two years from date of passing out by the student from the department or college as the case be.

19. The fee once paid shall not be refundable.

20. Since there is no re-examination system therefore, candidate has to reopt in the next cycle/ session if he/she is unable to complete the Swayam course successfully for whatsoever reason.

Above proposed norms are submitted for successful implementation of MOOCs through Swayam and same needs to circulated / notified among the departments/affiliated colleges/offsite campuses henceforth.

### B. Examination Issues:

 Reflection of the credits earned through SWAYAM in the final Grade Sheet/Marks Card, Resolution No: 86.26 of the University Council held on 11.09.2020 (<u>Annexure-III</u>):

The University Council has already decided about the inclusion of the credits earned by SWAYAM in the final grade sheet/ marks card of the candidates. Only the mechanism has to be worked out, and the necessary exercise has to be carried out by the examination wing of the University.

Hence it is proposed that the concerned Examination Section be directed for the creation of space in the mark list for the entry of credits to be earned through SWAYAM.

2. Entry of credits earned by candidates through SWAYAM, by the Departments/ Colleges:

Since the candidates would be opting for different courses, to be offered by different Host Institutions, and the receipt of the Course Credits from these may be at differing pace, it was discussed that the Departments should enter

these credits themselves, as they do for other courses, after verification from the Certificate of Course Completion or any other authenticated document received from the Course Coordinator of that particular course, through their host institution. For Colleges also some mechanism needs to be worked out.

Hence it is proposed that the Departments of the University be authorised to enter the credits/result received from the SWAYAM MOOCs hosts institutions, once the space is created by the concerned Examination Section for entering these. The mechanism for Colleges would be similar.

#### 3. Examination Fee for SWAYAM:

The issue was taken up with the E Content unit of UGC, and they have replied that:

There is no fee for course completion.

The exam fee is Rs. 1000 for general and Rs. 500 for SC/ST.

The exam fees charged are non-refundable.

Since students are already paying the examination fees to the University of Jammu for their semester examination. Earning 10% credits through SWAYAM has become mandatory in our University, therefore, students have to essentially appear for its examination to earn these credits.

Hence, it is proposed that some mechanism be worked out because if the students opt for 10 % of their total credits from SWAYAM, they might have to pay more examination fees, which might lead to their demotivation in opting for SWAYAM MOOCs.

#### C. Administrative Issues:

 Making a Centralized Data Management System for the information required by the University regarding the implementation of SWAYAM Courses from time to time for forward transfer:

It is proposed that the University needs to create a SWAYAM Data Management System on its website, to enable updating of information and statistics related to SWAYAM regularly from all stakeholders. As information is frequently asked from time to time, this will simplify the accessibility, management and data collection. Feedback from students can also be obtained in a similar manner.

2 Nomination of the Member Secretary from the Academic Section of the University of Jammu:

Since the SWAYAM was adopted as one of the 17 by 17 Digital Initiatives, Dr. Ginny Dogra, Dy Director, DIQA, was appointed as the Member Secretary for all of them, but now it requires the involvement of the Academic Section of the University, because most of the changes have to be incorporated in the current Academic Schemes, through their office.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

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# Scheme Proposed for Implementation of MOOCS on SWAYAM Platform. INTRODUCTION TO SWAYAM

SWAYAM (meaning 'Self') is a Hindi acronym that stands for "Study Webs of Active-Learning for Young and Aspiring Minds" is an Indian Massive open online course (MOOC) platform. SWAYAM was an initiative which was launched by M.H.R.D [Government of India], now Ministry of Education, under Digital India, to give a coordinated stage and free entry to web courses, covering all advanced education, High School and skill sector courses. It was launched on 9th July 2017 by Honorable President of India. SWAYAM has been developed cooperatively by MHRD (Ministry of Human Resource Development) and AICTE (All India Council for Technical Education) with the help of Microsoft and is equipped for facilitating more than 2,000 courses. The platform offers free access to everyone and hosts courses from Classes 9 till post-graduation level. It enables Professors and Faculty of centrally funded institutes like IITs, IIMs, IISERs, etc. to teach students all around the world. According to SWAYAM, there are around 203 partnering institutes, 2,748 completed courses, 12.541,992 student enrollment, 915,538 exam registrations, and 654,664 successful certificates. SWAYAM is a web platform on which MOOCs courses are hosted (www.swayam.gov). These MOOCs have teacher-student groups where MOOC coordinator/tutor/teacher interacts with the learner. SWAYAM has helped students to attend the courses taught by the best faculty; have virtually access to high quality reading resources, participate in discussion forums; take tests and earn academic grades. There are Refresher Courses for teachers (ARPIT) also under National Mission for Teacher Training (NMTT), on the SWAYAM portal.

The National Education Policy 2020, has stressed on the consequent shift to the Online Mode of teaching-learning, thus reflecting the growing importance of online education in India. Extensive use of technology in teaching and learning, removing language barriers, increasing access to DIVYANG students and streamlining educational planning and management have also been

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emphasized in NEP 2020. Focus on learner centered pedagogy and blended approach, to address the social, affective and psychomotor dimensions of learning has also been emphasized; to improve the quality of teachers and teaching.

As part of Digital Initiatives 17-by-17 of the then MHRD, now Ministry of Education, the University of Jammu has already adopted the online courses through the SWAYAM since 2017. The University Academic Council has endorsed the adoption of SWAYAM courses vide item No. 33, Dated: 23.11.2017, as per the directions of UGC to make amendments required in ordinances, rules, regulations to incorporate UGC (Credit framework for online learning courses through SWAYAM) Regulation, 2016 vide its Para 7. The SWAYAM committee members of the University of Jammu, has prepared a draft for approval through academic council containing guidelines/regulations to be adopted for successful implementation of SWAYAM MOOCS courses and its components at University of Jammu. The SWAYAM committee members proposed the following framework to be followed for the effective implementation of UGC (Credit Framework for Online Learning Courses through SWAYAM) Regulation, 2016. This handbook is prepared for internal use only for Departments of University of Jammu and its affiliated colleges of the University. It is designed taking into account guidelines of UGC SWAYAM framework and the feedback from faculty and students received since 2017, for running of UGC SWAYAM MOOCS program and need constant reviews from time to time as per MOE/UGC directions issued from time to time (if any).

# SHORT TITLE, APPLICATION AND COMMENCEMENT

- i. This ordinance shall be called the Jammu University Ordinance for SWAYAM MOOC Credit Transfer under CBCS-2020.
- ii. It shall apply to all Departments of University of Jammu, Offsite Campuses, and the Colleges affiliated to University of Jammu.
- iii. It shall come into force from the academic year 2020-2021 onwards.
- iv. It shall be applicable to all the students studying in various semesters, except for the last semester of a degree program.
- v. The integration of MOOCs into curriculum will be limited to Generic, Skill, Open Elective, Ability Enhancement and Discipline Specific Elective Courses only.
- vi. It shall be applicable to the transfer of credits of such students who have enrolled as regular or distance mode students of University of Jammu.

# **SWAYAM FUNCTIONALITY**

**SWAYAM** operates MOOCs learning resources in different ways and structure. Learning through **SWAYAM** has four parts/quadrants: e-Tutorial, e-Content, discussion forums, assessment.

