The Vice-Chancellor apprised that efforts are being made to improve the quality of publications and the University should launch an app to make the faculty aware about various calls/advertisements of the research proposals and their deadlines by different agencies around the world.

Teaching methods, guided by such a framework, may include lectures supported by tutorial work; practicum and field-based learning; the use of prescribed textbooks and e-learning resources and other self-study materials; field-based learning/project, open-ended project work, some of which may be team-based; activities designed to promote the development of generic/transferable and subject-specific skills; and internship and visits to field sites, and industrial or other research facilities etc.





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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

University of Jammu is recognized as one of the premier institutions of the country and is accredited as A* by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council of India (NAAC). It ranked 56th in University category under NIRF-2022. The University of Jammu has also been granted autonomy by the UGC and falls in Category-I in terms of this autonomy. It came into existence in 1969 vide Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act 1969 following bifurcation of the erstwhile University of Jammu and Kashmir by an ordinance promulgated by the Governor on September 5, 1969 and was subsequently adopted as an Act of the State Legislature.

Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir is the Chancellor of the University. Apart from its Main and Old Campus in Jammu, the University of Jammu also has eleven Offsite Campuses, out of which seven campuses located at Bhaderwah, Kathua, Kishtwar, Poonch, Ramnagar, Reasi and Udhampur are functional. Teaching-learning and research are being carried out by 43 departments and one hundred sixty three Govt. /Private affiliated Colleges.

The main campus of the University of Jammu is situated at Bahu Wali Rakh with an area of 118.78 acres, houses the Teaching Departments, Centres, Directorate of Sports and Physical Education, UGC-HRDC, Research Studies Wing, Administration Block, Examination Wing, College Development Council, Department of Students Welfare, Directorate of Distance Education, Dhanvantri Library, Publication Cell, Computer Centre, Health Centre, Guest House, Post Office, J&K Bank, Gymnasium, Hostels, Cafeteria and Canteens, Residential Quarters and many other facilities.



PROVIDED also, that where candidates have obtained equal composite score, the tie shall be resolved by reference to their achievement merit in the respective activity determined as per Statute. Higher achievement merit shall determined priority in admission.




Pattern of Common University Entrance Test CUET (UG)-2023 Exam



CBME CURRICULUM

1. Preamble

The new Graduate Medical Education Regulations attempts to stand on the shoulder of the contributions and the efforts of resource persons, teachers and students (past and present). It intends to take the learner to provide health care to the evolving needs of the nation and the world.

About 25 years have passed since the existing Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997 were notified, necessitating a relook at all aspects of the various components in the existing regulations and adapt them to the changing demography, socio-economic context, perceptions, values, advancements in medical education and expectations of stakeholders. Emerging health care issues particularly in the context of emerging diseases, impact of advances in science and technology and shorter distances on diseases and their management also need consideration. The strong and forward-looking fundamentals enshrined in the Regulations on Graduate Medical Education, 1997 has made this job easier. A comparison between the 1997 Regulations and proposed Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 2019 will reveal that the 2019 Regulations have evolved from several key principles enshrined in the 1997 Regulations.

The thrust in the new regulations is continuation and evolution of thought in medical education making it more learner-centric, patient-centric, gender- sensitive, outcome -oriented and environment appropriate. The result is an outcome driven curriculum which conforms to global trends. Emphasis is made on alignment and integration of subjects both horizontally and vertically while respecting the strengths and necessity of subject-based instruction and assessment. This has necessitated a deviation from using "broad competencies"; instead, the reports have written end of phase subject (sub) competencies. These "sub-competencies" can be mapped to the global competencies in the Graduate Medical Education Regulations.

The importance of ethical values, responsiveness to the needs of the patient and acquisition of communication skills is underscored by providing dedicated curriculum time in the form of a longitudinal program based on Attitude, Ethics and Communication (AETCOM) competencies. Great emphasis has been placed on collaborative and inter-disciplinary

teamwork, professionalism, altruism and respect in professional relationships with due sensitivity to differences in thought, social and economic position and gender.

2. Objectives of the Indian Graduate Medical Training Programme

The undergraduate medical education program is designed with a goal to create an "Indian Medical Graduate" (IMG) possessing requisite knowledge, skills, attitudes, values and responsiveness, so that she or he may function appropriately and effectively as a physician of first contact of the community while being globally relevant. To achieve this, the following national and institutional goals for the learner of the Indian Medical Graduate training program are hereby prescribed.

3. National Goals

At the end of undergraduate program, the Indian Medical Graduate should be able to:

- a. Recognize "health for all" as a national goal and health right of all citizens and by undergoing training for medical profession fulfill his social obligations towards realization of this goal.
- Learn key aspects of National policies on health and devote himself to its practical implementation.
- Achieve competence in practice of holistic medicine, encompassing promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative aspects of common diseases.
- Develop scientific temper, acquire educational experience for proficiency in profession and promote healthy living.
- Become exemplary citizen by observance of medical ethics and fulfilling social and professional obligations, so as to respond to national aspirations.

4. Institutional Goals

In consonance with the national goals, each medical institution should evolve institutional goals to define the kind of trained manpower (or professionals) they intend to produce. The Indian Medical Graduates coming out of a medical institute should:

- a. Be competent in diagnosis and management of common health problems of the individual and the community, commensurate with his/her position as a member of the health team at the primary, secondary or tertiary levels, using his/her clinical skills based on history, physical examination and relevant investigations.
- Be competent to practice preventive, promotive, curative, palliative and rehabilitative medicine in respect to the commonly encountered health problems.
- c. Appreciate rationale for different thempeutic modalities; be familiar with the administration of the "essential drugs" and their common side effects.
- d. Appreciate the socio-psychological, cultural, economic and environmental factors affecting health and develop humane attitude towards the patients in discharging one's professional responsibilities.
- e. Possess the attitude for continued self-learning and to seek further expertise or to pursue research in any chosen area of medicine, action research and documentation skills.
- f. Be familiar with the basic factors which are essential for the implementation of the National Health Programs including practical aspects of the following:
 - i) Family Welfare and Maternal and Child Health (MCH);
 - ii) Sanitation and water supply;
 - iii) Prevention and control of communicable and non-communicable diseases;
 - iv) Immunization;
 - v) Health Education and advocacy;
 - vi) Indian Public Health Standards (IPHS) at various level of service delivery;
 - vii) Bio-medical waste disposal
 - viii) Organizational and or institutional arrangements.

- g. Acquire basic management skills in the area of human resources, materials and resource management related to health care delivery, general and hospital management, principal inventory skills and counseling.
- h. Be able to identify community health problems and learn to work to resolve these by designing, instituting corrective steps and evaluating outcome of such measures with maximum community participation.
- Be able to work as a leading partner in health care teams and acquire proficiency in communication skills.
- j. Be competent to work in a variety of health care settings.
- k. Have personal characteristics and attitudes required for professional life including personal integrity, sense of responsibility and dependability and ability to relate to or show concern for other individuals.

5. Goals for the Learner

In order to fulfill these goals, the Indian Medical Graduate must be able to function in the following roles appropriately and effectively:-

- Clinician who understands and provides preventive, promotive, curative, palliative and holistic care with compassion.
- Leader and member of the health care team and system with capabilities to collect, analyze, synthesize and communicate health data appropriately.
- c. Communicator with patients, families, colleagues and community.
- Lifelong learner committed to continuous improvement of skills and knowledge.
- Professional, who is committed to excellence, is ethical, responsive and accountable to
 patients, community and profession.
- f. Critical thinker who demonstrates problem solving skills in professional practice

g. Researcher who generates and interprets evidence

6. Competency Based Training Programme of the Indian Medical Graduate

Competency based learning would include designing and implementing medical education curriculum that focuses on the desired and observable ability in real life situations. In order to effectively fulfill the roles, the Indian Medical Graduate would have obtained the following set of competencies at the time of graduation:

Clinician, who understands and provides preventive, promotive, curative, palliative and holistic care with compassion

- Demonstrate knowledge of normal human structure, function and development from a molecular, cellular, biologic, clinical, behavioral and social perspective.
- Demonstrate knowledge of abnormal human structure, function and development from a molecular, cellular, biological, clinical, behavioral and social perspective.
- Demonstrate knowledge of medico-legal, societal, ethical and humanitarian principles that influence healthcare.
- Demonstrate knowledge of national and regional health care policies including the National Health Mission that incorporates National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) and National Urban Health Mission (NUHM), frameworks, economics and systems that influence health promotion, health care delivery, disease prevention, effectiveness, responsiveness, quality and patient safety.
- Demonstrate ability to elicit and record from the patient, and other relevant sources including relatives and caregivers, a history that is complete and relevant to disease identification, disease prevention and health promotion.
- Demonstrate ability to elicit and record from the patient, and other relevant sources
 including relatives and caregivers, a history that is contextual to gender, age,
 vulnerability, social and economic status, patient preferences, beliefs and values.
- Demonstrate ability to perform a physical examination that is complete and relevant to disease identification, disease prevention and health promotion.
- Demonstrate ability to perform a physical examination that is contextual to gender,

social and economic status, patient preferences and values.

- Demonstrate effective clinical problem solving, judgment and ability to interpret and integrate available data in order to address patient problems, generate differential diagnoses and develop individualized management plans that include preventive, promotive and therapeutic goals.
- Maintain accurate, clear and appropriate record of the patient in conformation with legal and administrative frameworks.
- Demonstrate ability to choose the appropriate diagnostic tests and interpret these tests based on scientific validity, cost effectiveness and clinical context.
- Demonstrate ability to prescribe and safely administer appropriate therapies including nutritional interventions, pharmacotherapy and interventions based on the principles of rational drug therapy, scientific validity, evidence and cost that conform to established national and regional health programmers and policies for the following:
 - o Disease prevention,
 - o Health promotion and cure,
 - o Pain and distress alleviation, and
 - Rehabilitation and palliation.
- Demonstrate ability to provide a continuum of care at the primary (including home care) and/or secondary level that addresses chronicity, mental and physical disability.
- Demonstrate ability to appropriately identify and refer patients who may require specialized or advanced tertiary care.
- Demonstrate familiarity with basic, clinical and translational research as it applies to the care of the patient.

Leader and member of the health care team and system

- Work effectively and appropriately with colleagues in an inter-professional health care team respecting diversity of roles, responsibilities and competencies of other professionals.
- Recognize and function effectively, responsibly and appropriately as a health care team leader in primary and secondary health care settings.

- Educate and motivate other members of the team and work in a collaborative and collegial fashion that will help maximize the health care delivery potential of the team.
- Access and utilize components of the health care system and health delivery in a
 manner that is appropriate, cost effective, fair and in compliance with the national
 health care priorities and policies, as well as be able to collect, analyze and utilize
 health data.
- Participate appropriately and effectively in measures that will advance quality of health care and patient safety within the health care system.
- Recognize and advocate health promotion, disease prevention and health care quality improvement through prevention and early recognition: in a) life style diseases and b) cancer, in collaboration with other members of the health care team.

Communicator with patients, families, colleagues and community

- Demonstrate ability to communicate adequately, sensitively, effectively and respectfully with patients in a language that the patient understands and in a manner that will improve patient satisfaction and health care outcomes.
- Demonstrate ability to establish professional relationships with patients and families that are positive, understanding, humane, ethical, empathetic, and trustworthy.
- Demonstrate ability to communicate with patients in a manner respectful of patient's preferences, values, prior experience, beliefs, confidentiality and privacy.
- Demonstrate ability to communicate with patients, colleagues and families in a manner that encourages participation and shared decision- making.

7. Lifelong learner committed to continuous improvement of skills and knowledge

- Demonstrate ability to perform an objective self-assessment of knowledge and skills, continue learning, refine existing skills and acquire new skills.
- Demonstrate ability to apply newly gained knowledge or skills to the care of the patient.
- Demonstrate ability to introspect and utilize experiences, to enhance personal and professional growth and learning.

- Demonstrate ability to search (including through electronic means), and critically reevaluate the medical literature and apply the information in the care of the patient.
- Be able to identify and select an appropriate career pathway that is professionally rewarding and personally fulfilling.

Professional who is committed to excellence, is ethical, responsive and accountable to patients, community and the profession

- · Practice selflessness, integrity, responsibility, accountability and respect.
- Respect and maintain professional boundaries between patients, colleagues and society.
- Demonstrate ability to recognize and manage ethical and professional conflicts.
- Abide by prescribed ethical and legal codes of conduct and practice.
- Demonstrate a commitment to the growth of the medical profession as awhile.

A. CURRICULUM

> 1st Professional Year:

1. ANATOMY

a. Competencies:

The undergraduate must demonstrate:

- Understanding of the gross and microscopic structure and development of human body,
- Comprehension of the normal regulation and integration of the functions of the organs and systems on basis of the structure and genetic pattern,
- Understanding of the clinical correlation of the organs and structures involved and interpret the anatomical basis of the disease presentations.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

Knowledge: At the end of the course the student should be able to

- Comprehend the normal disposition, clinically relevant interrelationships, functional and cross-sectional Anatomy of the various organs and structures of the body.
- Identify the microscopic structure and correlate elementary ultra structure of various organs and tissues with the functions as a prerequisite for understanding the altered state in various disease processes.
- Comprehend the basic structure and connections of the central nervous system to analyze the integrative and regulative functions of the organs and systems. He should be able to locate the site of gross lesions according to the deficits encountered
- Demonstrate knowledge of the basic principles and sequential development of the
 organs and systems; recognize the critical stages of development and the effects of
 common teratogens, genetic mutations and environmental hazards. He should be able
 to explain the developmental basis of the major variations and abnormalities.

e. Skills:

At the end of the course the student should be able to -

- Identify and locate all the structures of the body and mark the topography of the Living Anatomy.
- Understand clinical basis of some common clinical procedures i.e. intramuscular and intravenous injection, lumbar puncture and kidney biopsy etc.
- Identify the organs and tissues under the microscope.
- Understand the principles of karyotyping and identify the gross congenital anomalies.
- Understand principles of newer imaging techniques and interpretation of CT scan, sonogram, MRI & Angiography.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in organ systems with clinical correlation that will provide a context for the learner to

understand the relationship between structure and function and interpret the anatomical basis of various clinical conditions and procedures.