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- The first quadrant is direct teaching, meaning not much of extra work by students; it could
  include teaching videos, animations, PowerPoint presentations, Podcasts and so on. All these
  depend on what the subject is and what strategy is adopted by the teacher to teach the
  students.
- The **second quadrant** is an e-content which could include e-books, illustrations, Case studies, Open source content, Reference link, further reading sources and so on. The students have to keep pace with these and develop backups so before the content changes.
- The third quadrant is about clearing student's queries. Discussion forum is a part of it, where students can interact with other students and faculty to clarify their doubts. The discussion forum is like a doubt counter where any student or faculty can answer the question of a student.
- The fourth quadrant is self-assessment, to check what a student has viewed, listened to or studied the material and whether he/she is eligible to get the certificate. It could be tests in the form of Multiple-Choice Questions (MCQs), quiz or short answer questions, long answer questions, etc. It can be in the form of online examination or proctored pen and paper examination, at some allotted center, depending on the enrollments in that particular course or as directed by the Coordinators. It. The fourth quadrant also has Frequently Asked Question (FAQs) and their answers to clarify common misconceptions among students.
- The whole scheme is self-instruction based and the learners have to keep the pace with the lectures, assignments and quizzes etc. So that they are able to finish the course in time and earn credits allotted to the course. This needs to be completed one semester before the final semesters, i.e. in 1<sup>st</sup> -3<sup>rd</sup> semesters, or 1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>Semesters, or 1<sup>st</sup> 9<sup>th</sup> semester as the case maybe.

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
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
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# FOUR QUADRANT APPROACH






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#### NATIONAL COORDINATORS

# SWAYAM COURSE STRUCTURE

Course type and duration: There are two types of courses offered through SWAYAM – Credit and Non-Credit. Credit course is a course taught for at least one semester as part of a subject/discipline of study. Non-credit courses include courses such as awareness programme and specific skill-set training, which are not part of any set curriculum. Such courses can be of shorter duration, usually ranging from two to four months. There are also self-paced courses with inherent flexibility of time to complete the courses. 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only for faculty and not for the students as they are strongly advised not to enrol in the noncredit courses.

- Course components: Courses hosted on SWAYAM are available for students in four components: video lectures, downloadable/printable reading material, self-assessment tests through quizzes and tests, and an online discussion forum for clearing doubts.
- Eligibility: Online education courses offered through the portal of SWAYAM (swayam.gov.in) can be accessed by *anyone*, *anywhere*, *anytime*.
- Course fee: Courses offered via SWAYAM are free of cost for residents of India. However, in
  order to obtain certificate for a particular course, student need to pay a nominal fee which is
  refundable if the students achieves the qualifying marks in that particular course or as decided
  from time to time.
- Certification: Students who wish to obtain certificates for their courses need to get them registered & enroll on SWAYAM portal for a course. Also, certificates are awarded to students only after successful completion of the course.
- Credits: At the end of each course, students will be assessed through a proctored exam.
   Marks/grades secured by students in the exam shall be transferred to their academic records.
   To implement the same, UGC has been recommending the Universities to identify courses in which credits can be transferred to students' academic records vide UGC regulations 2016. No institution can refuse, at any stage, for credit transfers.

# GENERAL RULES, REGULATIONS & REQUIREMENTS FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF SWAYAM (MOOCS) COURSES FOR REGULAR STUDENTS AT PARENT INSTITUTION

# 1. Amendments in University Statutes

The following amendments have been done at the University level:

Adoption of MOOCs courses is mandatory for all students of the University of Jammu and affiliated Colleges (vide University Council ITEM NO: 84.16: Minutes-84th Meeting of University Council Date: 10.04.2018, detailed in the Academic council Agenda, Dated: 23.11.17), to enable Blended model of teaching- learning as desired in the NEP 2020, and previously in the Digital Initiatives 17 by 17 of the MHRD/ MOE.

- Necessary amendments in rules and regulations in the University Statutes/Acts regarding adoption of SWAYAM MOOCS courses would be proposed from time to time.
- Incorporation of credits transfer of SWAYAM courses.

# 2. Constitution of Committees, Appointments, Cell and Reviews

The following are required and need to be done, only once, for the smooth functioning of SWAYAM courses. These committees can be reviewed after every 3 or 5 years **or** as decided.

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- The UGC SWAYAM Coordinator (USC) and UGC SWAYAM Mentors (USM), Departmental SWAYAM Coordinators (DSC), Departmental Course Coordinators, College Swayam Coordinators (CSC) for affiliated Colleges, to be appointed and their efforts should be supplemented by the statute modifications and notifications from time to time.
- Each Department can have only one Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC), but can have more than one Course Coordinator (DCC). These roles can be interchanged or combined depending on the faculty strength in the Department or College.
- Creation of SWAYAM Academic Cell for each Department or Faculty, for handling approval of new SWAYAM courses from time to time is recommended, as it might not be possible to hold BOS to meet every six months when the new courses are notified by the UGC or other National Coordinators.
- Creation of a Centralized SWAYAM Information Management System (SIMS) for information, accessibility, data and collection management.
- Lonstituting the Digital Learning Monitoring Cell (DLMC), such that it shall comprise of experts from academics, IT, digital pedagogy and administration to resolve all issues, credits monitoring and queries on SWAYAM.
- Creation of Virtual Query/Help Desk on Jammu University website, along with contact numbers/email-id of members responsible for handling SWAYAM information.
- Creation of special budget head for carrying out the SWAYAM activities is recommended.
- Recommended for approval through academic council; from Swayam platform 6 weeks course (32 hrs) as 2 credits and 12 weeks course (48 hrs) as 4 credits.

# 3. Creation of SWAYAM Academic Cell (SAC)

It is proposed that as BOS can't meet regularly and since the SWAYAM courses are notified after every 6 months (June & November), therefore these courses cannot be approved for 3 years; hence it is recommended that the SWAYAM Academic Cell( SAC) be created in each First Reprint Edition-2021.

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Department and respective BOS may authorize the Convener, BOS Departments and the committee members of the SAC to select the newly notified courses, well in time and the action taken may later be vetted through appropriate academic bodies. Similar structure may also be adopted by the affiliated Colleges if approved.

 The respective Convener of BOS shall decide the constitution of SAC, with DSC/CSC as one of the prime members to execute the task of identifying new MOOC courses.

### 4. Course Selection Criteria

- About 2000 courses in all discipline are available on SWAYAM and 1.6 crore students/learners have been enrolled, since its launch in 2017. In January 2020 semester, a total of 574 courses in various disciplines were offered and around 26.03 lakh students/learners got enrolled.
- It is pertinent to mention that UGC has suggested that an institution can allow up to 20 % (which
  is under review and proposed to be extended up to 40%) of the total courses being offered in a
  programme in a semester through the online courses offered through SWAYAM platform.
- Emphasis should be on identification of Job oriented/ready SWAYAM Courses, should be selected for UG/PG level on Swayam portal which is emphasized in the NEP 2020 also. These courses, selected from SWAYAM platform, should be such that they are not similar to the present course curriculum, unless absolutely necessitated by dearth of faculty for teaching a particular important course; as it may otherwise lead to duplication and repetition of the same course/s.
- The increase in credits limit, with minimum and maximum to be earned by learners, can be
  decided gradually through appropriate University bodies, at a later stage once, stabilization
  is achieved on SWAYAM implementation within the University. At present to start with only
  one MOOC course of 4-credit is recommended from Swayam platform for students of all
  streams of UG/PG programmes respectively, till any further notifications/directions from the
  University authorities from time to time.
- Swayam Credit Scheme, as proposed by University Academic Council, vide its meeting dated 23.11.2017, is given below which needs amendment i.e only one course of 4-credit for all streams (UG/PG) henceforth is recommended.

It may be noted that SWAYAM will have 3 components: Online Courses for Teachers, students/learners, preparation of e-content.

# i) SWAYAM Resources & Requirements

The following are requirements that are necessary for the smooth functioning of SWAMAY courses:

- Availability of Un-interrupted and fast Internet facility, 24×7, is must to enable the learners and
  faculty members to access MOOCS and related information anywhere, anytime, within the
  University or Offsite Campuses thereby avoiding any further hiccups and inconveniences.
  Colleges may also make similar modifications in their infrastructure to enable smooth transition
  to the Blended mode of education.
- Timely creation of data repository for MOOC courses so that same can be made accessible to all stakeholders of SWAYAM information.

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- Bi-annual centralized mechanism for data collection of information regarding SWAYAM, as per prescribed format (Annuxure-1), on pre-proposed fixed dates, preferably 5<sup>th</sup> of October and 5<sup>th</sup> March, every year for the sessions of June and November, respectively. This responsibility of sending information lies with the Departmental/Colleges SWAYAM Coordinators.
- Feedback from students can also be obtained in a similar manner.
- Recording facility of Lectures preferably a Centralized Digital Multi-Media Cell for e-content development and for other related activities.
- Creation of Departmental labs with at least 10 Computer Systems, with high speed internet, networked printers and power backups of minimum 2 hrs.
- Virtual Class rooms with multimedia facilities.
- Activation of Social Media platforms, especially YouTube, as the MOOC lectures is mostly
  embedded in it, and which is also a mandatory requirement as per MHRD/MOE directions.
- Provision of Digital Devices and Pre-loaded Tablets for teaching-learning.
- Tools like two-way audio interface and two-way videos are needed.
- Regular Review meetings of SWAYAM Committee Members, along with authorities, on need basis to preview progress made and status of SWAYAM courses.
- SWAYAM Prabha is an integral component of SWAYAM (MOOCs) programme which requires installation & configuration of TV sets along with setup boxes, dish antenna for the tuning of SWAYAM channels for learners at Departmental level.

# ii) SWAYAM Information Dissemination

- Popularization of SWAYAM courses through Social Media platforms.
- Dissemination of SWAYAM information through Admission Brochures, Notice Boards, University
  Web Portals, prominent places in University where students gather, print and electronic media,
  needs to be done at the beginning of the semester, and on six monthly basis (when the new

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
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courses are notified). The posters or other hand-outs supplied by UGC should be displayed at prominent places within the University/Offsite or College Campus/es.

- Distribution of Printed pamphlets to students.
- Providing sensitization/ orientation sessions on SWAYAM, online/offline, as the case may be, to all the students in the beginning of Semester (1<sup>st</sup>) by all Departmental SWAYAM Coordinators in the Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges/ Departments.
- Departmental Swayam coordinator (DSC) of each department must mentor the students, in course selections and assist hand hold of students where necessary.



Similar structure must also be adopted by the affiliated colleges for their internal communications hence forth.

# iii) Proposed SWAYAM Activities

# At University level

 Online use of digital technology for training/workshops/ SEMINARS/Webinars for planners/ teachers/ learners to be encouraged as a regular feature.

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- UGC-HRDC University of Jammu may conduct training for all concerned on MOOCs Development.
- Motivation of younger faculty in skill enhancement for development of e-content through enterprise of interest (EOI).
- Dissemination of SWAYAM information to all quarters with need-based review meetings.
- Bi-annual data collection on student/learners enrolment for SWAYAM courses and dissipates the same to the concerned quarters.
- Liaison with host institutions for course registration, credits to be earned by student and credit transfer issues, if any.
- Identification of Job oriented courses and ensuring of resources at all places for smooth functioning of SWAYAM.
- Spreading of SWAYAM awareness through conduct of programmes among masses using, Print, Electronic and Social Media etc.
- Invited lectures in refresher/orientation courses of HRDC, University of Jammu.
- Incorporation of marks/grade reflection in final year mark sheet.
- Amendments in University act /decisions from time to time with regard to Swayam as per direction of MHRD

# At Departmental level

- Briefing the students about Swayam during the induction programme in the department.
- Providing all resources required for students
- Dissemination SWAYAM information to all quarters.
- Coordination with UGC SWAYAM coordinator for all purpose/matters on SWAYAM
- DATA collection on SWAYAM enrolment semester wise and sending to desired quarters.
- Channelizing mechanism for the usage of SWAYAM prabha channels to the students.
- Collecting and entering of marks/grade obtained by all students on SWAYAM course in one go to the COE, Jammu as per policy/mechanism adopted.
- Review meetings on SWAYAM status on need basis.

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Identifications and monitoring of new courses and extending all support to the students.

# At Student level (Pre-requisite for Students)

The following must be ensured by students, DSC, CSC in the beginning of 1<sup>st</sup> semester:

- Provide all Pre-requisite personal information such email, valid mobile number etc to their respective DSC/CSC for all future communications.
- Each and every student/ learner needs to give undertaking by filling Declaration form in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester itself, duly signed that he/she will peruse at least one 4-credit course or courses (as per University policy on SWAYAM) from SWAYAM platform as per the format given in JUET Brochure. Sample of it is also given below and submit the same after duly filling to the respective DSC/CSC for record and review purpose.
- Resources must be used provided by their respective departments for the completion of Swayam course.
- Attending SWAYAM programmes organised if any by the University
- Completion of one 4 credit course at least (or as per policy adopted from time to time) through
   Swayam platform before commencement of end/final semester.
- Student can enrol more than one course however only one will be counted at present of 4 credit which of course is mandatory, which he/she can choose from any stream of their choice or from pool chosen by the respective department.
- Passing of Swayam course successfully is mandatory for all students.
- Handing over Xerox copy of course completion certificate after receiving from Host institution to their respective DSC.

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
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
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




- All students must first register on SWAYAM portal and then get enrolled for a course or courses as the case may be on or before 3<sup>rd</sup>/5<sup>th</sup>/9<sup>th</sup> Semesters, as the case may be and complete the course successfully.
- Student must complete all assignments, tests as per schedule given by the Host institutions, which are mandatory to earn the required credits and obtain a course completion certificate from the host institution.
- Examination fee if any will be borne by student.
- For all queries / doubts, the learners will have to contact their DCC & DSC/CSC, who will further get the clarifications sought from the USC or USMs.

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# v) FORMAT FOR SENDING SWAYAM DATA By SWAYAM COORDINATORS (DSC/CSC)

The data regarding number of students enrolled for a course must be sent as per the sample format given below. All concerned are requested to send soft copy of the data to the centralized SIMS and UGC Swayam Coordinator (make an e mail id separately), Jammu University for onward transmission to the concerned quarters. Soft copy of list of enrolled of the students must be sent by 5<sup>th</sup> of October for the courses opted for June session; and by 5<sup>th</sup> of March, for the courses opted for November session, every year. Preserve an updated list for ready reference. Do not send the list of students who have just registered at the SWAYAM portal, rather always send the semester-wise list of students who have enrolled for a course of their choice as per format given below.

- 1. First step student must register at the UGC Swayam portal.
- 2. Second step student must enrol for a course of their choice of 4 credits from the pool approved by the BOS or the SAC, as the case may be.

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# vi) General procedural steps to be followed (SUMMARY)


University Academic Council decisions vide: Resolution No: 86.26 of the University Council held on 11.09.2020, the following Norms need to be followed strictly by all Departments/Colleges/ Offsite

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Campuses, from current academic session onwards, till any further new amendments / notifications issued from time to time by the competent authorities with regards to SWAYAM COURSES/information.

- 1. Henceforth, MOOCs through SWAYAM platform shall be mandatory for all students enrolled for a Bachelor's or Master's Degree programme in the University of Jammu or in the affiliated colleges of Jammu University, from the current academic session 2020-21 onwards.
- 2. A minimum of one course of either 4 Credit for PG or 2-Credit for UG has to be earned, subject to the maximum of 10% of total Credits for the completion of degree by all regular students of PG/UG stream from the SWAYAM platform depending upon the availability of courses as notified by UGC generally on predefined dates 1st June or 1st November respectively, every year.
- 3. Courses must be identified by all departments duly approved by Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) or by Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) as the case be, twice a year as per notification by UGC. The complete information of list of courses opted by the each student of each batch within a weeks time after the commencement of Final Semester, must be sent to the DEAN ACADEMIC AFFAIRS office.
- 4. Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) / Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) must be empowered for the selection of MOOCs by Convenor, BOS in anticipation to the competent authority (DAA) and it shall be placed in the Academic council as a standing item.
- 5. While selecting the course from Swayam platform, the DSC or CSC must ensure a minimum of 6 weeks (32 hrs) and 12 weeks (72 hrs) course to qualify for the 2-credit or 4-credit course respectively.
- 6. MOOCs will be counted as add-on course as of now till further any new directions in this regard.
- The student must complete the SWAYAM course successfully before the commencement of the final semester of a stream or discipline.
- 8. The complete
- Students can select the MOOC course of their choice from a pool of courses selected by the
  Departments or Colleges, of any stream or any other course of their choice with prior information to
  Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (CSC) and it shall be the
  duty of the Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (CSC) to

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forward these selected approved new courses through the Convener, BOS, under information to Dean Academic Affairs.