2. PHYSIOLOGY

a. Competencies: The undergraduates must demonstrate:

- Understanding of the normal functioning of the organs and organ systems of the body,
- Comprehension of the normal structure and organization of the organs and systems on basis of the functions,
- Understanding of age-related physiological changes in the organ functions that reflect normal growth and development,
- Understand the physiological basis of diseases.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

Knowledge

At the end of the course, the student will be able to:

- Describe the normal functions of all the systems, the regulatory mechanisms and interactions of the various systems for well-coordinated total body functions.
- Understanding the relative contribution of each organ system in the maintenance of the milieu interior (homeostasis)
- Explain the physiological aspects of the normal growth and development.
- Analyze the physiological responses and adaptation to environmental stress.
 Comprehend the physiological principles underlying pathogenesis and treatment of disease.
- Correlate knowledge of physiology of human reproductive system in relation to National Family welfare program.

c. Skills

At the end of the course the student shall be able to:

- Conduct experiments designed for study of physiological phenomenon.
- Interpret experimental /investigative data.
- Distinguish between normal and abnormal data derived as a result
 of clinical examination and tests, which he has performed and observed in
 the laboratory.
- Recognize and get familiar with newer computerized and advanced instruments like medspiror, semen quality analyzer, EMG and TMT
- d. Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in organ systems in order to provide a context in which normal function can be correlated both with structure and with the biological basis, its clinical features, diagnosis and therapy.

3. BIOCHEMISTRY

a. Competencies:

The learner must demonstrate an understanding of:

- Biochemical and molecular processes involved in health and disease,
- Importance of nutrition in health and disease,
- Biochemical basis and rationale of clinical laboratory tests, and demonstrate ability to interpret these in the clinical context.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge:

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- · Enlist and describe the cell organelles with their molecular ad functional organization.
- Delineate structure, function and interrelationships of various biomolecules and consequences of deviation from the normal.
- Understand basic enzymology and emphasize on its clinical applications wherein regulation of enzymatic activity is disturbed.
- Describe digestion and assimilation of nutrients and consequences of malnutrition.
- Describe and integrate metabolic pathways of various biomolecules with their regulatory mechanisms.
- · Explain the biochemical basis of inherited disorders with their associated squeal.
- Describe mechanisms involved in maintenance in water, electrolyte and acid base balance and consequences of their imbalances.
- Outline the molecular mechanisms of gene expression and regulation, basic principles
 of biotechnology and their applications in medicine.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:

- Make use of conventional techniques / instruments to perform biochemical analysis relevant to clinical screening and diagnosis;
- · Analysis and interpret investigative data;
- Demonstrate the skills of solving scientific and clinical problems and decision making.

d. Integration:

The teaching/learning programme should be integrated horizontally and vertically, as much as possible, to enable learners to make clinical correlations and to acquire an understanding of the cellular and molecular basis of health and disease.

2ndProfessional Year:

4. PATHOLOGY

a. Competencies:

The undergraduate must demonstrate:

- Comprehension of the causes, evolution and mechanisms of diseases.
- Knowledge of alterations in gross and cellular morphology of organs in disease states,
- Ability to correlate the natural history, structural and functional changes with the clinical manifestations of diseases, their diagnosis and therapy.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

Knowledge:

At the end of one and half years, the student shall be able to:-

- Describe the structure and ultra structure of a sick cell, causes and mechanisms of cell
 Injury, cell death and repair.
- · Correlate structural and functional alterations in the sick cell.
- Explain the path physiological processes, which govern the maintenance of homeostasis, mechanisms of their disturbance and the morphological and clinical manifestation associated with it.
- Describe the mechanisms and patterns of tissue response to injury so as to appreciate
 the path physiology of disease processes and their application to clinical science.
- Correlate the gross and microscopic alterations of different organ systems in common disease to the extent needed for understanding disease processes and their clinical significance.
- Develop an understanding of steps in neoplastic changes in the body and their effects in order to appreciate need for early diagnosis and further management of neoplasia.
- Understand mechanisms of common hematological disorders and develop a logical approach in their diagnosis and management.
- Develop understanding of the blood banking, blood donors & transfusion of blood & blood products, (components).
- Understand pathophysiology of infectious diseases in relation with tissue changes.

- Describe the various immunological reactions in understanding the disease process & tissue transplant.
- Develop an understanding for genetic disorders.
- Understand the vital organ function test of Kidney, liver & thyroid.

e. Skills

At the end of one and half years, the student shall be able to:

- Describe the rationale and principles of routine technical procedures of the diagnostic laboratory tests & perforn it.
- Interpret routine diagnostic laboratory tests and correlate with clinical, hematological and morphological changes.
- Perform the simple bed-side tests on blood, urine and other biological fluid samples:
- Draw a rational scheme of investigations aimed at diagnosing and managing the cases of common disorders.
- Able to understand the microscopic and macroscopic features of common diseases.
- Develop different type of skills such as observation skills, communication skill and presentation skill.
- Understand biochemical/physiological disturbances that occur as a result of disease in collaboration with all concerned departments.
- d. Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in organ systems recognizing deviations from normal structure and function and clinically correlated so as to provide an overall understanding of the etiology, mechanisms, laboratory diagnosis, and management of diseases.

5. MICROBIOLOGY

a. Competencies:

The undergraduate learner demonstrates:

- Understanding of role of microbial agents in health and disease,
- Understanding of the immunological mechanisms in health and disease,
- Ability to correlate the natural history, mechanisms and clinical manifestations of infectious diseases as they relate to the properties of microbial agents,
- Knowledge of the principles and application of infection control measures,
- An understanding of the basis of choice of laboratory diagnostic tests and their interpretation, antimicrobial therapy, control and prevention of infectious diseases.
 - Knowledge of outbreak investigation and its control.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

At the end of the course the student will be able to:

- · Explain how the different microorganisms can cause human infection.
- Understand commercial, opportunistic and pathogenic organisms and describe host parasite relationship.
- Describe the characteristics (morphology, cultural characteristics, resistance, virulence factors, incubation period, mode of transmission etc.) of different microorganisms.
- Explain the various defense mechanisms of the host against the microorganisms which can cause human infection.
- Describe the laboratory diagnosis of microorganisms causing human infections and disease.
- Describe the prophylaxis for the particular infecting microorganisms

c. Skills

At the end of the course the student shall be able to

- Plan the laboratory investigations for the diagnosis of infectious diseases.
- Perform laboratory procedures to arrive at the etiological diagnosis of infectious diseases caused by bacteria, fungi, viruses and parasites including the drug sensitivity profile.
- · Perform and interpret immunological and serological tests.
- · Operate routine and sophisticated instruments in the laboratory.
- Develop microteaching skills and Pedagogy
- · Successfully implement the chosen research methodology
- d. Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in organ systems with emphasis on host-microbe-environment interactions and their alterations in disease and clinical correlations so as to provide an overall understanding of the etiological agents, their laboratory diagnosis and prevention.

6. PHARMACOLOGY

- a. Competencies: The undergraduate must demonstrate:
- Knowledge about essential and commonly used drugs and an understanding of the pharmacologic basis of therapeutics,
- Ability to select and prescribe medicines based on clinical condition and the pharmacologic properties, efficacy, safety, suitability and cost of medicines for common clinical conditions of national importance,
- Knowledge of pharmacovigilance, essential medicine concept and sources of drug information and industry-doctor relationship,
- Ability to counsel patients regarding appropriate use of prescribed drug and drug delivery systems.
- b. Broad subject specific objectives

(A) Knowledge:

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- Describe the Pharmacokinetics and Pharmacodynamics of essential and commonly used drugs.
- Enlist the indications, contraindications, interactions and adverse reactions of commonly used drugs.
- Tailor the use of appropriate drugs in disease with consideration of its cost, efficacy and safety for
 - a. Individual needs and
 - Mass therapy, under National Health Programs.
- Integrate the list of drugs of addiction and recommend the management of drug addiction.
- Explain pharmacological basis of prescribing drugs in special medical situations such as pregnancy, lactation, infancy, old age, renal damage, hepatic damage and immunocompromised patients.
- Explain the concept of rational drug therapy in clinical pharmacology.
- · State the principles underlying the concept of 'Essential Drugs'.
- Evaluate the ethics and modalities involved in the development and introduction of new drugs.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- Prescribe drugs for common ailments.
- Identify adverse reactions and drug interactions of commonly used drugs.
- Interpret the data obtained from the experiments designed for the study of effect of drugs in various experimental and clinical studies.
- Analyze the information regarding common pharmaceutical preparations and critically evaluate drug formulations.
- Appraise the Principles of Clinical Pharmacy and Dispense the Medications giving proper instructions.

d. Integration: Practical knowledge of use of drugs in Clinical Practice will be acquired through Integrated Teaching vertically with phase 1 subjects and horizontally with other phase 2 subjects.

3rd Professional year

7. FORENSIC MEDICINE AND TOXICOLOGY

- a. Competencies: The learner must demonstrate:
- Understanding of medico-legal responsibilities of physicians in primary and secondary care settings,
- Understanding of the rational approach to the investigation of crime, based on scientific and legal principles,
- Ability to manage medical and legal issues in cases of poisoning/overdose,
- Understanding the medico-legal framework of medical practice and medical negligence,
- Understanding of codes of conduct and medical ethics,
- Understanding concept of deceased donor, brain death, and Human Organ Transplantation Act.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge: At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- Identify the basic Medico-legal aspects of hospital and general practice.
- Define the Medico-legal responsibilities of a general physician while rendering community service either in a rural primary health centre or an urban health centre.

- Appreciate the physician's responsibilities in criminal matters and respect for the codes of Medical ethics.
- Diagnose, manage and identify legal aspect of common acute and chronic poisonings.
- Describe the Medico-legal aspects and findings of post-mortem examination in cases of death due to common unnatural conditions and poisonings.
- Detect occupational and environmental poisoning, prevention and epidemiology of common poisoning and their legal aspects particularly pertaining to Workmen's Compensation Act.
- Describe the general principles of analytical toxicology.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- Make observations and draw logical inferences in order to initiate enquiries in criminal matters and Medico-legal problems and be able to -
- Carry on proper Medico-legal examination and documentation/Reporting of Injury and Age.
- Conduct examination for sexual offences and intexication...
- Preserve relevant ancillary materials for medico-legal examination.
- Identify important post-mortem findings in common unnatural deaths.
- Diagnose and treat common emergencies in poisoning and chronic toxicity.
- Make observations and interpret findings at post-mortem examination.
- · Observe the principles of medical ethics in the practice of his profession.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically recognizing the importance of medico-legal, ethical and toxicological issues as they relate to the practice of medicine.

8. COMMUNITY MEDICINE

a. Competencies: The undergraduate must demonstrate:

- Understanding of the concept of health and disease,
- Understanding of demography, population dynamics and disease burden in National and global context,
- · Comprehension of principles of health economics and hospital management,
- Understanding of interventions to promote health and prevent diseases as envisioned in National and State Health Programmes.
- Understanding of physical, social, psychological, economic and environmental determinants of health and disease,
- Ability to recognize and manage common health problems including physical, emotional and social aspects at individual family and community level in the context of National Health Programmes,
- Ability to Implement and monitor National Health Programmes in the primary care setting,
- General knowledge about Organ and Tissue donation,
- Knowledge of maternal and child wellness as they apply to national health care priorities and programmes,
- Ability to recognize, investigate, report, plan and manage community health problems including malnutrition and emergencies.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge: At the end of the course the student shall be able

- Explain the principles of sociology including demographic population dynamics.
- Identify social factors related to health, disease and disability in the context of urban and rural societies.
- · Appreciate the impact of urbanization on health and disease.
- Observe and interpret the dynamic of community behaviors.

- Describe the elements of normal psychology and social psychology.
- Observe the principles of practice of medicine in hospital and community settings.
- Describe the health care delivery systems including rehabilitation of the disabled in the country.
- Describe the National Health Programmes with particular emphasis on maternal and child health programmes, family welfare planning and population control.
- · Describe the epidemiological methods and techniques.
- Outline the demographic pattern of the country and appreciate the roles of the individuals, family, community and socio-cultural milieu in health and disease.
- Describe the health information systems.
- Acquire, understand, integrate, apply and manage information in context to health care problems and health care delivery system in various communities, health care settings and hospitals.
- Describe the principles and components of primary health care, National Rural Health
 Mission and the national health policies to achieve the goal of "Health for all" with
 regards to identify the environmental, bio-waste and occupational hazards and their
 control.
- Describe the importance of water and sanitation in human health.
- Describe the principles of health economies, health administration, health education in relation to community.
- Critically analyze the problem (s) and apply his/her knowledge to solve the problem in holistic manner.
- Describe and apply principles of prevention, promotion and maintenance of health.
- e. Skills: At the end of the course, the student shall be able to -
- Use the principles and practice of medicine in hospital and community settings and familiarization with elementary practices.
- Use the Art of communication with patients including history taking and medico social work.

- Use epidemiology as a scientific tool to make rational decisions relevant to community and individual patient intervention.
- Organize health care services for vulnerable and disadvantages groups.
- Organize health care services in case of calamities.
- Collect, analyze, interpret and present simple community and hospital base data.
- Diagnose and manage common health problems (including communicable and noncommunicable diseases) and emergencies at the individual, family and community levels keeping in mind the existing health care resources and in the context of the prevailing socio-culture beliefs.
- Diagnose and manage common nutritional problems at the individual and community level.
- Plan, implement and evaluate a health education Programme with skill to use simple audio-visual aids.
- Interact with other members of the health care team and participate in the organization
 of health care services, health advocacy and implementation of national health
 programmes.
- · Perform Administrative functions at health centers
- · Observe the principles of medical ethics in the practice of his profession.

d. Integration:

Department shall adopt an integrated approach towards other clinical disciplines, public health services, NGOs, environmental sciences, social sciences, management, hospital administration, research, etc. to impart training to enable the graduate to work at all levels of health care. The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to allow the learner to understand the impact of environment, society and national health priorities as they relate to the promotion of health and prevention and cure of disease.