- 10. Departments/ Colleges must ensure that all logistic support whatever is required by the student, must be supplemented/extended.
- 11. Student ideally <u>should not select self-paced courses</u> and courses selected must be different from one offered in the course curriculum of semesters as it will lead to duplication of same course and will become irrelevant i.e null and void
- 12. The student must fill an undertaking form, as given in the brochure, and submit the same after duly filled form to their respective Departments/ Colleges for future reviews and record purposes.
- 13. Students must follow the schedule of the host institution in completing the course successfully and for all doubts must contact the Course Coordinator or the Departmental/ College SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC/CSC).
- 14. The student must keep a note of and also supply the information such as registration date/ enrolment id, email-id, phone, name, semester etc. to their respective DSC/CSC.
- 15. SWAYAM Examination fees (if any) or any other fee prescribed shall be borne by the students only.
- 16. The student must submit a course completion certificate as a proof (Photocopy/ print copy) to their respective DSC/CSC before the beginning of the final semester, failing which their degree will be withheld.
- 17. A bi-annual data collection of information regarding SWAYAM enrolment, as per prescribed format (Annexure-1 enclosed) on pre-proposed fixed dates, preferably 5<sup>th</sup> October and 5<sup>th</sup> March, every year for the sessions of June and November, respectively must be done. This responsibility of sending soft copy information as per prescribed format shall lie with the Department/College SWAYAM Coordinator to the Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA) to the email-id: iqac\_ju@yahoo.com with copy to UGC Swayam coordinator to the email-id: neerusha@gmail.com. The prescribed format will be available by 1<sup>st</sup> of March for November session courses and 1<sup>st</sup> of October for June session course on University website so that same can be filled duly submitted by 5<sup>th</sup> March or 5<sup>th</sup> November as the case be.

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
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- 18. There shall be a provision in the final semester marks sheet for incorporating marks/grades earned by the student (For Examination Section only).
- 19. All records of MOOCs related information must be preserved for two years from date of passing out by the student from the department or college as the case be.
- 20. The fee once paid shall not be refundable.
- 21. Since there is no re-examination system therefore, candidate has to re-opt in the next cycle/ session if he/she is unable to complete the Swayam course successfully for whatsoever reason.

(Repeat desired steps mentioned above for every new session for successful completion and implementation of SWAYAM chapter in University of Jammu).

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# Roles and Responsibilities at University Level

# a) Role of Dean Academic Affairs (DAA)

- 1. Conduct of review meetings with SWAYAM Committee members on need basis.
- 2. All Notifications/Circulars/Orders regarding SWAYAM to be issued by The DAA office to all quarters, and the office of DAA should ensure its posting on Jammu University Website.
- 3. Ensuring that updated information on SWAYAM is printed and available in JUET Brochure every year before the new admission commences.

# b) Role of Examination Wing (COE)

- Ensuring of reflection of credits earned by student on SWAYAM Course/s in the end Semester mark sheet/ grade sheet.
- 2. The Office of COE must ensure that University Exam dates should not clash with SWAYAM exams dates. To avoid any inconvenience to the students, the information must be supplied by the DSC/CSC through the Conveners, BOS to the office of the COE.
- 3. Coordination with all concerned with SWAYAM to resolve any issues if any, on need basis.

# c) Role of HOD

 To forward the new list of courses to DAA office as per the format given below for notifications by 25<sup>th</sup> June and 25<sup>th</sup> November every year after consulting with DSC and committee members of departmental SWAYAM Academic Cell (SAC).

2. To forward consolidate list of credits earned by student through SWAYAM course to COE office in one go before completion of final semester.

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- 3. Coordination with DSC, DCC and monitoring of SWAYAM courses status through review meetings.
- 4. Ensuring of timely dispatch of SWAYAM related information to the concerned quarters.
- 5. Concerned department must keep SWAYAM record at least for 3 years after successful pass out by the student from the institution and record must be maintained academic year wise / semester wise.

# d) SWAYAM ACADEMIC CELL (SAC)

1. New Courses to be offered to students from SWAYAM platform must be decide by 25<sup>th</sup> June and 25<sup>th</sup> November for the courses offered on 1<sup>st</sup> June and 1<sup>st</sup> November respectively.

# e) Role of University UGC SWAYAM Coordinator (USC)

- 1. The University SWAYAM Coordinator (USC), also called single point of contact (SPOC) as per UGC, shall disseminate the information to all USM, DSM, CSCs/ concerned officials for all purpose/matters related to SWAYAM & coordinate with all concerned with SWAYAM.
- 2. Organise trainings/workshop on MOOCs awareness quarterly basis.
- 3. Conduct bi-annual review meetings with Swayam committee members to review Swayams status if required.
- 4. Direct all concerns to ensure the resources are in place and on other Swayam related activities.

# f) Role of UGC SWAYAM Mentors (USM)

- 1. All Mentors appointed by University to register at SWAYAM portal i.e. <a href="https://ugcmoocs.inflibnet.ac.in">https://ugcmoocs.inflibnet.ac.in</a> only once.
- 2. To coordinate with DSC & DCC to clarify doubts (if any).
- 3. To popularize MOOCS through social media such as Face-book, Twitter, WhatsApp; display on Departmental Notice boards, Canteen, Campus Main Gates, Posters, Hostels, Radio Jingles, Press Release in local papers etc.
- 4. Disseminating of MOOCS information to students of rural/urban through awareness programmes through workshops or other means.

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- 5. To deliver invited lectures within University for affiliated colleges, students /staff on request basis in the orientation/refresher programmes if needed.
- 6. Coordination with UGC SWAYAM Coordinator USC for all purpose.

# g) Roles of Departmental SWAYAM Coordinators (DSC), Departmental course Coordinators (DCC) and College Swayam Coordinators (CSC).

- 1. To coordinate & communicate with University UGC Swayam coordinator & mentors.
- 2. Proving information on SWAYAM, assisting in Course selection, extending library& lab facilities to the students.
- 3. Departmental SWAYAM coordinators shall keep track of new courses (1<sup>st</sup> June and 1<sup>st</sup> November every year) well in time for the next forthcoming sessions.
- **4.** DSC of each Department must brief 1<sup>st</sup>Semester students on SWAYAM COURSES in beginning of every new academic session about mode of exam, credits, University policy etc.
- 5. DSC will handle queries of students and will Monitoring of declaration form to be filled by student and will send total enrolled students semester wise as per above format given at point 10 (annexure-1) and pre-specified dates.
- 6. DSC will guide the students for Job oriented course selection and get it approved before information to DAA office through HOD.
- 7. DSC will coordinate with DCC at Departmental level for running SWAYAM courses smoothly and gives wider publicity where required.
- 8. All roles of DSC will be performed by CSC. DSC & DCC will ensure that a student registers and enrol for a course as per the policy adopted by University from time to time.

# h) Role of Digital Monitoring Learning Committee (DMLC)

- Supervise all resources; rules/regulations that are laid down are in place and followed properly
  and assist University SWAYAM coordinator for all purpose /matters related to Swayam.
- Monitor credits earned & transfer are done in timely manner.
- 3. Report Swayam related issues to the concerned quarter of University.

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# i) Role of Departmental Offices

The departmental staff members of offices must coordinate and provide all logistic support needed from time to time to all departmental SWAYAM coordinators or UGC Swayam coordinator in maintaining all Swayam related records including communication letters issued.

22. What are salient features on transfer of Credits earned through SWAYAM by a student to the Institute where the student is studying?