9. OTO-RHINOLARYNGOLOGY (ENT)

- a. Competencies: The learner must demonstrate:
- Knowledge of the common Otorhinolaryngological (ENT) emergencies and problems,
- Ability to recognize, diagnose and manage common ENT emergencies and problems in primary care setting,
- Ability to perform simple ENT procedures as applicable in a primary care setting,
- Ability to recognize hearing impairment and refer to the appropriate hearing impairment rehabilitation programme.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

- . Knowledge: At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:
- Describe the basic pathophysiology of common Ear, Nose & Throat (ENT) diseases & emergencies.
- Adopt the rational use of commonly used drugs keeping in mind their adverse reactions.
- Suggest common investigative procedures & their interpretation.
- e. Skills: At the end of the course the student shall be able to
 - Examination & Diagnose common ENT problems including pre-malignant & Malignant disorders of the Head & Neck.
 - Manage ENT problems at first level of care & be able to refer whenever necessary.
 - Assist / carry out minor ENT procedures like ear syringing, ear dressing, nasal packing.
 - Assist in certain procedures such as tracheotomy, endoscopy & removal of foreign bodies.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in

order to allow the learner to understand the structural basis of ENT problems, their management and correlation with function, rehabilitation and quality of life. The undergraduate training ENT will provide an integrated approach towards other disciplines especially, neurosciences, ophthalmology & general surgery.

10. OPHTHALMOLOGY

- a. Competencies: The student must demonstrate:
- Knowledge of common eye problems in the community
- Recognize, diagnose and manage common eye problems and identify indications for referral,
- Ability to recognize visual impairment and blindness in the community and implement national programmes as applicable in the primary care setting.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

Knowledge: At the end of the course, student shall have the knowledge of

- · Common problems affecting the eye.
- · Principles of management of major ophthalmic emergencies.
- · Main systemic disease affecting the eye.
- Effects of local and systemic diseases on patient's vision and the necessary action required minimizing the sequelae of such diseases.
- Adverse drug reaction with special reference to ophthalmic manifestations.
- · Magnitude of blindness in India and its main causes.
- National programme for control of blindness and its implementation at various levels.
- · Eye care education for prevention of eye problems.
- · Role of primary health center in organization of eye camps.

- Organization of primary health care and the functioning of the ophthalmic assistant.
- Integration of the national programme for control of blindness with the other national health programmes.
- · Eye bank organization.

c. Skills

- Elicit a history pertinent to general health and ocular status.
- Assist in diagnostic procedures such as visual acuity testing, examination of
 eye, Schiotz tonometry, Staining of Corneal pathology, confrontation, perimetry,
 Subjective refraction including correction of Presbyopia and aphakia, direct
 ophthalmoscopy and conjunctival smear examination and Cover test.
- Diagnose and treat common problems affecting the eye.
- · Interpret ophthalmic signs in relation to common systemic disorders.
- Assist/observe therapeutic procedures such as Subconjunctival injection, corneal conjunctival foreign body removal, carbolic cautery for corneal ulcers, Nasolacrimal duct syringing and tarsorrhaphy
- Provide first aid in major ophthalmic emergencies.
- Assist to organize community surveys for visual check-up.
- · Assist to organize primary eye care service through primary health centers.
- Use effective means of communication with the public and individual to motivate for surgery in cataract and for eye donation.
- Establish rapport with his seniors, colleagues and paramedical workers, so as to effectively function as a member of the eye care team.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to allow the student to understand the structural basis of ophthalmologic problems, their management and correlation with function,

rehabilitation and quality of life.

3rd PROFESSIONAL YEAR PART - II

Medicine Allied Subjects:

11. GENERAL MEDICINE

- a. Competencies: The student must demonstrate ability to do the following in relation to common medical problems of the adult in the community:
 - emonstrate understanding of the pathophysiologic basis, epidemiological profile, signs and symptoms of disease and their investigation and management,
 - Competently interview and examine an adult patient and make a clinical diagnosis,
 - Appropriately order and interpret laboratory tests.
 - Initiate appropriate cost-effective treatment based on an understanding of the rational drug prescriptions, medical interventions required and preventive measures,
 - · Follow up of patients with medical problems and refer whenever required,
 - Communicate effectively, educate and counsel the patient and family,
 - · Manage common medical emergencies and refer when required,
 - Independently perform common medical procedures safely and understand patient safety issues.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge: At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:

· Diagnose common clinical disorders with special reference to infectious diseases,

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nutritional disorders, tropical and environmental diseases;

- Outline various modes of management including drug therapeutics especially dosage,
 side effects, toxicity, interactions, indications and contra-indications;
- Propose diagnostic and investigative procedures and ability to interpret them;
- Provide first level management of acute emergencies promptly and efficiently and decide the timing and level of referral, if required;
- · Recognize geriatric disorders and their management.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- Develop clinical skills (history taking, clinical examination and other instruments of examination) to diagnose various common medical disorders and emergencies;
- Refer a patient to secondary and/or tertiary level of health care after having instituted primary care;
- Perform simple routine investigations like hemogram, stool, urine, sputum and biological fluid examinations;
- Assist the common bedside investigative procedure like pleural tap. Lumbar puncture,
 bone marrow aspiration/biopsy and liver biopsy.
- d. Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to provide sound biologic basis and incorporating the principles of general medicine into a holistic and comprehensive approach to the care of the patient. With other relevant academic inputs which provide scientific basis of clinical medicine e.g. anatomy, physiology, biochemistry, microbiology, pathology and pharmacology.

12. PEDIATRICS

- a. Competencies: The student must demonstrate:
- Ability to assess and promote optimal growth, development and nutrition of children and adolescents and identify deviations from normal,
- Ability to recognize and provide emergency and routine ambulatory and First

Level Referral Unit care for neonates, infants, children and adolescents and refer as may be appropriate,

- Ability to perform procedures as indicated for children of all ages in the primary care setting,
- Ability to recognize children with special needs and refer appropriately,
- · Ability to promote health and prevent diseases in children,
- Ability to participate in National Programmes related to child health and in conformation with the Integrated Management of Neonatal and Childhood Illnesses (IMNCI) Strategy,
- · Ability to communicate appropriately and effectively.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge:-At the end of the course, the students shall be able to:-

- Describe the normal Growth and Development during fetal life, Neonatal period,
 Childhood and Adolescence and the deviations thereof.
- Describe the common Pediatric disorders and emergencies in terms of Epidemiology, Etiopathogenesis, Clinical manifestations, Diagnosis and also describe the rational therapy and rehabilitation services.
- Workout age related requirements of calories, nutrients, fluids, dosages of drugs etc. in health and disease.
- Describe preventive strategies for common infectious disorders, Malnutrition, Genetic and Metabolic disorders, Poisonings, Accidents and Child abuse.
- Outline national programs related to child health including Immunization programs.
- c. Skills

At the end of the course, the students shall be able to:-

 Take detailed Pediatric and Neonatal history and conduct an appropriate physical examination of children and neonates, make clinical diagnosis, conduct common bedside investigative procedures, interpret common laboratory investigations, plan and institute therapy.

- Take anthropometric measurements, resuscitate newborn, prepare oral rehydration solution, perform tuberculin test, administer vaccines available under current National programs, perform venesection, start intravenous fluids and provide nasogastric feeding.
- Conduct diagnostic procedures such as lumbar puncture, liver and kidney biopsy, bone marrow aspiration, pleural and ascitic tap.
- Distinguish between normal Newborn babies and those requiring special care and
 institute early care to all newborn babies including care of preterm and low birth
 weight babies, provide correct guidance and counseling about breastfeeding and
 Complementary feeding.
- Provide ambulatory care to all not so sick children, identify indications for specialized/ inpatient care and ensure timely referral to those who require hospitalization.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in orderto provide comprehensive care for neonates, infants, children and adolescents based on a sound knowledge of growth, development, disease and their clinical, social, emotional, psychological correlates in the context of national health priorities.

13. DERMATOLOGY

a. Competencies:

The undergraduate student must demonstrate:

- Understanding of the principles of diagnosis of diseases of the skin, hair, nail and mucosa,
- Ability to recognize, diagnose, order appropriate investigations and treat common diseases of the skin including leprosy in the primary care setting and refer as

appropriate,

- A syndromic approach to the recognition, diagnosis, prevention, counseling, testing and management of common sexually transmitted diseases including HIV based on national health priorities,
- Ability to recognize and treat emergencies including drug reactions and refer as appropriate.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge:

At the end of the course of Dermatology the student shall be able to:

- Demonstrate sound knowledge of common diseases, their clinical manifestations, including emergent situations and of investigative procedures to confirm their diagnosis
- Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of various modes of therapy used in treatment of cutaneous, sexually transmitted diseases and leprosy
- Describe the mode of action of commonly used drugs, their doses, side effects/toxicity,
 indications and contra-indications and interactions
- Describe commonly used modes of management including the medical and surgical procedures available for the treatment of various diseases and to offer a comprehensive plan of management for a given disorder

c. Skills:

The student shall be able to

- Interview the patient, elicit relevant and correct information and describe the history in a chronological order:
- Conduct clinical examination, elicit and interpret physical findings and diagnose common disorders and emergencies.
- Demonstrate simple, routine investigative and laboratory procedures required for making the bed-side diagnosis, especially the examination of scrapings for fungus,

preparation of slit smears and staining for AFB for leprosy patients and for STD cases and take a skin biopsy for diagnostic purposes.

 Manage common diseases and recognizing the need for referral for specialized care, in case of inappropriateness of therapeutic response.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to emphasize the biologic basis of diseases of the skin, sexually transmitted diseases and leprosy

14. PSYCHIATRY

a. Competencies: The student must demonstrate:

Ability to promote mental health and mental hygiene,

- Knowledge of etiology (bio-psycho-social-environmental interactions), clinical features, diagnosis and management of common psychiatric disorders across all ages,
- Ability to recognize and manage common psychological and psychiatric disorders in a primary care setting, institute preliminary treatment in disorders difficult to manage, and refer appropriately,
- Ability to recognize alcohol/ substance abuse disorders and refer them to appropriate centers,
- · Ability to assess risk for suicide and refer appropriately,
- · Ability to recognize temperamental difficulties and personality disorders,
- Assess mental disability and rehabilitate appropriately,
- Understanding of National and State programmes that address mental health and welfare of patients and community.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge:

At the end of the course the student shall be able to:

- Understand the comprehensive nature & development of different aspects of normal human behavior like learning, memory, motivation, personality & intelligence
- · Recognize differences between normal & abnormal behavior
- Classify psychiatric disorders
- Recognize clinical manifestations of the following common syndromes & plan their appropriate management of organic psychosis, functional psychosis, schizophrenia, affective disorders, neurotic disorders, personality disorders, psycho physiological disorders, drug & alcohol dependence, psychiatric disorders of childhood & adolescence
- Describe rational use of different mode of therapy in psychiatric disorders.

c. Skills:

The student shall be able to:

- Interview the patient & understand different methods of communications in patientdoctor relationship
- · Elicit detailed psychiatric case history & conduct clinical examination for assessment of mental status
- · Define, elicit & interpret psychopathological symptoms & signs
- Diagnose & manage common psychiatric disorders
- · Identify & manage common psychological reactions & psychiatric disorders in medical & surgical patients in clinical practice & in community setting

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to allow the student to understand bio-psycho-social-environmental interactions that lead to diseases/ disorders for preventive, promotive, curative, rehabilitative services and medico-legal implications in the care of patients both in family and community.

16. GENERAL SURGERY

a. Competencies:

The student must demonstrate:

- Understanding of the structural and functional basis, principles of diagnosis and management of common surgical problems in adults and children
- Ability to choose, calculate and administer appropriately intravenous fluids, electrolytes, blood and blood products based on the clinical condition
- Ability to apply the principles of asepsis, sterilization, disinfection, rational use of prophylaxis, therapeutic utilities of antibiotics and universal precautions in surgical practice
- Knowledge of common malignancies in India and their prevention, early detection and therapy
- Ability to perform common diagnostic and surgical procedures at the primary carelevel
- Ability to recognize, resuscitate, stabilize and provide Basic & Advanced Life
 Support to patients following trauma
- · General knowledge about organ retrieval from deceased donor and living donor
- Ability to administer informed consent and counsel patient prior to surgical procedures,
- · Commitment to advancement of quality and patient safety in surgical practice.
- b. Broad subject specific objectives.

Knowledge:

At the end of course, the student should be able to:

- Describe actiology, pathophysiology, principles of diagnosis and management of common surgical problems including emergencies in adult and children.
- Define indications and methods for fluid and electrolytes replacement therapy including blood transfusion.
- Define asepsis, disinfection and sterilization and recommend judicious use of antibiotics.
- Describe common malignancies in the country and their management including prevention.
- Enumerate different types of anaesthetic agents, their indications, contraindications, mode of administration, and side effects.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student should be able to:

- Diagnose common surgical conditions both acute and chronic, in adults and children.
- Plan various laboratory tests for surgical conditions and interpret the results.
- Identify and manage patients of hemorrhagic, septicaemia and other types of shock.
- Be able to maintain patent air-way and resuscitate.
- Monitor patient of head, chest, spinal and abdominal injuries, both in adults and children.
- Provide primary care for a patient of burns.
- Acquire principles of operative surgery including preoperative, operative and post operative care and monitoring.
- Treat open wound including preventive measures against tetanus and gas gangrene.

- Diagnose neonatal and pediatric surgical emergencies and provide sound primary care before referring the patient to secondary/tertiary centres.
- Identify congenital anomalies and refer them for appropriate management.
- d. Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to provide a sound biologic basis and a holistic approach to the care of the surgical patient.
 - Apply knowledge of basic medical sciences and other relevant subjects to support understanding of various pathologies, facilitate examination of and intervention for the patients.
 - To apply the principles of quality of health care, legal and ethical principles and regulations as recommended by Medical Council of India and WHO.

17. OBSTETRICS AND GYNAECOLOGY

a. Competencies:

The student must demonstrate ability to:

- Provide peri-conceptional counseling and antenatal care,
- Identify high-risk pregnancies and refer appropriately,
- Conduct normal deliveries, using safe delivery practices in the primary and secondary care settings,
- Prescribe drugs safely and appropriately in pregnancy and lactation.
- Diagnose complications of labor, institute primary care and refer in a timely manner,
- Perform early neonatal resuscitation,
- Provide postnatal care, including education in breast-feeding,
- Counsel and support couples in the correct choice of

contraception,

- Interpret test results of laboratory and radiological investigations as they apply to the care of the obstetric patient,
- Apply medico-legal principles as they apply to tubectomy, Medical Termination of Pregnancy (MTP), Pre-conception and Prenatal Diagnostic Techniques (PC PNDT Act) and other related Acts.
- Elicit a gynecologic history, perform appropriate physical and pelvic examinations and PAP smear in the primary care setting,
- Recognize, diagnose and manage common reproductive tract infections in the primary care setting,
- Recognize and diagnose common genital cancers and refer them appropriately.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

Knowledge

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:

- Outline the anatomy, physiology and pathophysiology of the reproductive system and the common conditions affecting it.
- Diagnose normal pregnancy, labour, puerperium and manage the problems he is likely to encounter therein.
- List of leading causes of maternal and perinatal morbidity and mortality.
- Understand the principles of contraception and various techniques employed, methods
 of medical termination of pregnancy, sterilization and their complications.
- Identify the use, abuse and side effects of drugs in pregnancy, peri- menopausal and post menopausal periods.
- Describe the national programme of maternal and child health and family welfare and their implementation at various levels.

- · Identify common gynecological diseases and describe principles of their management.
- State the indications, techniques and complications of surgeries like Caesarian section,
 laparotomy, abdominal and vaginal hysterectomy, Fothergill's operation and vacuum
- Aspiration for Medical Termination of pregnancy (MTP) and minor surgeries like EB, D and C, Cervical Biopsy and Cervical encirclage.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student should be able to

- · Take proper history and writing a good case sheet
- Writing a good discharge summary, proper referral letter
- · Examination of patient and arrival at a diagnosis
- · Planning for investigation and treatment
- Community orientation, participation in community health promoting and preventing programmes
- Examine a pregnant woman, recognize high- risk pregnancies and make appropriate referrals.
- Conduct a normal delivery, plot and interprete partogram-
- · recognize complications and decision of referral, provide postnatal care,
- Resuscitate the newborn and recognize the congenital anomalies.
- Advise a couple on the use of various available contraceptive devices (student should see at least 5 Cu-T insertions and 5 cases of female sterilization operations.)
- Perform pelvic examination, diagnose and manage common, gynecological problems including early detection of genital malignancies.
- Make a vaginal cytological smear, perform a post coital test and wet vaginal smear examination for Trichomonas vaginalis, Moniliasis and gram stain for gonorrhea, catheterization of urinary bladder
- Interpretation of data of investigations like biochemical, histopathological, radiological ultrasound etc.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order

to provide comprehensive care for women in their reproductive years and beyond, based on a sound knowledge of structure, functions and disease and their clinical, social, emotional, psychological correlates in the context of national health priorities. The student shall be able to integrate clinical skills with other disciplines and bring about coordination of family welfare programme for the national goal of population control.

18. ORTHOPAEDICS (INCLUDING TRAUMA)

a. Competencies:

- The student must demonstrate:
- Ability to recognize and assess bone injuries, dislocation and poly-trauma and provide first contact care prior to appropriate referral,
- Knowledge of the medico-legal aspects of trauma,
- Ability to recognize and manage common infections of bone and joints in the primary care setting,
- Recognize common congenital, metabolic, neoplastic, degenerative and inflammatory bone diseases and refer appropriately,
- Ability to perform simple orthopedic techniques as applicable to a primary care setting,
- Ability to recommend rehabilitative services for common orthopaedic problems across all ages.

b. Broad subject specific objectives

Knowledge:

The student shall be able to understand:

 The principles, diagnosis and primary management and be able to give appropriate referral for further definitive management of bones and joint injuries. Osteogenesis, manifestation and diagnosis, primary management and give their referral
for appropriate correction or rehabilitation of common musculoskeletal disorders
including infections of bones and joints; congenital skeletal anomalies, metabolic bone
diseases and neoplasm affecting bones.

c. Skills

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:

- · Detect soft tissue injuries such as sprains and strains.
- · Detect common fractures of extremities.
- · Deliver first aid measures for common fractures and sprains.
- · Deliver emergency measures to poly trauma patients.
- · Manage uncomplicated fractures of clavicle, forearm, phalanges etc.
- Use techniques of splinting such as application of Thomas splint, plaster slab and casts, immobilization by skin tractions etc.
- Learn indications for closed reductions, open reductions, internal fixation and external fixations of fracture.
- Manage common bone infection; learn indications for sequestration, amputation and corrective measures for bone deformities.
- Advice and counsel patient for rehabilitation for post traumatic, poliomyelitis, cerebral
 palsy and amputation.
- Be able to perform certain orthopedic skills, provide sound advice of skeletal and related conditions at primary or secondary health care level.

d. Integration:

The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to allow the student to understand the structural basis of orthopedic problems, their management and correlation with function, rehabilitation and quality of life.

19. ANAESTHESIOLOGY

a. Competencies:

The student must demonstrate ability to:

- Describe and discuss the pre-operative evaluation, assessing fitness for surgery and the modifications in medications in relation to anesthesia /surgery,
- Describe and discuss the roles of Anesthesiologist as a perioperative physician including pre-medication, endotracheal intubation, general
 anesthesia and recovery (including variations in recovery from anesthesia and
 anaesthetic complications).
- Describe and discuss the management of acute and chronic pain, including labour analgesia,
- Demonstrate awareness about the maintenance of airway in children and adults in various situations,
- Demonstrate the awareness about the indications, selection of cases and execution of cardio-pulmonary
- Resuscitation in emergencies and in the intensive care and high dependency units,
- Choose cases for local / regional anesthesia and demonstrate the ability to administer the same,
- Discuss the implications and obtain informed consent for various procedures and to maintain the documents.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge:

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- . Know of simple nerve block and pain relief
- · Awareness of the principles of administration of general, regional and local anesthesia.

- Know importance of hypoglycemia/hyperglycemia, hypotension/hypertension, IHD,
 Myocardial infarction.
- · Know ventilators.

c. Skills

At the end of the training, the students should be able to:

- Perform cardio-pulmonary resuscitation with the available resources and transfer the
 patients to a bigger hospital for advanced life support.
- Set up intravenous infusion and manage fluid therapy
- · Clear and maintain airway in unconscious patient.
- · Administer oxygen correctly
- General knowledge about diagnosis of brain death and relevance in deceased donor organ transplantation
- d. Integration: The teaching should be aligned and integrated horizontally and vertically in order to provide comprehensive care for patients undergoing various surgeries, in patients with pain, in intensive care and in cardio respiratory emergencies. Integration with the departments of Anatomy, Pharmacology and horizontal integration with any/all surgical specialties is proposed.

20. RADIODIAGNOSIS

- a. Competencies: The student must demonstrate:
- Understanding of indications for various radiological investigations in common clinical practice,
- Awareness of the ill effects of radiation and various radiation protective measures to be employed,

Ability to identify abnormalities in common radiological investigations.

b. Broad subject specific objectives:

Knowledge:

At the end of the course, the student shall be able to

- · Enlist and describe the various diagnostic modalities
- Delineate normal and abnormal radiological findings.
- · Understand basic radiology and emphasize on its clinical applications
- Describe radiographic, ultra sonographic, CT, MRI features of common pathologies.
- Describe and integrate radiological findings in CNS, GIT, RS, CVS, MSK, GUT

d. Skills

- . At the end of the course, the student shall be able to:
- Make use of Imaging findings to reach to a diagnosis;
- Analysis and interpret radiological data;
- Demonstrate the skills of solving clinical problems by illustrative evidences and decision making.
- e. Integration: Horizontal and vertical integration to understand the fundamental principles of radiologic imaging, anatomic correlation and their application in diagnosis and therapy.

B. PHASE WISE TRAINING AND TIME DISTRIBUTION FOR PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Competency based Undergraduate Curriculum and Attitude, Ethics and Communication (AETCOM) course, as published by the Medical Council of India and also made available on the Council's website, shall be the curriculum for the batches admitted in MBBS from the academic year 2019-20 onwards.

In order to ensure that training is in alignment with the goals and competencies required for a medical graduate, there shall be a Foundation Course_to orient medical learners to MBBS programme, and provide them with requisite knowledge, communication (including electronic), technical and language skills.

I. Training period and time distribution:

Universities shall organize admission timing and admission process in such a way that teaching in the first Professional year commences with induction through the Foundation Course by the 1st of August of each year from academic year 2024-25. There shall be no admission of students in respect of any academic session beyond 30st August from academic year 2024-25. The Universities shall not register any student admitted beyond the said date. The National Medical Commission may direct, that any student identified as having Obtained admission after the last date for closure of admission be discharged from the Course of study, or any medical qualification granted to such a student shall not be a recognized qualification by National Medical Commission.

The institution which grants admission to any student after the last date specified from the same shall also be liable to face such action as may be prescribed by National Medical Commission.

Every learner shall undergo a period of certified study extending over 4 ½ academic years, divided into four professional years from the date of commencement of course to the date of completion of examination which shall be followed by one year of compulsory rotating internship.

Each academic year will have at least 39 teaching weeks with a minimum of eight hours of working on each day including one hour as lunch break.

Didactic lectures shall not exceed one third of the schedule; two third of the schedule shall include interactive sessions, practicals, clinical or/and group discussions. The learning process should include clinical experiences, problem- oriented approach, case studies and community health care activities.

Teaching and learning shall be aligned and integrated across specialties both vertically and horizontally for better learner comprehension. Learner centered learning methods should include Early Clinical Exposure, problem-oriented learning, case studies, community- oriented learning, self- directed, experiential learning& Electives

At the end of each professional year university examination will be conducted. If any student fails to clear university examination, he will appear in supplementary examination.

Supplementary examinations and declaration of results shall be processed within 3-6 weeks from the date of declaration of the results of the main examination forevery professional year, so that the candidates, who pass, can join the main batch for progression.

If the candidate fails in the supplementary examination of first MBBS, he shall join the batch of next academic /subsequent year. There shall be no supplementary batches. Partial attendance of examination in any subject shall be counted as an attempt.

- A candidate, who fails in the First Professional examination, shall not be allowed to join the Second Professional.
- A candidate, who fails in the second Professional examination, shall be allowed to join the third Professional Part I training, however he shall not be allowed to appear for the examination unless he has passed second professional examination.
- · A candidate who fails in the third Professional (Part I) examination shall be

allowed to join third Professional part II training, however he shall not be allowed to appear for the examination unless he has passed second professional examination.

II. The period of 41/2 years is divided as follows:

Phase I - Total 12 months

i) First Professional phase of 12 months including Foundation Course of one week and university exams. It shall consist of – Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Introduction to Community Medicine, Humanities, Professional development including Attitude, Ethics & Communication (AETCOM) module, family adoption programme through village outreach where-in each student shall adopt minimum of three (03) families and preferably at least five (05) families, Pandemic module and early clinical exposure, ensuring alignment & all types of integration and simulation-based learning.

Phase II- Second Professional (12 months) including university exams. It will consist of Pathology, Pharmacology, Microbiology, family visit under Community Medicine, General Surgery, General Medicine & Obstetrics & Gynecology Professional development including AETCOM module, simulation-based learning and introduction to clinical subjects ensuring both alignment & all types of integration.

The clinical exposure to learners will be in the form of learner-doctor method of clinical training in all phases. The emphasis will be on primary, preventive and comprehensive health care. A part of training during clinical postings should take place at the *primary level* of health care. It is desirable to provide learning experiences in secondary health care, wherever possible, This will involve:

- Experience in recognizing and managing common problems seen in outpatient, inpatient and emergency settings,
- · Involvement in patient care as a team member,
- Involvement in patient management and performance of basic procedures.

iii) Phase III - 30 months

a. Third Professional Part I (12 months, including University exams)

Forensic Medicine and Toxicology, Community Medicine, Medicine & allied, Surgery & allied, Pediatrics and Obstetric & Gynecology including AETCOM, Pandemic module, Clinical teaching in General Medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics & Gynecology, Pediatrics, Orthopedics, Dermatology, Community Medicine, Psychiatry, Respiratory Medicine, Radio-diagnosis (& Radiotherapy) and Anesthesiology & Professional development.

b. Electives (1 month) shall be included here. These will be in 2 blocks of 15 days each in Final first; 1st block after annual exam of III MBBS part 1 and 2st block after the end of 1st elective.

c. Third Professional Part II (18 months, including University exam)-

Subjects include:

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III. Distribution of teaching hours phase wise

a. First, second and third Professional part-I, teaching hours:

Time allotted: 12 months (approx. 52weeks)

Time available: Approx. 39 weeks (excluding 13 weeks) (39 hours/ week)

Prelim / University Exam & Results: 9 weeks

Vacation: 2 weeks

Public Holidays: 2 weeks

Time distribution in weeks: 39 weeks x 39 hours = 1521 hours for Teaching-Learning

b. Final MBBS part-2, teaching hours:

Time allotted: 18 months (approx. 78 weeks)

Time available: Approx. 62 weeks (excluding 16 weeks) (39 hours/ week)

Prelim / University Exam & Results: 10 weeks

Vacation: 3 weeks

Public Holidays: 3 weeks

Time distribution in weeks: 62 x 39 hrs = 2418 hrs available for Teaching-Learning

(Clinical Postings: 15 hours/ week II MBBS onwards included in academic schedule)

These are attached in sperate annexure with all relevant tables.