The University Grants Commission in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (f) and (g) of subsection (1) of Section 26 of the UGC Act 1956(No.3 of 1956), has in its 515 the Meeting held on 20th May 2016 approved the 'Credit Framework for online learning courses through SWAYAM) Regulation 2016. It states: The parent Institution shall give the equivalent credit weight age to the students for the credits earned through online learning courses through SWAYAM platform in the credit plan of the program. No university shall refuse any student for credit mobility for the courses earned through MOOCs. The SWAYAM shall notify to the Registrars of all the Institutions & the Institutions shall, consider through their Competent Authority, the online learning courses being offered through the SWAYAM platform; and keeping in view their academic requirements, decide upon the courses which it shall permit for credit transfer. Provided that an Institution can only allow up to 20% of the total courses being offered in a particular program in Semester through the online learning courses provided through SWAYAM platform.

23. What is the Scope of the SWAYAM Project

Scope of SWAYAM shall be:-

- 1.Curriculum based course contents covering diverse disciplines such as arts, science, commerce, performing arts, social sciences and humanities subjects, engineering, technology, law, medicine, agriculture etc. in higher education domain (all courses would be certification-ready in their detailed offering)
- 2. School education (9-12 levels) modules and teacher training as well as teaching and learning aids to children of India to help them learn subjects for better preparedness for competitive examinations for admissions to professional degree programmes.
- 3. Skill based courses which cover both post-higher secondary school skills that are presently the domain of polytechnics as well as industrial skills certified by the sector skill councils of various Ministries.
- 4. Advance curriculum and professional certification under a unified scheme in higher education domain that can be tailored to meet the demands of choice based credit system (CBCS) currently being implemented in India
- 5. Curricula and courses that can meet the needs of life-long learners of Indian citizens in India and abroad. All course contents will have clear and designated outcomes for learners and follow a suitable pedagogy (child learning) or andragogy (adult learning) and will provide model curricula in





To widen access to higher education and to bring down the cost by using technological advances, Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs) have emerged as viable model for imparting conventional and online education, Indian version of MOOC has been launched on an indigenous platform known as SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds) which has been initiated by Government of India to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy- Access, Equity and Quality. The Notification regarding this was issued on 19th July, 2016. SWAYAM is an IT platform developed and made functional by the MHRD, GOI for purpose of offering MOOCs on which Courses are available from 9th Class to PG. SWAYAM shall notify online courses on 1st June and 1st November, every year to the Registrars of Institutions. Up to 20% of the total courses being offered in a particular program in a Semester, can be earned through SWAYAM. Every institution shall within 4 weeks from the date of issue of regulations decide through their Competent Authority the amendments required in their Ordinances, Rules and Regulations etc to incorporate provisions of these regulations. All institutions have to consider, through their Competent Authority, online learning courses being offered through SWAYAM platform keeping in view their academic requirements and decide upon the courses which it shall permit for credit transfer. Transfer of Credits will be done for such students who are enrolled as regular/part-time students of any educational institution in todia. A Need has been felt to develop synergy between anytime-anywhere e learning and traditional classroom based chalk and talk method. SWAYAM courses follow the following Approach:

To report the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in having promoted the students, conduct of online Examinations, reduction in syllabi, awarding of minimum pass marks etc. to the students of UG/PG Programmes.

#### Note:

Due to outbreak of COVID-19 in the mid of March, 2020, like other States of India, complete lockdown was imposed in the U.T. of Jammu & Kashmir owing to which the University of Jammu too was closed w.e.f. 22.03.2020 and the entry of students was fully banned in the University. University Hostels were closed and all examinations which were being conducted at the time of imposition of lockdown and those which were scheduled thereafter, had either been postponed, cancelled or rescheduled. Due to this whole examination system got disturbed and the students were put to great inconvenience with regard to their academic career.

In order to assuage grievances of students and in pursuance of various notifications and guidelines pertaining to COVID-19 issued by the Govt. of India/UGC from time to time, the University has offered following concessions/relaxations to the stakeholders:

- 1. UG 6th Semester (CBCS & Non-CBCS) off-line examinations were conducted by giving option to the students to attempt 40% questions only in each paper.
- 2. UG 5th Semester (Supplementary) students were promoted awarding minimum pass marks.
- 3. UG 1st or 3rd semester students were declared as pass by awarding minimum pass marks in their backlog in single paper.
- 4. UG 1st Semester CBCS (Regular-winter-zone and all private candidates) and 3d semester CBCS (Private candidates) have been given the option of attempting only 40% questions in each paper.

- UG 1st, 2nd and 3rd years candidates have been treated as pass as per UGC guidelines.

- UG 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semesters (CBCS/Non-CBCS Private students) were promoted as per UGC Guidelines

Hence the matter with regard to extending above concessions/relaxations to the students due to Covid-19 Pandemic from March 2020 onward be treated as one time exception not to form precedent in future. The matter is submitted to the Academic Council for consideration.

In the interest of the students at large, the matter was deliberated in the light of the following facts: -

- The AICTE has not issued any separate guidelines and the letter addressed to the Technical Colleges available on the website, states that the guidelines issued by the UGC are to be followed.
- Perusal of the UGC guidelines guides towards the holding of physical ii) examination for Bachelor of Engineering 8th semester students and the scheme for promotion of students of BE/B.Tech. 2nd, 4th and 6th Semester based on their assignment for the current semester and awards earned by them in previous semester.
- For the engineering students, arising out of the discussion, it was felt (iii) that the application of this scheme will be harsh in the light of the following points:
  - a) The engineering students are from both the Union Territories i.e. Leh and Kashmir part of the Jammu & Kashmir Union Territory.
  - b) Holding of physical examination shall entail with it the likely delay as far as the evaluation part is concerned due to the SOPs, guidelines applicable and the cautious approach associated with the evaluation.
  - c) The holding of examination on the basis of MCQ for the 8th Semester students was found to be technically non-feasible due to the technical nature of the Course and the Branches involved.
  - d) Holding of online examination get limited due to 2G availability of internet speed and students will not be able to login and assess the same.

In the light of the above, the Committee is constraint to recommend as under. which is primarily on the basis of the scheme being following by the NIT, Srinagar: -

1. For the Bachelor of Engineering 8th Semester students, the scheme proposed on the pattern of the NIT, Srinagar is hereby recommended for approval.

2. Since the NIT, Srinagar has yet to formalize the scheme for 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semester students, it shall be appropriate to decide on the same after getting input from the NIT about the finalization of the same.

The document sent by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering through email on 20<sup>th</sup> May 2020 was perused in detail and discussed, keeping the pandemic situation in view and the strategies being adopted by other reputed Engineering Institutions and also the fact that the Engineering students shall have to take up further higher studies or job placement target from August onward. As such, the following was decided:

- The date sheet for the conduct of Examinations of BE 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semesters shall be sent by the Dean, Faculty of Engineering after reviewing the situation with the affiliated Colleges of Engineering so as to reach the Controller of Examinations by 20<sup>th</sup> June 2020.
- 2. For the 8<sup>th</sup> Semester Examination, the proposed scheme is recommended for consideration and notification with the following adjustments: -

i) The marks for external examinations of Theory Courses may be decided by taking the maximum marks obtained by the candidate at any stage from 1<sup>st</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> semester in which the candidate has been declared passed/successful.

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ii) (a) As per the statutes of University of Jammu, the internal assessment is calculated as: 40% weightage of Assignment + 40% weightage of Sessional Tests + 20% weightage of Attendance. In order to meet the necessary attendance requirements, the attendance of the students may be marked as per their enrollment in the online classrooms. The internal assessment is proposed to be based on the two assignments submitted by the students through Online mode. Two No. Sessional tests may be conducted online comprising of tutorials/Quizzes/Viva/ MCQ's/ Presentations/ numerical based questions by the concerned faculty member in consultation with the respective Head of Department as per the course content of the individual course.

#### Instructions for the Colleges:

The previous record of the student may be formed as the basis for marking internal assessment with a rider that the same is marked within the limit i.e not exceeding 10% over the highest marks/% secured ever by the student in any of the previous semesters. This would help in curbing mal practice at individual level.