Academic calender shall be as per the Table 1.

Distribution of subjects for Professional Phase - wise training is given in Table 2.

Minimum teaching hours prescribed in various disciplines are given in Tables 3-7.

Distribution and duration of clinical postings is given in Table 8.

Time allotted excludes time reserved for internal /University examinations, and vacation.

Second professional clinical postings shall commence before / after declaration of results of the first professional phase examinations, as decided by the institution/ University.

Third Professional parts I and part II clinical postings shall start no later than two weeks after the completion of the previous professional examination.

A total of 25% of allotted time of third Professional shall be utilized for integrated learning with phase I and II subjects. This will be included in the assessment of clinical subjects.

Note

- The period of training is minimum suggested. Adjustments where required depending on availability of time may be made by the concerned college/ institution. This period of training does not include university examination period.
- An exposure to skills lab for at least two (02) weeks prior to clinical postings shall be made available to all student.

C) New teaching /learning elements

1) Foundation Course

Goal: The goal of the Foundation Course is to prepare a learner to study medicine effectively.

Objectives:

- (a) Orient the learner to:
- The medical profession and the physician's role in society
- The MBBS programme
- Alternate health systems i.e. AYUSH in India and history of Medicine
- Medical ethics, attitudes and professionalism
- Health care system and its delivery
- National health programmes and policies
- Universal precautions and vaccinations
- Patient safety and biohazard safety
- Principles of primary care(general and community based care)
- The academic ambience
- (b) Enable the learner to acquire enhanced skills in:
- Language
- Interpersonal relationships

- Communication
- Learning including self-directed learning
- Time management
- Stress management
- Use of information technology, and artificial intelligence
- (c) Train the learner to provide:
 - First-aid
- Basic life support
- In addition to the above, learners maybe enrolled in one of the following programmes which will be run concurrently:
- Local language programme
- English language programme
- Computer skills
- These may be done in the last two hours of the day. These sessions must be as interactive as possible.

Sports (to be used through the Foundation Course as protected 04 hours /week).

Leisure and extracurricular activity (to be used through the Foundation Course as projected 02 hours per week).

Institutions shall develop learning modules and identify the appropriate resource persons for their delivery.

The time committed for the Foundation Course may not be used for any other curricular activity.

The Foundation Course shall have a minimum of 75% attendance of all students mandatorily. This will be certified by the Dean of the college.

The Foundation Course shall be organized by the Coordinator appointed by the Dean

of the college and shall be under supervision of the Heads of MBBS phase I departments.

Every college shall arrange for a meeting with parents/ wards of all students and records of the same shall be made available to UGMEB of NMC.

2) Early Clinical Exposure

Objectives: The objectives of early clinical exposure of the first-year medical learners are to enable the learner to:

- Recognize the relevance of basic sciences in diagnosis, patient care and management,
- Provide a context that will enhance basic science learning,
- Relate to experience of patients as a motivation to learn,
- Recognize attitude, ethics and professionalism as integral to doctor-Patient relationship.
- Understand the socio-cultural context of disease through the study of humanities.

Elements

- Basic science correlation: i.e. apply and correlate principles of basic sciences as they relate to patient care (this shall be part of integrated modules).
- Clinical skills: to include basic skills in interviewing patients, doctorpatient communication, ethics and professionalism, critical thinking and analysis and self-learning (this training shall be imparted in the time allotted for early clinical exposure).
- Humanities: To introduce learners to a broader understanding of the socio-economic framework and cultural context within which health is delivered through the study of humanities and social sciences.

3) Electives

Objectives: To provide the learner with opportunities:

- · For diverse learning experiences,
- It is mandatory for learners to do an elective. The elective time shall not be used to make up for missed clinical postings, shortage of attendance or other purposes.
- Institutions will pre-determine the number and nature of
 electives, names of the supervisors, and the number of learners in each
 elective based on the local conditions, available resources and faculty.
- Electives on topics in areas such as Research methodology, Use of Artificial
 intelligence and computers in Health and Medical Education, Health Management, Health
 economics, Indian system of medicine, Medical photography /clinical photography, Global
 health, Evidence based medicine, Art and music in medicine, Literary activities, etc. may be
 provided by the college/ institution.
 - It shall be preferable that elective choices are made available to
 the learners in the beginning of the academic year.
 - The learner must submit a learning log book based on both blocks of the electives.
 - 75% attendance in the electives and submission of log book maintained during electives is required for eligibility to appear in the final MBBS examination/ NEXT.
 - Institutions may use part of this time for strengthening basic skill certification.
- 4) Professional Development including Attitude, Ethics and Communication Module
 (AETCOM)

Objectives of the programme: At the end of the programme, the learner must demonstrate ability to:

- Understand and apply principles of bioethics and law as they
 apply to medical practice and research, understand and apply the principles of
 clinical reasoning as they apply to the care of the patients,
- Understand and apply the principles of system-based care as they relate to the care of the patient,
- Understand and apply empathy and other human values to the care of the patient,
- Communicate effectively with patients, families, colleagues and other health care professionals,
- Understand the strengths and limitations of alternative systems of medicine.
- Respond to events and issues in a professional, considerate and humane fashion.
- Translate learning from the humanities in order to further his professional and personal growth.

Learning experiences:

- This will be a longitudinal programme spread across the continuum of the MBBS programme including internship,
- Learning experiences shall include small group discussions,
 patient care scenarios, workshops, seminars, role plays, lectures etc.
- Attitude, Ethics & Communication Module (AETCOM module) developed by the erstwhile Medical Council of India should be used longitudinally for purposes of instruction.
- 75% attendance in Professional Development Programme (AETCOM Module) shall be mandatory for eligibility to appear for final examination in each professional year.

Internal Assessment shall include:

Written tests comprising of short notes and creative writing experiences,

OSCE based clinical scenarios /viva voce.

- At least one question in each paper of each clinical specialty in the University examination shall test knowledge competencies acquired during the professional development programme.
- Skill competencies acquired during the Professional Development
 Programme must be tested during the clinical, practical and viva voce.

5) Learner-doctor method of clinical training (Clinical Clerkship)

- a. Goal: To provide learners with experience in:
- Longitudinal patient care,
- Being part of the health care team,
- Hands-on care of patients in outpatient and in-patient setting.

b. Structure:

- The first clinical posting in second professional shall orient learners to the patient, their roles and the specialty.
- The learner-doctor programme shall progress as outlined in Table 9.
- The learner shall function as a part of the health care team with the following responsibilities:
 - o Be a part of the units' out-patient services on admission days,
 - Remain with the admission unit until at least 6 PM except during designated class hours.
 - Be assigned patients admitted during each admission day for whom he will undertake responsibility, under the supervision of a senior resident or faculty member,

- Participate in the unit rounds on its admission day and will present the assigned patients to the supervising physician,
- Follow the patient's progress throughout the hospital stay until discharge,
- Participate, under supervision, in procedures, surgeries, deliveries etc.
 of assigned patients,
- Participate in unit rounds on at least one other day of the week excluding the admission day,
- · Discuss ethical and other humanitarian issues during unit rounds,
- Attend all scheduled classes and educational activities,
- Document his observations in a prescribed log book /case record.

No learner will be given independent charge of the patient in the capacity of primary physician of the concerned patient.

The supervising physician shall be-responsible for all patient care decisions and guide the learner from time to time as required.

6) Assessment:

- A designated faculty member in each unit will coordinate and facilitate the activities of the learner, monitor progress, provide feedback and review the log book/ case record.
- The log book/ case record must include the written case record prepared by the learner including relevant investigations, treatment and its rationale, hospital course, family and patient discussions, discharge summary etc.
- The log book shall also include records of outpatients assigned.
 Submission of the log book/ case record to the department is required for eligibility to appear for the final examination of the subject.

D) Assessment

I. Eligibility to appear for Professional examinations

The performance in essential components of training are to be assessed, based on:

(a) Attendance

- There shall be a minimum of 75% attendance in theory and 80% in practical /clinical for eligibility to appear for the examinations in that subject. In subjects that are taught in more than one phase – the learner must have 75% attendance in theory and 80% in practical in each phase of instruction in that subject. There shall be minimum of 80% attendance in family visits under Family adoption programme. Each student shall adopt minimum 3 families and preferably five families. The details shall be as per Family Adoption Program guidelines.
 - If an examination comprises more than one subject (for e.g., General Surgery and allied branches), the candidate must have a minimum of 75% attendance in each subject including its allied branches, and 80% attendance in each clinical posting.
 - Learners who do not have at least 75% attendance in the electives will not be eligible for the Third Professional Part II examination/ NEXT.
- (b) Internal Assessment: Internal assessment shall be based on day-to-day assessment. It shall relate to different ways in which learners participate in learning process including assignments, preparation for seminar, clinical case presentation, preparation of clinical case for discussion, clinical case study/ problem solving exercise, participation in project for health care in the community. Internal assessment shall not be added to summative assessment. However, internal assessment should be displayed under a separate column in detailed marks card.
- (c) Learners must have completed the required certifiable competencies for that phase of training and completed the log book

appropriate for that phase of training to be eligible for appearing at the final university examination of that subject.

- (d) Regular periodic examinations shall be conducted throughout the course. There shall be no less than three internal assessment examinations in each subject of first and second professional year, and no less than two examinations in each subject of final professional year. An end of posting clinical assessment shall be conducted for each clinical posting in each professional year.
- When subjects are taught in more than one phase, the internal assessment must be done in each phase and must contribute proportionately to final assessment.
 For example, General Medicine must be assessed in second Professional, third Professional Part I and third Professional Part II, independently.
- Day to day records and log book (including required skill certifications) should be given importance in internal assessment. Internal assessment should be based on competencies and skills.
- The final internal assessment in a broad clinical specialty (e.g., Surgery and allied specialties etc.) shall comprise of marks from all the constituent specialties. The proportion of the marks for each constituent specialty shall be determined by the time of instruction allotted to each.
- Learners must secure at least 50% marks of the total marks (combined in theory and practical / clinical; not less than 40% marks in theory and practical separately) for internal assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible for appearing at the final University examination of that subject. Internal assessment marks will reflect as separate head of passing at the summative examination.
- The results of internal assessment should be displayed on the notice board within one week of the test.
- Universities shall guide the colleges regarding formulating policies for remedial measures for students who are either not able to score qualifying marks or have missed on some assessments due to any reason.

II. University Examinations:

University examinations are to be designed with a view to ascertain whether the candidate has acquired the necessary knowledge, minimal level of skills, ethical and professional values with clear concepts of the fundamentals which are necessary for him/her to function effectively and appropriately as a physician of first contact.

Assessment shall be carried out on an objective basis to the extent possible.

- Nature of questions shall include different types such as structured assays (Long-Answer Questions -LAQ), Short-Answer Questions (SAQ) and objective type questions (e.g. Multiple Choice Questions MCQ). Marks for each part shall be indicated separately. MCQs shall be accorded a weightage of not more than 20% of the total theory marks. Practical /clinical examinations shall be conducted in the laboratories and /or hospital wards. The objective will be to assess proficiency and skills to conduct experiments, interpret data and form logical conclusion. Clinical cases kept in the examination must be common conditions that the learner may encounter as a physician of first contact in the community. Selection of rare syndromes and disorders as examination cases is to be discouraged. Emphasis should be on candidate's capability to elicit history, demonstrate physical signs, write a case record, analyze the case and develop a management plan.
- Viva/oral examination should assess approach to patient management, emergencies, and attitudinal, ethical and professional values. Candidate's skill in interpretation of common investigative data, X-rays, identification of specimens, ECG, etc. is to be also assessed.

University Examinations shall be held as under:

(a) First Professional

The first Professional examination shall be held at the end of first Professional training (in the 12th month of that training), in the subjects of Anatomy, Physiology and Biochemistry.

(b) Second Professional

The second Professional examination shall be held at the end of second

professional training (12th month of that training), in the subjects of Pathology, Microbiology, and Pharmacology.

(c) Third Professional

- Third Professional Part I examination shall be held at end of third Professional part 1 of training (12th month of that training) in the subjects of Community Medicine, and Forensic Medicine including Toxicology
- Third Professional Part II / National Exit Test (NExT) as per NExT regulations- (Final Professional) examination shall be at the end of 17th / 18th month of that training, in the subjects of General Medicine, General Surgery, Ophthalmology, Otorhinolaryngology, Obstetrics & Gynecology, and Pediatrics, and allied subjects as per NExT REGULATIONS.

Note:

- At least one question in each paper of each PHASE shall test the knowledge, and competencies acquired during the professional development programme (AETCOM module).
- Skills competencies acquired during the Professional Development

 Programme (AETCOM module) shall be tested during clinical, practical and

viva.

In subjects that have two papers, the learner must secure minimum 50% of marks in aggregate (both papers together) to pass in the said subject.

Criteria for passing in a subject: A candidate shall obtain 50% marks in University conducted examination separately in Theory and in Practical (practical includes: practical/ clinical and viva voce) in order to be declared as passed in that subject.

Appointment of Examiners

 Person appointed as an examiner in the particular subject must have at least four years of total teaching experience as Assistant Professor after obtaining postgraduate degree following MBBS, in the subject in a college affiliated to a recognized medical college (by UGMEB of NMC).

- For Practical /Clinical examinations, there shall be at least four examiners
 for every learner, out of whom not less than 50% must be external
 examiners. Of the four examiners, the senior-most internal examiner shall
 act as the Chairman and coordinator of the whole examination programme
 so that uniformity in the matter of assessment of candidates is maintained.
- A University having more than one college shall have separate sets of examiners for each college, with internal examiners from the concerned college. External examiner may be from outside the college/ university/ state/ union territory.
- There shall be a Chairman of the Board of paper-setters who shall be an internal examiner and shall moderate the questions.
- All eligible examiners with requisite qualifications and experience can be appointed internal examiners by rotation in their subjects.
- All theory paper assessment should be done as central assessment program (CAP) of concerned university.
- Internal examiners shall be appointed from the same institution for unitary
 examination in the same institution. For pooled examinations at one centre,
 the approved internal examiners from same university may be appointed.
- The Examiners for General Surgery and allied subjects as well as for General Medicine and allied subjects, shall be from General Surgery and General Medicine respectively.
- There shall be no grace marks to be considered for passing in an examination.

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

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CURRICULUM FOR FAMILY ADOPTION PROGRAMME

FAMILY ADOPTION PROGRAM:

This is being introduced with the aim of village outreach program for MBBS students. Every student shall ideally adopt 5(five) families. However, minimum 3(three) families are mandatorily to be adopted by every MBBS students. Every college may arrange one diagnostic medical camp in the village wherein identification of:

- a) anaemia, malnutrition in children, hypertension, diabetes mellitus, ischemic heart diseases, kidney diseases, any other local problems may be addressed.
- b) If required, patients shall be admitted in the hospital for acute illness under care of student, charges may be waived off or provide concession or govt, schemes.
- c) For chronic illness, students shall be involved.
- d) Subsidized treatment charges may be provided under govt. schemes or welfare schemes.
- e) Medical student may be allocated about 5 families and introduced in the first visit.
- f) Camps may be arranged by Dean and Community Medicine/ P.S.M. department with active involvement of Associate/ Asst. Professors, social worker and supporting staff. Local population may be involved with village leaders.
- g) Visit by students be made to the visit as mentioned in table below. Annual follow up diagnostic camp can be continued by the PSM department.

TARGETS TO BE ACHIEVED BY STUDENTS:

First Professional Year:

- a) Learning communication skills and inspire confidence amongst families
- b) Understand the dynamics of rural set-up of that region
- Screening programs and education about ongoing government sponsored health related programs
- d) Learn to analyse the data collected from their families
- e) Identify diseases/ ill-health/ malnutrition of allotted families and try to improve the standards

Second Professional Year

- a) Inspire active participation of community through families allotted
- b) Continue active involvement to become the first doctor /reference point of the family by continued active interaction
- c) Start compiling the outcome targets achieved

Third Professional Year

Analysis of their involvement and impact on existing socio-politico-economic dynamics in addition to improvement in health conditions

-Final visit to have last round of active interaction with families -prepare a report to be submitted to department addressing:

- 1) improvement in general health
- 2) Immunization
- 3) Sanitation,
- 4) De-addiction
- Whether healthy lifestyles like reading good books, sports/ yoga activities have been inculcated in the house-holds.
- 6) Improvement in anaemia, tuberculosis control
- 7) Sanitation awareness
- 8) Any other issues
- Role of the student in supporting family during illness medical emergency
- 10) Social responsibility in the form of environment protection programme in form of plantation drive (medicinal plants trees), cleanliness and sanitation drives with the initiative of the medical student

To confirm the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in having allowed the amended Statutes/Regulations/Guidelines for Admission to various Master Degree and PG Diploma Programmes of study offered in the Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu, Main Campus/Offsite Campuses and Affiliated Colleges for the Academic Session 2023-24 and onwards.

NOTE:

The Academic Council in its meeting held on July 19, 2023 vide Resolution No. 3.28 amended the Mode Of Admissions to the various Post Graduate Programmes (Master Degree/ Diploma) of study of the University of Jammu running in its Main/ Offsite Campuses and Affiliated PG Colleges.

As resolved by the Academic Council the Admission to the various programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University of Jammu, Main Campus/ Offsite Campuses and Affiliated Colleges were made on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG), conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA), by the Admission-Cum-Counselling Committee of the Department. 100 % weightage was given to the CUET-PG Score with a condition that the candidate must have the basic eligibility.

In case, seats remain vacant after exhausting the entire merit list of CUET-PG the same were filled up on the basis of the Academic Merit of the Qualifying Examination.

In light of the above the Statutes/Regulations/Guidelines Governing Admission to various Master Degree & PG Diploma Programmes of study (Annexure) were amended and approved by the Vice-chancellor for the Academic Session 2023-24 and onwards in anticipation of the approval of the Competent Bodies.

Hence, the action taken is reported for confirmation.

ABOUT UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU

Recognized as one of the premier institutions of the country, the University of Jammu, accredited as 'A+' Grade University by National Assessment and Accreditation Council of India (NAAC), ranked 63rd in University category under NIRF-2023, University of Jammu has also been granted autonomy by the UGC and in terms of this graded autonomy is Category-I University. It came into existence in 1969 vide Kashmir and Jammu Universities Act 1969 following bifurcation of the erstwhile University of Jammu and Kashmir by an ordinance promulgated by the Governor on September 5, 1969 and was subsequently adopted as an Act of the State Legislature.

Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor of the J&K Union Territory, is the Chancellor of the University. Apart from its main campus, old campus in Jammu, the University has eleven (11) Offsite Campuses, out of which seven (07) campuses located at Bhaderwah, Kathua, Kishtwar, Poonch, Ramnagar, Reasi and Udhampur are functional. Teaching-learning and research are being carried out by more than 50 Teaching Departments in the Main Campus of the University. There are about 170 affiliated Colleges, awarding Degree/ Diploma in more than sixty (60) programmes at the Post Graduate and Under Graduate Level.

The main campus is at Bahu Wall Rakh with an area of 118.78 acres, houses the Teaching Departments, Centres, Administration Block, Examination Wing, College Development Council, Department of Students Welfare, Directorate of Distance & Online Education, Dhanvantri Library, Computer Centre, Health Centre, Guest House, Post Office, J&K Bank, Gymnasium, Hostels, Cafeteria and Canteens, Residential Quarters and many other facilities. The second campus of the University (the old campus), located at a distance of 4 km from the main campus, is spread over 10.5 acres and currently houses a hostel for boys and residential quarters for teaching and non-teaching employees. The University is truly treading the path of growth which is reflected in the developments over the past more than fifty years.

Introduction of new courses and self-financing programmes, establishment of new campuses, increase in the number of affiliated colleges, use of information Communication Technology (ICT), impetus to research, collaborations and infrastructural developments are the initiatives taken in the recent years.

University of Jammu introduced NEP 2020 w.e.f academic session 2022-23 in its UG programmes at all its affiliated Colleges. Student enrolment number of University of Jammu in the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) portal uptil now is twenty one thousand plus. Degree certificates of students shall be uploaded in the NAD Depository. Henceforth inline with the National Education Policy 2020. Furthermore, to comply with UGC guidelines, the university has also registered on Digi-locker for sharing all academic credentials. Data collection is underway for uploading academic marks of students.

COLLEGE ON WHEELS

"College on Wheels- J&K Gyanodaya Express," is a pioneering Educational endeavor and the first of its kind in Jammu & Kashmir. This unique initiative aims to redefine education, effectively dissolving boundaries and reshaping the world into a boundless university. The goal is to facilitate the students' inner passion and life's purpose through immersive, collaborative, project-based learning experiences to address real world challenges. The ultimate aspiration is to cultivate a culture idea incubation, innovation and skill development in alignment with National Education Policy 2020, where our hon'ble Prime Minister has envisaged a paradigm shift from job seekers to job creators.

The University of Jammu, University of Kashmir, Cluster University of Jammu, Cluster University of Kashmir, Shri Mata Vaishno Devi University, Baba Ghulam Shah Badshah University and Islamic University of Science and Technology are participating in the 14 days journey in the month of November. Around 800 female students shall take part in the event in groups of 5-8 students in each groups along with a mentor. The selection of students for this event shall be based on the project submitted to the respective institution. During the journey the train will cover the destinations namely viz:- Delhi, (Ahmedabad, Mumbai, Goa, Bengaluru and Wardha. The students will undertake the projects of trains-disciplinary nature which have an impact on society. A library and robotic lab. facility will be available during the journey inside the train.

UTSAAH Clubs

Utsaah is a cluster of twelve Clubs established in the University of Jammu for the holistic development of all stakeholders on 25-01-2023. The clubs have been established keeping in view the rapid change in the knowledge landscape, employment landscape and global ecosystem of 21st Century. Our New Education Policy also calls for the critical change in our education ecosystem. The focus is towards creative and critical thinking rather than the content. As the students need to be prepared to innovate adapt, and absorb new material in novel and changing fields, the pedagogy must also evolve to make the landscape of academics more experiential, holistic, integrated, learner-centric flexible and of course, enjoyable. The clubs provide our students this extra space beyond structured classroom teaching to explore their passion outside their regular studies and collaborate and learn as part of a community that is bound together by shared interests. These clubs are a place of friendship, personal growth, career development and the University inclusiveness. CENTRAL FACILITIES

CENTRAL LIBRARY

The Central Library of the University, the "Dhanvantri Library" is housed in a three storied building constructed over an area of 60,000 sq.ft. It has a nich collection of books, journals and periodicals, manuscripts, dissertations, thesis etc. which cater to the varied academic and research needs of the users. The library has large reading halls and compact stack areas with open access. About 750 students can be accommodated in the reading area of the library. Most of the functions of the library have been computerized. RIFD technology is being used for security purpose. For efficient and easy retrieval of bibliographic information from the vast collection of the Library, OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue Service) has efficiently been placed in the Dhanvantri Library for the readers. Access of EDUSAT is provided to the students, research scholars and faculty members.

HEALTH CENTRE

A First Aid Centre was initially established in the premises of the boys' hostels of the University managed by a part-time medical assistant. Later, the First Aid Centre was upgraded to a full-fledged Health Centre to provide medical aid benefits to the University community and the dependents of the University employees. The Health Centre has grown manifold over the years. The facilities provided are OPD level treatment; Emergency Service; Dental Facility; Physiotherapy; Ultrasound; ECG Facility; Clinical Laboratory; Ambulance service; Immunization Camps with DHS and other organizations; Awareness camps on AIDS and Population Control in collaboration with Departmental of Lifelong Learning; Treatment of sports personnel during Sports Meets and regular physical checkup of sports students; Regular checkup of children of Pre School located in the Department of Home Science; Medical Aid for retired University staff and their family.

Apart from this, the Health Centre also looks after sanitation and cleanliness in and around the campus, canteens, hostels and undertakes disposal of garbage in collaboration with the Municipality of Jammu. The Health Centre also provides for reimbursement Facility during Hospitalization of employees, Different Lab. tests are also conducted.

HOSTELS

The University of Jammu provides hostel facility to its students and scholars. There are three girls hostels located on the main campus and five boys hostels, one of which is located in the old campus and the other four in the new campus. The allotment to the hostels is done by Provost Hostels on the basis of merit, to those students who reside beyond 45 km (for girls) and more than 60 kms (for boys) from the University Campus.

THE NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The National Service Scheme was started to establish a meaningful linkage between the campus and the community. The NSS was started in the University of Jammu in the year 1981. The University of Jammu gives substantial credit to NSS Volunteers for seeking admission in the various post graduate courses of the University of Jammu on the basis of their performance as an NSS volunteer. In recent past, NSS in the University of Jammu has made tremendous strides in the field of social work, community extension reach out and personality development.

Based on the successful conduct of activities by NSS in the University of Jammu, the allocated strength of NSS volunteers has been increased by the Ministry of Sports and Youth Affairs, Government of India. The University organizes regular workshops and programmes for the NSS volunteers.

STUDENTS WELFARE

The office of the Dean Students Welfare, established in 1972, is responsible for planning, organizing and conducting students welfare programmes including cultural and literary activities, festivals, extension and special lectures etc. It monitors the facilities for organizing various academic and cultural/literary activities, working of the canteens, klosks for various student services like photocopying, stationery, book shop etc. in the campus. It is also responsible for maintaining discipline and law & order.

GENERAL ZORAWAR SINGH AUDITORIUM COMPLEX (GZSAC)

The General Zorawar Singh Auditorium Complex, is mega infrastructure facility of the University established in 2007. The Auditorium showcases the rich, diverse and pluralistic traditions and heritage of Ladakh, Jammu and Kashmir and is a step towards meeting the needs and aspirations of the students and the people of the region. The Complex houses an auditorium, a museum and an art-gallery. The auditorium is named after General Zorawar Singh a Dogra soldier, famous for his military expeditions. The Museum is named after Shiekh Noor-Ud-Din Noorani, a great sufi and propagator of Rishl cult in Kashmir and the Art gallery is named after Rinchen Bzangpo, a scholar and propagator of Buddhism in Ladakh and the founder of Gompas, famous for their architecture and design.

The Auditorium has a seating capacity of around 1400 and can be divided into two with the help of a state-of-art hydraulic stage and sliding-folding partition to create a mini auditorium with a seating capacity of 400. The Complex also has a brainstorming room, a reading room cum library, an exhibition hall, a souvenir shop, a green room etc.

The major collection of the Gallery is of contemporary paintings. These paintings have been received from the artists who participated in the "All India Contemporary Artists Camp" at Patnitop (Jammu) in October 2004, organized by the University of Jammu. The other collection is of black and white photographs, sketches and painting which have been donated by renowned artists and art historians like Prof. S.D.S Charak, Sh. Sati Sahni and Sh. Sarabjeet Singh. The Art Gallery also houses some beautiful wooden sculptures; which were carved in the special "Wood Carving Camp" organized by the University of Jammu in 2005 and attended by renowned sculptors from all over the country.

The Shiekh Noor-Ud-Din Noorani museum housed in the ground floor of the complex has a collection of artifacts covering the history of our State through various ages. The interesting displays in the museum include the remains of Krimchi Temple and a replica of Burzahom pit. Through this unique combination of an art gallery, a museum and an auditorium, the University seeks to create a holistic academic ambience, where students have exposure to visual arts, performing arts and culture not just for career building but enriching their existing faculties and bringing forth new ones.

The Auditorium is being utilized for holding conferences, seminars, award functions, concerts by the various departments of the University, affiliated colleges, educational institutions, social organizations, etc.