- (b) Evaluation of Laboratory Courses shall also be done through online mode as found suitable by the concerned faculty in consultation with the concerned Head of the Department as per the Lab. Contents.
- (c) All the internal assessment awards of the students shall be submitted to the Controller of Examinations on or before 30<sup>th</sup> of June 2020.
- iii) The Colleges may be authorized to conduct online viva-voce of the projects and prepare award rolls for submission to the University of Jammu for declaration of the results on time. The Colleges will advise the students to submit the Project Report in PDF format alongwith the presentation before 20th June,2020 to be presented at the time of viva-voce examination to their respective Project Guides/Institutions. The Evaluation should be done online through SKYPE/ Google Meet/or any other online medium as found suitable; by the panel of examiners as per the University Statutes.

At the outset, the Vice-Chancellor welcomed the members of the committee and asked the Controller of Examinations to place on the table the agenda items for discussion which are as under:-

1. MODALITIES ABOUT EXAMINATION AT THE UNDER-GRADUATE LEVEL FOR NON-PROFESSIONAL COURSES:

The Committee deliberated upon the matter in the context of the UGC letter regarding "Revised guidelines on examinations and academic calendar for the Universities because of COVID-19 Pandemic" received vide reference D.O.No.F.1-1/2020 (Secy.), dated: 6th July 2020.

The salient features of the revised UGC guidelines are reproduced as under:

1. Mode of Terminal Semester/ Final Year Examinations (2019-20)

The Universities are required to complete the examination process by the end of September-2020 in offline (pen & paper) / online/blended (online + offline) mode by obscrving the prescribed protocols/ guidelines related to COVID-19 pandemic.

2. Provision of Examination through Special Chance

In case a student of the terminal semester/ final year is unable to appear in the examination conducted by the University for whatsoever the reason(s) may be, he/she may be allowed to appear in special examinations for such course(s)/ paper(s), which may be conducted by the university as and when feasible so that the student is not put to any inconvenience/disadvantage. The above provision shall be applicable only for the current academic session 2019-20 as a one-time measure.

3. A backlog of Papers in Respect of Terminal Semester(s)/ Final Year Students

The students of terminal semester/ final year students having backlog should compulsorily be evaluated by conducting examinations in offline (pen & paper) / online/blended (online + offline) mode as per feasibility and suitability.

4. The guidelines regarding intermediate semester/ year examinations will remain unchanged as notified by the UGC on 29th April 2020.

5. The relevant details, if need be, about the Admissions and Academic Calendar in the Universities and Colleges shall be issued separately in place of those mentioned in the earlier guidelines issued on 29th April 2020.

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6. Notwithstanding the above guidelines regarding the conduct of examination and commencement of next academic session, every university/ institution has to ensure that it is prepared in all respects to carry out the academic activities following necessary protocols/guidelines/ directions/advisories issued by the Central/State Governments and MHRD/ UGC from time to time, because of COVID-19.

The new notification will be in supersession of earlier notification issued by the University vide Notice No. SPA/COE/2020/1350-1449, dated: 06-06-2020.

To deliberate on the methodology for the intermediate semesters of UG examinations (2nd and 4th Semesters), it was decided that the Controller of Examination shall write to the Nodal Principal requesting him to direct all the College Principals to prepare the Internal Assessment Awards of the 2nd and 4th semesters (Regular) and submit the same both in soft as well as the hard form to the Controller of Examination latest by 31st August 2020.

As per the UGC guidelines, the University shall initiate necessary measures for the declaration of results of 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Semesters by taking a total of 100 Marks, out of which 50% weightage shall be of the marks obtained by the student in the previous semester i.e. 1st & 3rd and the rest of the 50% weightage shall be the internal assessment submitted by the concerned candidate for the current semester i.e. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semesters.

Further, the colleges shall bifurcate the Internal Assessment into two components i.e. 30 marks out of 50 based on Internal Assignment and 20 marks as another crucial parameter of Attendance / Viva-Voce, etc. etc. as deemed fit by the teacher concerned

The above scheme shall be adopted for the successful candidates of the previous semesters(1st and 3rd) only and the re-appear /backlog candidates of the previous semesters i.e., Ist and 3<sup>rd</sup> shall not be covered under this scheme till they clear their backlog in the previous semesters(1st and 3rd).

### 2. TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITIES OF CONDUCTING PROFESSIONAL COURSES EXAMINATIONS ESPECIALLY BACHELOR OF ENGINEERING (B.E.).

The Committee was of the considered opinion that the above formula may also be applied in respect of the Bachelor of Engineering students. However, the Dean Faculty of Engineering apprised the members that a large number of final year Engineering students are approaching her office with the plea that they are applying for their placement in national / multi-national Companies and require Provisional Certificates. She also informed the members that other Universities are issuing Provisional Certificates to their students.

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor asked the Dean Faculty of Engineering to take all the principals of Professional (B.E) Colleges into confidence and make a survey of the students to sit in offline/online examination and submit a concrete proposal regarding the conduct of terminal examination of B.E. student to the University for consideration of the Committee.

The meeting terminated with a vote of thanks to the chair.

Guidelines for conducting Terminal Semester Examination for B.A. LL.B (5 Years) and LL.B (3 Years) Programmes of the University of Jammu in the Main Campus / Affiliated Law Colleges for the Session 2019-20:

In view of the extraordinary circumstances due to spread of COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent guidelines issued by the various agencies viz. MHA, MHRD, UGC and UT of J&K, the following guidelines are adopted for holding the examinations of the students of the Terminal Semester of B.A. LL.B (5 Years) and LL.B (3 Years) Programmes of the University of Jammu in the Main Campus and Affiliated Law Colleges:

- The Major examination of the Terminal Semesters shall be conducted in the form of Open Book Examination. Out of total 100 marks allocated for each Semester examination, 75 marks shall be assigned to written component and remaining 25 marks to Oral examination for each paper.
- b) For Written Examination, the question paper shall be sent through e-mail or whatsapp etc 5 minutes before the start of the examination and the students will be asked to return the written sheets not later than 15 minutes after the maximum time of the examination through email or whatsapp etc.
- The time limit of the examination shall be 2 hours and 30 minutes. The students shall be asked to attempt any 05 questions out of the 10 questions set from the entire syllabus of the Course.
- The students shall be directed to write the answer on the self attested white sheets marked with page numbers.
- e) The Nodal Departments shall complete the entire examination process within one month time from the date of the notification.
- After the conduct of the theory examinations, the written assignments for the practical papers shall be provided by the Nodal Departments.
- The students of the Terminal Semester/ having backlog of previous Semesters shall be evaluated by conducting examinations by the Nodal Departments as per the above mentioned procedure.

### **Guidelines for Terminal Semester Papers:**

- The setting of the paper and evaluation of the scripts shall be undertaken by the HoD/ Director of the Nodal Department in order to ensure safe and smooth conduct of the examination of the terminal semester.
- The questions for the Open Book examinations shall not be conventional/direct. These should be of conceptual and analytical nature.
- iii) The entire process of Oral and Written examinations in each course be completed in not more than three consecutive days of the schedule/date sheet issued by the Head/ Director of the Nodal Department for each paper.

This is for the information of all concerned that in view of the extraordinary circumstances due to spread of COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent guidelines issued by the various agencies viz. MHA, MHRD, UGC and UT of J&K, the following guidelines shall be adopted for holding the examinations of the students of the Terminal Semesters for the various Under Graduate/Post Graduate programmes of the University of Jammu in the Main Campus and Offsite Campuses.

- The Major examination of the Terminal Semesters shall be conducted in the form of Open Book Examination. Out of total 60 marks allocated for Major examination in CBCS, 40 marks (66.66%) shall be assigned to written component and remaining 20 marks (33,33%) to Oral examination.
- For Written Examination, the question paper shall be sent through e-mail or whatsapp etc 5 minutes before the start of the examination and the students will be asked to return the written sheets not later than 15 minutes after the maximum time of the examination through email or
- The time limit of the examination shall be 2 hours and 30 minutes. The students shall be asked to attempt any 5 questions out of the 10 questions set from the entire syllabus of the Course.
- The students shall be directed to write the answer on the self attested white sheets marked with
- For the End Semester Project Work, the examination shall be conducted through power point presentations on virtual platform using Google meet/Webex/Skype etc followed by viva-voce
- With regard to the practical examination of the End Semester, the written part shall be of 50% weightage and the examination shall be similar to the open book method as above, for the duration of one hour followed by an exhaustive viva-voce (50% weightage) to be conducted after the presentation. This practice will also be applicable to the Inter-mediate semesters (68.8)
  - All the departments are required to complete the entire examination process by 30% September
  - The students of the Terminal Semester/Final Year having backlog of previous Semesters shall be evaluated by conducting examinations by the concerned departments/Offsite Campuses as per the above mentioned procedure.



The College shall conduct Internal Evaluation (which can be Internal Assessment/Assignment) for Semester 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> students. 50% weightage shall be given to the internal evaluation and the remaining 50% weightage to the average marks secured by the student in the preceding semester. The College shall complete the internal evaluation, if not done earlier, during the first 10 days of the start of the class work for the next semester. It is stressed here that this is as per the UGC scheme of 50% weightage to the previous fr of vsv semester awards and 50% weightage to the internal evaluation awards of the semester in question.

2. For 2<sup>nd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Semester private students, the Committee recommends 50% weightage for the internal assessment already evaluated/awarded in the 2<sup>nd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> semester and the remaining 50% weightage to be added from the

The Assessment/Assignment) for Semester 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> students, 50% weightage shall be given to the internal evaluation and the remaining 50% weightage to the average marks secured by the student in the preceding semester (i.e. Semester ) & III respectively). The College shall complete the internal evaluation, if not done earlier, during the first 10 days of the start of the class work for the next semester post lockdown. This is as per the UGC scheme of 50% weightage to the previous semester awards and 50% weightage to the internal evaluation awards of the semester in question.

2. For 2<sup>nd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> Semester private students, the Committee recommends 50% weightage for the internal assessment already evaluated/awarded in the 2<sup>nd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> semester and the remaining 50% weightage to be given to the preceding semester score of the subject

passed by the candidate.

3. For the students of 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Semesters of the Directorate of Distance Education. the calculation of result shall be 50% weightage to the Internal Assessment awards received from the Directorate of Distance Education and the rest 50% weightage shall be given to the performance in the preceding semester (passed subject).

However, the terminal examination for Under-graduate 6th Semester shall be conducted on the pattern of Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) to be answered on OMR sheets by following all the safety norms/precautions, social distancing, staggered shifts, etc. as sconas conditions are considered conducive. The question papers shall be set from the course content delivered/syllabi completed (based on the report of the Nodal Principal of the Colleges) before the lockdown or during the lockdown

To have an assessment of the Courses completed/amount of course content delivered, uptill March 20th 2020 (or during the lock-down period) for the II, IV and VI Semester of Undergraduate studies, the Nodal Principal of the Colleges be asked to organize a meeting with all College Principals and provide information about all the Courses so that the University further takes it up with the concerned Conveners of the Boards of Studies for concrete action plan for the conduct of II, IV and VI Semester examinations.

Based on the data to be provided by the Nodal Principal in the form of %age of courses completed and the Minor-I or/and Minor-II tests conducted/to be conducted, the Academic Section of the University shall place the same before the Conveners of the Boards of Studies for proposing examination schemes which shall necessarily be different from the existing ones. Since the component of Marks for theory as well as practicals varies in case of various subjects, a uniform scheme thus will not be helpful. Therefore, it is requested that the data flows from the Office of the Nodal Principal be placed before a Committee for further deliberations with concerned Conveners of the Board of Studies so that a comprehensive policy is evolved for moving ahead in the academic business. The Committee met in the Office of the Controller of Examinations on 18<sup>th</sup> May 2020 at 12.30 p.m. and perused the report submitted by a Committee of the Officers of the Examination Wing, which is given at Annexure-I.

After discussing the entire issue pertaining to the Non-professional Courses semester examinations of the University of Jammu and noted as under: -

- i) The result of Under-graduate Semester-I (CBCS) is expected to be declared by May 31, 2020.
- ii) The result of Under-graduate Semester-III (CBCS & Non-CBCS) is expected to be declared by May 31, 2020.
- iii) The result of Under-graduate Semester-V (Non-CBCS)has already been declared and efforts are being made for the declaration of result of Semester-V (CBCS) by May 31, 2020.
- iv) As per the information provided by the Nodal Principal, more than 80% of the syllabus for Semester-II, IV & VI Session 019-20 has been completed. However, Internal Assessment has not been conducted.

The guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission, were also perused which, inter alia, provides that —

- "1. Terminal semester/year examinations for PG/UG Courses/Programmes may be conducted by Universities as suggested ibn the academic calendar keeping in mind the protocols of 'social distancing'.
- 2. For intermediate semester/year students, the Universities may conduct examinations, after making a comprehensive assessment of their level of preparedness, residential status of the students, status of COVID-19 pandemic spread in different region/state and other factors.

In case the situation does not appear to be normal in view of COVID-19, in order to maintain "social distancing", safety and health of the students, grading of the students could be composite of 50% marks on the basis of the pattern of internal evaluation adopted by the Universities and the remaining 50% marks can be awarded on the basis of performance in previous semesters only

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(if available). The internal evaluation can be continuous evaluation, prelims, mid-semester, internal assignments or whatever name is given for student progression.

In the situations where previous semester or previous year marks are not available, particularly in the first year of annual pattern of examinations, 100% evaluation may be done on the basis of internal evaluation.

If the students whishes to improve the grades, he/she may appear in special exams for such subjects during next semester".

However, as internals have not been held, as such, the Committee is constraint to suggest as under, under the given circumstances: -

### **Suggestions:**

- A. The students of Semester-II (CBCS) be promoted to Semester-III on the basis of their score of Semester-Ist.
- B. The students of Semester-IV (CBCS & Non-CBCS) be also promoted to Semester-V on the basis of their Semester-III awards.
- C. The Internal Assessment shall be awarded on proportional basis as per the marks secured in the external examination.
- D. The terminal semester examination for Semester-VI (CBCS & Non-CBCS) is recommended with the following options: -
  - OP-i) The students be given a chance for open-choice, i.e. they be asked to do any five questions irrespective of the Units mentioned in the Syllabi/Question Paper, which shall be held in the Month of July 2020 (first fortnight).
  - OP-ii) The students be examined on the basis of MCQs. The Convener, Board of Studies shall be responsible for the setting of 04 series (A D) of Question Papers. They shall provide Answer Keys for each series of the Question Papers.
  - OP-iii) The students be given the average score for each subject/course on the basis of marks obtained in the same subject/course in the preceding semester; provided all the Courses of preceding semester have been passed by the candidate.

Further, the candidate who is failing by 5% of marks in each course/subject may be considered for grace of 5% of marks in that subject enabling him/her to pass the same. This shall be applicable to Semester-VI students appearing in 2020.

At the outset, the Vice-Chancellor welcomed the members of the committee and asked the Controller of Examinations to place on the table the agenda items for discussion which are as under:-

1. MODALITIES ABOUT EXAMINATION AT THE UNDER-GRADUATE LEVEL FOR NON-PROFESSIONAL COURSES:

The Committee deliberated upon the matter in the context of the UGC letter regarding "Revised guidelines on examinations and academic calendar for the Universities because of COVID-19 Pandemic" received vide reference D.O.No.F.1-1/2020 (Secy.), dated: 6<sup>th</sup> July 2020.