BRIGADIER RAJINDER SINGH AUDITORIUM (BRSA)

The Brigadier Rajinder Singh Auditorium has a seating capacity of 320. It has two green rooms and is centrally air conditioned with sophisticated sound system.

SPORTS FACILITIES

Apart from offering B.P.Ed. and M.P.Ed. programme, the Directorate of Sports and Physical Education organises various Sports Competition/Tournaments, Hiking/Trekking and Mountaineering expeditions for the students of the affiliated colleges and University departments. The Sports Infrastructure on the Main Campus includes a Cricket Ground with net facility, Football Ground, Basketball/ Handball/Kho-Kho/Volley Ball/Lawn Tennis Courts, Athletic Track (400mts.), University Fitness Centre etc. The university also has a Gymnasium Hall which has been recently named as P.V. Sindu Gymnasium Hall.

PLACEMENT CELL

Placement Cell, University of Jammu was established in 2009. The Cell in its short span of establishment has undertaken a number of initiatives for increasing placement opportunities to the students. Students of various Departments and campuses have been placed in various organizations. The Cell organizes interactions with corporate as well as consultants so as to increase the employability of the students.

DIRECTORATE OF DISTANCE and ONLINE EDUCATION (DD& OE)

Directorate of Distance & online Education (DD & OE) (formerly known as The Directorate of Distance Education) was established on 3rd March 1976 in the University of Jammu. With the establishment of Directorate of Distance Education, the University of Jammu within 7 years of its establishment became a dual mode university from a conventional University. The Directorate offers Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Diploma programmes to cater to the needs of diverse learners. The enrolment has grown from under 100 students in the year of its establishment to about 13000 students in 2022-23. This multi-faculty institution has 11 permanent teachers with a strong orientation and experience in distance education. The Directorate also uses the services of visiting and contractual faculty. The Directorate follows multimedia approach to teaching and learning. In order to augment the delivery of the programmes being offered, the latest and updated self-learning material is provided to the distance learners by hand and through post. The Directorate has adequate infrastructure for Personal Contact Programmes (PCP) and Counseling Sessions. The Directorate has a well stocked library with a collection of about 37,000 books, magazines and periodicals. The e-resources in the library are accessed through UGC-Infonet Digital Library Consortium. It has computer laboratory with internet and wi-fi facility also.

The Directorate has a well-furnished committee room for holding meetings, guest lectures and extension lectures. The Directorate has a seminar hall which is housed in a six storeyed new building of the DD&OE with a seating capacity of about 200. The Directorate has also established a network of learner support centres which are located at Government Degree College Rajouri, Kathua, Udhampur, Bhaderwah, Poonch, Doda and Kishtwar to provide effective academic, administrative and information support services to distance learners at undergraduate level and also offering ONLINE COURSES in M.Com. and M.A English.

AFFILIATED COLLEGES

There are 170 affiliated colleges of University of Jammu offering various UG. / PG Courses, spread across various districts of Jammu region. Among these, 3 are autonomous Colleges namely Govt. College for women Parade, Model Institute of Engineering and Research (MIER) College of Education & Model Institute of Engineering & Technology (MIET). The College Development Council, University of Jammu serves as an administrative guide to the Golleges and advises the University on all matters relating to development of affiliated colleges.

DIRECTORATE OF INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE (DIQA)

One of the emerging challenges faced by any higher educational institution is the development, application and maintenance of quality benchmarks in all its key performance areas. To institutionalise the process of quality sustenance and enhancement, the Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA) established in the University in 2003 (formerly Centre for Quality Assurance) is a nodal agency for ushering in the era of total quality management by working out intervention strategies to enhance the quality in the institution in totality. The Directorate is also responsible for assessment, accreditation and rankings. University of Jammu has been awarded "A+" Grade in the cycle III of accreditation and assessment done by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The University has been ranked 63rd by the Ministry of Human Resource & Development (MHRD) National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) in 2023, thus figuring in the top 100 Universities for the six consecutive years.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM

Pursuant to the University Council Resolution No. 74.14 of the Council Meeting held on the12th April 2013, the University introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). Under CBCS, all programmes of study are defined in terms of their credit requirements.

Each programme has a list of approved Core Courses & Elective courses which are being offered in different semesters as per programme requirements. In addition to the core courses and elective courses, a student shall be required to opt for one/more courses of his/her choice as Open Course from any other programme. Thus, the total credits shall be distributed over four categories Post-Graduate Semester Core Courses (PSCC), Post-Graduate Semester Elective Courses (PSCC), Post-Graduate Semester Open Courses (PSCC) and SWAYAM-MOOC Courses.

Open and MOOC courses shall provide an opportunity to the student to develop broad interdisciplinary knowledge base or to specialize significantly in an area outside the parent discipline. They may include elective and/or core courses from other disciplines or shall be specially designed courses for the students from other

programmes/departments within the same or different faculties. Along with Open Courses / MOOCs, all the Teaching Departments of the University shall also be offering Value Added Courses w.e.f. the Academic Session 2023-24. However, CBCS is applicable to Post Graduate Degree Programmes (and not in diploma programmes) being offered in the main campus affiliated Colleges and Offsite Campuses through regular mode. Further, CBCS is not applicable to LLB 3 years, LLB 5 years, B.Lib.I.Sc and M.Lib.I.Sc

OPEN CHOICE COURSES OFFERED IN 4TH SEMESTER:

The students of 4th Semester have to undergo/ opt for Open Courses offered in the 4th Semester by the various Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu/ Offsite Campuses/ Colleges in the online / offline mode. The Open Courses are offered to the students of Master Degree Programme under CBCS in the 4th Semester only. The allotment of the Open Course in 4th Semester is made on the basis of the merit of 1st & 2nd Semesters and the preferences/ choice of the Applicant/s given in the application form, as the case may be. In case of a tie, the admission shall be made on the basis of the Under Graduate result. For details of Open Choice Courses offered by the various Teaching Departments of the University in 4th Semester (refer page no. 20) of the Admission Brochure. The Allotment of courses shall be made by the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs. Students of 4th Semester can only opt for Open Course/s other than offered by their own parent Department.

In view of the difficulties faced by the students, the University vide Notification No.DAA/23/715-65 dated 17/05/2023 (vide notification No.DAA/23/8236-75 dated 27/03/2023) allows students of final semester of the Master Degree Programme under CBCS to earn 04 credits, required to be earned from outside of their own programme, either through Open Courses offered by the Teaching Departments of the University Main Campus or MOOCs from SWAYAM Portal. In such case/s MOOCs will be treated as Open Course for 4th Semester.

The PG students of Master Degree Programme under CBCS are also allowed to earn the requisite 8 credits, to be earned from outside of their own programme, anytime between the duration of 2nd to 4th Semester.

SWAYAM/ MOOCs (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds)

To widen the access to higher education and to promote use of ICT in Teaching Learning, Massive Online Open Courses (MOOCs) have emerged as viable model for imparting conventional and online education. Indian version of MOOC has been launched on an indigenous platform known as SWAYAM (Study Web of Active Learning by Young and Aspiring Minds) which has been initiated by Government of India to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy- Access, Equity and Quality. The Academic Council and the University Council of the University of Jammu have approved the adoption of the MOOCs through SWAYAM.

From the academic session 2020-21, UGC SWAYAM courses have been made mandatory at both UG and PG Levels. PG students are required to earn a minimum of 4 Credits from SWAYAM courses and UG students are required to earn minimum 2 Credits from SWAYAM. These courses are being offered by the faculty from the prestigious institutions of the country. These will add value to the degrees being obtained by the students and make them more employable. Each Department has a Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator who shall help the students in selection of courses and hand hold them throughout their course. The facilities of the Department like Computers, internet and libraries will be made available to the students for enrolment registration and completion of course on/from the SWAYAM Portal of the UGC. Information to all concerned will be available on the Portal https://ugmoocs.inflibnet.ac.in&https://swayam.gov.in

STANDING INSTRUCTIONS FOR SWAYAM IMPLEMENTATION (The following Information / Instructions must be followed strictly by all concerned)

- MOOCs through SWAYAM platform is mandatory for all students enrolled for a Bachelor's or Master's Degree programme in the University of Jammu or its affiliated Colleges w.e.f. Academic Session 2020-21 onwards.
- A minimum of one course of 4-Credit has to be earned, subject to the maximum of 10% of total credits for the completion of degree by all regular students of PG/UG stream from the SWAYAM platform depending upon the availability of courses as notified by UGC generally on predefined dates, 1st June or 1st November, every year.

- Courses must be identified by all Departments duly approved by Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) or by Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) as the case may be, latest by the 25th of June for June notified courses and similarly by 25th of November for November notified courses by UGC, and must be sent to the DEAN ACADEMIC AFFAIRS within a weeks' time from date of commencement of 3th Semester.
- Departmental Affairs Committee (DAC) / Swayam Academic Cell (SAC) must be empowered for the selection of MOOCs by Convenor, BOS /Dean of the concerned faculty.
- Department Swayam Coordinator (DSC) or College Swayam Coordinator (CSC) must brief the students of 1st semester within the first week of commencement of the
 first semester, preferably during induction programme, about SWAYAM and its related issues, for every newly admitted batch, as a regular feature.
- Preferably for earning the required 4 credits, a single course must be selected from SWAYAM Platform. However, final combination of earning 4 credits shall be left to the DSC and the students, which must be completed on or before 3rd/5th/9th Semesters as the case may be.
- The DCS of the concerned Department must brief the students during the Induction Program, all the issues associated with SWAYAM MOOCs (As given in the booklet).
- 8. The student can select courses either from technical (NPTEL) and non-technical (UGC) MOOCs from SWAYAM Portal (www.swayam.gov.in)
- 9. In case the credits are not specified for a given MOOC, the DSC or CSC must ensure a minimum of 12 weeks (72 hrs) course to qualify for the 04-credit course.
- MOOCs will be treated as Open Course inlieu of Open course of 3rd semester course offered by University.
- 11. The student must complete the SWAYAM course successfully before the commencement of the final semester of a stream or discipline.
- 12. Students can select the MOOC course of their choice from a pool of courses selected by the Departments or Colleges, of any stream or any other course of their choice with prior information to Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (CSC) and it shall be the duty of the Departmental SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC) or College SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC) to forward these selected new courses through the Convener, BOS, under information to Dean Academic Affairs.
- 13. Departments/ Colleges must ensure that all logistic support whatever is required by the student, must be supplemented/extended.
- Student ideally should not select self-paced MOOCs, and the courses selected must be different from one offered in the course curriculum of semesters in order to avoid duplication.
- 15. The student must fill an undertaking form, as given in the brochure, and submit the same after duly filled form to their respective Departments/ Colleges for future reviews and record purposes.
- Students must follow the schedule of the host institution in completing the course successfully and for all doubts must contact the Course Coordinator or the Departmental/ College SWAYAM Coordinator (DSC/CSC).
- Any issue or problem related to SWAYAM must be brought to the notice of the University SWAYAM Coordinator, immediately, through the DSC and Head, without fail, so that it can be addressed in time.
- 18. The student must keep a note of and also supply the information such as registration date/ enrolment id, email-id, phone, name, semester etc. to their DSC/CSC.
- 19. SWAYAM Examination fees (if any), or any other fee prescribed, shall be borne by the students only.
- The Examination fee once paid shall not be refundable.
- 21. Since there is no re-examination system therefore, candidate has to re-opt in the next cycle/ session if he/she is unable to complete the SWAYAM MOOCs successfully for whatsoever reason.
- 22. The concerned may note that all University/ Departmental Examinations must be rescheduled or readjusted if needed, to avoid any clash with SWAYAM Examination schedule, to avoid hardships to the students.
- 23. The student must submit a valid course completion certificate as a proof (Photocopy/ print copy) to their respective DSC/GSC before the beginning of the final semester, failing which their degree will be withheld.
- A bi-annual data collection of information regarding SWAYAM enrolment, as per prescribed format available on University Website on pre-proposed fixed dates, preferably 5th October and 5th March, every year for the sessions of June and November, respectively must be done. This responsibility of sending soft copy information as per prescribed format shall lie with the Department/College SWAYAM Coordinator to the Directorate of Internal Quality Assurance (DIQA) to the email-id: iqac_ju@yahoo.com with copy to UGC Swayam coordinator of the University
- 25. All records of MOOCs related information must be preserved for two years from date of passing out by the student from the department or college as the case be.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING ADMISSIONS -2023

- 1. Admission to a programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University of Jammu, Main Campus/ Offsite Campuses and Affiliated Colleges shall be made on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG-23), conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA), by the Admission-Cum-Counselling Committee of the concerned Department. 100% weightage shall be given to the CUET-PG Score except for candidates applying under Achievement Category. For admission to a particular programme, the candidate must have to fulfill the basic eligibility as prescribed under rule. The Admission Committee of the concerned Department shall consist of members as given in Annexure I (A).
 - a) In case, seats remain vacant after exhausting the entire merit list of CUET-PG-23 the same will be filled up on the basis of the Academic Merit of the Qualifying Examination. Application for Admission shall be submitted online as per the dates specified in the PG Admission Notification.
 - b) The Schedule and other details of admission for the programmes namely MBA (Main Campus) & M.Sc Biotechnology (except NRI/Industrial Sponsored Seats) shall be notified by the concerned Department separately after approval of the Dean Academic Affairs.

2. Admission to the Offsite Campuses:

50% of the total number of seats in any programme/ subject offered in all off-site Campuses of the University of Jammu shall be reserved for the candidates who are the pass-out of the respective District College and, only, in the event of no such candidate being available for these seats, the same be filled up by the students of other areas. In the case of Bhaderwah, this would mean that the students of Colleges belonging to the erstwhile district of Doda and for Poonch Campus, students of Colleges from both the districts of Poonch and Rajouri will be considered.

3. Guidelines for filling online Admission Form:

i) Candidates will be required to apply online exclusively through the University website. Once the admission form is submitted online, the candidates are required to pay the requisite fee through online mode only (Debit/ Credit Card, Net-Banking, UPI etc), the process for the online application will be completed once the payment is successful.

NOTE: Admission form shall be rejected if the payment of the requisite admission fee is not received within the stipulated time period.

- ii) Detailed Advertisement/s / Notifications can be seen on the University website from time to time.
- iii) Before starting Registration for admission, the applicant should carefully read the notification and eligibility carefully to evaluate his/her eligibility for the respective programme.
- iv) Before starting registration of application on-line, the applicant should be ready with the following:
 - a) Valid Mobile No and Email ID. Applicant must use his own Mobile No. and email address. The Email address provided by the applicant must be functional and the applicant must have access to it throughout the admission process. All the correspondence w.r.t. admission shall be communicated through the registered email ID and Mobile No.
 - b) Digital or Scanned copies of the qualifying examination mark-sheets, Category certificates (if applicable), domicile certificate (if applicable), passport size photo and signature which are required to be uploaded while filling up of the online admission form.
- v) After successful registration unique Registration Number will be generated by the system and displayed on the screen. The registration number along with password shall be sent to the Applicant on the registered Email ID and SMS on the entered Mobile Number given in the application form. Applicant has to retain this number and password for future references. The applicant should note down the Registration No and Password carefully for login to his/her account. One candidate can submit only one Application form. If more than one application is submitted, it will lead to rejection of all the applications submitted by the candidate.
- vi) Applicant should fill the details / inputs in the On-line admission form at the appropriate places very carefully and click on the SUBMIT button at the end of the Registration. Before Pressing the SUBMIT button, the applicants are advised to verify carefully every field / inputs mentioned in the application form. Name of the Applicant, father's name etc should be spelled correctly in the application as it appears in the Matriculation mark sheet / certificate. Any change / alteration found / detected later, may lead to his / her disqualification.
- vii) The applicants should note that the particulars mentioned in the online application will be considered as final and no change / alteration / modification will be allowed / entertained after submission of the On-line application under any circumstances.
- viii) Online Application FEE & MODE OF PAYMENT:- Online Application Fee of Rs.500/- shall be charged from each applicant except SC/ST wherein it shall be Rs.450/-. Mode of payment is online only (Net Banking / Credit Card/ Debit Card etc). The applicant can check the status of payment after log in to their account on the admission portal of the University.

The candidate desirous to be considered under the SELF-FINANCING seat has to pay an additional non-refundable fee of Rs.730/- which has to be paid at the time of filling up of the Admission Form.

x) The applicant has to furnish a declaration to the effect that the inputs furnished by him/her are true, complete and correct to the best of his / her knowledge and they are required to be supported by the original documents / testimonials as and when required/demanded. His/her candidature /admission will be summarily rejected/ terminated if any false/incorrect information is found / detected at any stage. Therefore, it is mandatory for the applicant to tick the Check Box about this Declaration at the end of the Application Form, before saving and uploading the application.

4. Admission Policy / General Guidelines For Admission:

- i) The candidate who has not filled in the Online Admission Form is not eligible for Admission.
- ii) The candidate who has not applied for Self-Finance Seat at the time of the filling up of the Online Application along with the requisite fee is not eligible for admissions under the Self Finance Seat. The mode of filling of Self-Finance seats be dealt as per Statute 9 Governing Admissions to Master Degree, Bachelor Degree (LL.B (3 Years), B.Lib.I.Sc. & B.P.Ed), Diploma Programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University of Jammu, Jammu/Offsite Campuses/Affiliated Colleges.
- iii) The candidate shall have the option to exercise multiple choices, as per eligibility, for getting admission in a Course/Programme of Study at the time of filling up of online Admission Form.
- iv) The candidate who has not submitted the requisite Reserved Category Certificate as required during the notified dates of Admission shall not be considered for admission under that category. As such, any candidate submitting an Under Process Certificate has not to be considered for admission.
- v) The candidate who has not submitted his/her certificates for admission in any Achievement Category within the prescribed time is not eligible for admission in that Achievement Category.
- vi) The candidate who is higher in merit than the ones who have been admitted and could not seek admission/ attend counselling for one or the other reason, he/she may be admitted against the vacant seat/s, if otherwise eligible. The merit / inter-se-merit in such cases will be adhered to and all the eligible candidates shall be given an opportunity for admission in order of merit.
- vii) The seats in the reserved categories, (at S.No. 2 to 8 and 1% of S.No. 9), if remain unfilled, even after exhausting the complete list in that particular category/ies, the same may be converted into Open/General Category seats and be offered to the candidates in order of merit.
- viii) The reserved seats (3% of S.No. 9 and seat at S.No. 10 to 15) cannot be converted into the Open/ General Category seats even if they remain vacant.
- ix) In the event of no candidate being available in the 1st Preference and after the list of the candidates in the 1st Preference is completely exhausted in a particular programme/course, it is only then that the candidates who are seeking admission in the 2nd preference be considered strictly in order of merit and if otherwise eligible.
- x) Department, where seats are allotted in the 2nd Preference, the concerned Head/Director of the Department will furnish a Certificate in the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs, stating that the entire list of the applicants desirous of admission in that Department in the 1st Preference has been exhausted and, therefore, the eligible candidates now in order of merit in the 2nd Preference, are being considered.
- xi) The candidates who are admitted after the commencement of the Class work of the 1st Semester shall have to make up for the lectures / practicals etc. on their own.

Spot Counselling/ Mop-up Round

xii) In case, the seats are still vacant at any stage before the closure of the admission process, then the Departments/Nodal Departments shall go for the Spot/ Mop-up Counselling round and ensure that all the seats are filled as per the eligibility criteria of the Departments/Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges in respect to those students who have filled the Online Admission form, uploaded the requisite fees and documents in time and who because of one or the other reason were not able to present themselves / seek admission on the date/s as prescribed/ notified by the University/ respective Departments. No admission shall be made thereafter under any circumstances.

5. ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORY:

- a) Eligibility for admission under the Achievement Categories (Sports/ Cultural & Literary activities/ NCC/ NSS / Bharat Scouts & Guides) shall be based on the outstanding performance displayed by the candidates during:-
 - PG programmes (expect M.Ed./M.P.Ed./M.Lib.I.Sc.)- Three year tenure of B.A/B.Sc/B.Com/B.B.A/B.C.A under (10+2+3) pattern (Honours or General) of the qualifying degree when he/she has remained a regular student on the rolls of a College/Institution at the under-graduate level in addition to the requisite academic score.

- ii) In case of admission to M.Ed./M.P.Ed/M.Lib.I.Sc Course admission under achievement categories shall be on the basis of marks earned under the category during the period of qualifying degree i.e B.Ed./B.P.Ed/B.Lib.I.Sc and the requisite academic score.
- a) The candidates need to enclose the following certificates /documents along with the Achievement Category certificates in order for consideration of the claim under achievement category.
- a. Date of Birth Certificate,
- b. Copy of the Domicile Certificate, if applicable
- c. Copies of marks sheets of qualifying examinations.
- b) All the Applicants Seeking Admission under Achievement Category (Sports / Cultural & Literary Activities/ NCC/ NSS/ Bharat Scouts & Guides) are required to upload a single PFD File, containing all the Achievement Certificates, for evaluation on the official website for admissions. A separate achievement certificate/s uploaded in addition to this single PDF file shall not be considered for evaluation.

6. SEAT ALLOCATION/ VERIFICATION/ ADMISSION PROCEDURE

(A) Document Verification

- a. Online verification of the application/documents will be done by the Department/ Nodal Departments for the candidates before the seat allocation round. Candidates with no document deficiencies will receive allocation approval from the respective Department/ Nodal Department.
- b. The Department/Nodal Department will verify the validity and authenticity of documents/certificates submitted by the candidate within the stipulated timeline.
- c. Following information of the applicant be verified from the documents uploaded:
- i. Max. Marks / Marks Obtained in the qualifying examination
- ii. Core Course/s as per eligibility of the said Programme
- d. During the online verification process, if a Department / Nodal Department seeks more clarity/information from the candidate, it may select NOT ACCEPTED / RE-UPLOAD under VERIFICATION and raise a query, under REMARKS OPTION, to the candidate.
- After verification, the Department / Nodal Department will either select "ACCEPTED" or "NOT ACCEPTED" and press UPDATE button of the application form. No application will be left unattended.
- f. At the time of online verification, if an application is NOT ACCEPTED, the Department / Nodal Department will state the reason for rejection. For rejecting an application, Department / Nodal Department will indicate any of the following reason/s:
- i. Invalid documents/certificates submitted by the candidate
- ii. Failure to respond to the query(les) raised within the stipulated time
- iii. Any other reason, as noted.
- g. During the online approval process, if a Department / Nodal Department raises a query (or queries), the candidate will receive SMS/Email and must respond through his/her dashboard within the stipulated time. Failure to respond to the query (or queries) will result in the rejection of the application form.

(B) Allocation Process

- a. In the context of provisional seat allocation, 'Allocated Seat' refers to a unique combination of Program+ Campus/ College. For example, M.A (Sociology) at Campus X is referred to as an 'Allocated Seat'.
- b. The Highest Possible Preference of the candidate will be provisionally allocated to a candidate considering the following criteria:
- I. Programme-merit list
- ii. Category
- iii. Availability of seats
- iv. Any other allocation rules, policies or criteria of the University of Jammu mentioned in the eligibility /University Information Brochure published on the admission website.

(C) Merit List

- a. The merit list for the Open category seats will comprise of all candidates in order of merit. All candidate irrespective of their category will be included in the same.
- b. If candidates belonging to reserved category do not have a valid certificate/ document issued by the respective issuing authority at the time of applying, they will not be considered for allocation in the relevant category as claimed.
- c. If the total number of eligible reserved category candidates who have applied for a particular Program exhausts, then the remaining seats under this category for that particular Program will be converted as per University norms for all convertible seats.

(D) Seat Allocation

- a. The candidates will be informed by email/sms regarding the declaration of the Allocated Lists.
- b. On declaration of the allocation list/s, the candidate must check the lists carefully and log on to his/her dashboard for allocated seat, if offered.
- c. It is the responsibility of the candidate to login to the dashboard and check if a seat is allocated in a given round of seat allocation, and if allocated, the candidate must complete all admission formalities.

d. Acceptance of the Provisionally allocated seat:

Once a seat has been allocated in a particular round, the candidate must 'ACCEPT' the Allocated Seat. The provision for acceptance of a particular Allocated Seat and seeking admission against that seat will be valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate. Inactivity/no-action will be taken as non-acceptance to the Allocated Seat. It will be treated as a decline to the provisionally Allocated Seat and the candidate will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of admission process.

e. Admission to the Provisionally allocated seat:

For seeking admission the candidate must visit the Department / Nodal Department for physical verification of the documents, as per counselling schedule. The counselling schedule will be published on the admission website.

(E) Seat Confirmation Options:

- a. FREEZE: This option is applicable when the candidate is allocated their first preferred seat or when the candidate wishes to take admission in the allocated seat and does not want to further participate in the admission process.
- b. UPGRADE: This option is visible only if the candidate is allocated a seat other than their first preference/choice. It allows the candidate to participate in the next round for possible upgradation to a higher preference.

(F) Upgradation Process:

- a. This "UPGRADE" option will be available if a student has been allocated a seat other than their first choice and/or is unsatisfied with the allocated seat and wishes to participate in the next round for possible upgradation to a higher preference.
- b. Choosing 'Upgrade' requires the candidate to pay a refundable/adjustable token fee deposit of INR 2000. This deposit is a one-time payment for potential upgradation in subsequent rounds. This fee will be refunded by the concerned Department/ Nodal Department when the candidate is finally admitted in the respective Department/Campus.
- c. Upon payment, the candidate's seat will be reserved, and they will be considered as a participant for the next round.
- d. If the candidate gets upgraded to a higher preference in the subsequent round, they can accept the allocated seat and proceed with final admission, withdrawing their claim for the previously allocated seat.
- e. If the candidate does not get upgraded in subsequent rounds, they can accept the already allocated seat and proceed with final admission.

(G) Final Admission and Document Verification:

- a. After allocation of preferred seats, students have to visit the Department / Nodal Department of the University Main Campus with all the original documents along with one set of photocopies of self-attested documents for physical document verification within the scheduled time slot and date allotted. (Separate notification will be issued for counseling schedule).
- b. During the physical document verification, the Nodal Department of the University Main Campus will verify the following within the stipulated timeline:

Minimum eligibility of the candidate. Program-specific eligibility of the candidate. Validity and authenticity of the documents/certificates submitted by the candidate. If the Department/ Nodal Department requires more clarity or information during the admission process, it may raise a query to the candidate. The candidate must fulfill the query within the stipulated time.

c. After the physical verification, the Department/ Nodal Department will either "ACCEPT" or 'REJECT' the provisionally allocated seat of the candidate.

- d. For accepted candidates, the payment link on the student dashboard will become active. The student must pay the admission fees within the desired time (usually within 48 hours).
- The candidate will have to pay the Admission fee for the approved seat. The admission process will be considered complete only after the successful payment of the admission fee.
- f. If a candidate fails to pay the admission fee within the stipulated time, it will be considered as a cancellation of the provisionally allocated seat. The allocated seat will be forfeited, and the candidate will not be considered for any subsequent allocation rounds. The candidate will lose all rights to the allocated seat and will not be eligible for any future allocation rounds. However, the candidate may have the option to apply for the spot round / late entry round.

(H) Admission Process Flow

- a. Number of Rounds: The admission process will typically consist of two to three rounds of allocation and a spot round.
- Additional spot rounds may be conducted based on seat availability.
- c. The number of rounds are subject to real time analysis of applications received as well as outcome of the allocation round.

d. CASE I: If first choice/preference is allotted to the student.

The provision for accepting a particular allocated seat is valid only for the round in which the seat was allocated to the candidate. If a student does not seek admission against the bestseat allocated to them, their claim for the