The salient features of the revised UGC guidelines are reproduced as under:

1. Mode of Terminal Semester/Final Year Examinations (2019-20)

The Universities are required to complete the examination process by the end of September 2020 in offline (pen & paper) / online/blended (online + offline) mode by observing the prescribed protocols/ guidelines related to COVID-19 pandemic.

2. Provision of Examination through Special Chance

In case a student of the terminal semester/ final year is unable to appear in the examination conducted by the University for whatsoever the reason(s) may be, he/she may be allowed to appear in special examinations for such course(s)/ paper(s), which may be conducted by the university as and when feasible so that the student is not put to any inconvenience/disadvantage. The above provision shall be applicable only for the current academic session 2019-20 as a one-time measure.

3. A backlog of Papers in Respect of Terminal Semester(s)/ Final Year Students

The students of terminal semester/ final year students having backlog should compulsorily be evaluated by conducting examinations in offline (pen & paper) / online/blended (online + offline) mode as per feasibility and suitability.

 The guidelines regarding intermediate semester/ year examinations will remain unchanged as notified by the UGC on 29th April 2020.

5. The relevant details, if need be, about the Admissions and Academic Calendar in the Universities and Colleges shall be issued separately in place of those mentioned in the earlier guidelines issued on 29th April 2020.

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6. Notwithstanding the above guidelines regarding the conduct of examination and commencement of next academic session, every university/ institution has to ensure that it is prepared in all respects to carry out the academic activities following necessary protocols/guidelines/ directions/advisories issued by the Central/State Governments and MHRD/ UGC from time to time, because of COVID-19.

The new notification will be in supersession of earlier notification issued by the University vide Notice No. SPA/COE/2020/1350-1449, dated: 06-06-2020.

To deliberate on the methodology for the intermediate semesters of UG examinations (2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semesters), it was decided that the Controller of Examination shall write to the Nodal Principal requesting him to direct all the College Principals to prepare the Internal Assessment Awards of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4th semesters (Regular) and submit the same both in soft as well as the hard form to the Controller of Examination latest by 31st August 2020.

As per the UGC guidelines, the University shall initiate necessary measures for the declaration of results of 2<sup>nd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> Semesters by taking a total of 100 Marks, out of which 50% weightage shall be of the marks obtained by the student in the previous semester i.e. 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> and the rest of the 50% weightage shall be the internal assessment submitted by the concerned candidate for the current semester i.e. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Semesters.

Further, the colleges shall bifurcate the Internal Assessment into two components i.e. 30 marks out of 50 based on Internal Assignment and 20 marks as another crucial parameter of Attendance / Viva-Voce, etc. etc. as deemed fit by the teacher concerned

The above scheme shall be adopted for the successful candidates of the previous semesters(Ist and 3rd) only and the re-appear /backlog candidates of the previous semesters i.e., Ist and 3rd shall not be covered under this scheme till they clear their backlog in the previous semesters(Ist and 3rd).

## 2. TO EXPLORE THE POSSIBILITIES OF CONDUCTING PROFESSIONAL COURSES EXAMINATIONS ESPECIALLY BACHELOR OF ENGINEERING (B.E.).

The Committee was of the considered opinion that the above formula may also be applied in respect of the Bachelor of Engineering students. However, the Dean Faculty of Engineering apprised the members that a large number of final year Engineering students are approaching her office with the plea that they are applying for their placement in national / multi-national Companies and require Provisional Certificates. She also informed the members that other Universities are issuing Provisional Certificates to their students.

The Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor asked the Dean Faculty of Engineering to take all the principals of Professional (B.E) Colleges into confidence and make a survey of the students to sit in offline/online examination and submit a concrete proposal regarding the conduct of terminal examination of B.E. student to the University for consideration of the Committee.

The meeting terminated with a vote of thanks to the chair.

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#### **Public Notice**

Due to COVID-19 pandemic and as per the UGC guidelines issued from time to time, the University of Jamunu has taken the following measures to protect the academic interests of its students:

- (1) Under-Graduate 6th semester examinations of B.A'B.Sc/B.Com/BBA/BCA/B.Com.(H), etc., (CBCS & Non-CBBCS) with 60% relaxation in the syllabi on the basis of open choice pattern were conducted and results stand declared.
- (2) The result of private students of intermediate semesters of UG Course i.e. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> semesters (CBCS/Non-CBCS) have already been declared whereas result of regular students of 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> semesters is under compilation and is expected to be declared shortly. However, candidates of these semesters having backlogs in previous semesters, have to appear in the examinations to be conducted by the University to clear the backlog paper/s.
- (3) Students of UG 5th Semester (Supplementary) Examination 2019 (CBCS & Non-CBCS), which examination could not be held during the month of June/July 2020 due to Covid-19 lockdown restrictions, were passed by awarding minimum pass marks in the backlog paper/s of the said semester enabling them to apply for admission to PG Programmes.
- (4) Students who had cleared all the semester, and were to re-appear in one paper only, either of 1<sup>st</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> semester, have been treated as pass by awarding minimum pass marks in the backlog paper.
- (5) Any students not satisfied with the criteria of awarding minimum pass marks, has been given the option to appear in the 1<sup>st</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> semester examination, as the case may be, which shall commence w.e.f. 16<sup>th</sup> February, 2021. Such a student shall, however, be awarded best of the two scores i.e. the minimum marks awarded to pass him/her in the said semester or the marks which will be secured by him/her in the examination to be conducted by the University.
- (6) As per the recommendations of the Principals of Colleges located in winter zone. UG 1st semester CBCS (Regular-winter-zone and all private candidates) and 3st semester CBCS (Private candidates) shall be held w.e.f. 16st Feb. 2021 on open choice pattern and the candidates shall have to attempt 40% questions only.

Now, therefore, the academic standards laid down by the University cannot be compromised by providing promotion/s at each stage of the three year degree course which will adversely impact the career of the students. As such, all the students are advised to remain in touch with the University website www.cocju.com for regular updates pertaining to the schedule of examinations to be conducted by the University in feture.

To consider the recommendations passed in a meeting under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor related to the various academic issues of the Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu.

#### NOTE:

It is submitted that the various academic issues related to the Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu were discussed in a meeting held on 16.02.2021 under the Chairmanship of the Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu and the following was resolved:

- 1. The Central admission procedure is required to be framed and adopted in the University and the same be operationalized under the supervision of the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs.
- 2. The Offsite Campuses should introduce self financing short term skill based novel courses instead of replicating teaching courses already offered at the Main Campus.
- 3. The Offsite Campuses should be flexible and nimble so that they cater to the present needs of society, environment and industry.
- 4. The Choice Based Credit System in the Master's Degree Programmes be introduced in the Offsite Campuses with MOOCs and SWAYAM programmes as option for open courses. The Nodal Department shall be the Mentor Department for admission as well as paper setting and evaluation of the Major Test. The system be adopted as per the following:
  - (i) Minor-1 & Minor-2 Tests shall be conducted by the Offsite Campuses.
  - (ii) Major Test shall be conducted under the supervision of the Nodal Department.
  - 5. The Offsite Campuses shall act as facilitation centres of the Main Campus for the affiliated Colleges of the area.

Hence, the above mentioned recommendations are submitted for considerations.

The chair after formally welcoming the esteemed members apprised them about the need to revisit the curriculum in the light of NEP 2020 and requested all the Dean Academic Affairs (Members)/ their nominees to work cohesively and in synergy for enriching the curriculum as per NEP 2020.

While discussing the agenda of the meeting, Commissioner Secretary held that while the core competency courses of the CBCS system in vogue should be given due preference until UGC notifies a new scheme of curriculum in line with goals of NEP 2020, however some interventions in the current scheme are required so that the ability and employability of the students is enhanced.

He further directed that for effective implementation of the decisions taken in the meeting by the committee members after discussions and agreement thereof, should be forwarded to the affiliating Universities of Jamma and Kashmir and the Cluster Universities of Jamma Srinagar, so at at forms part of the ugenda of Academic Councils of these universities for consideration and implementation.

After threadbare discussion on each agenda item, the following decisions were taken:
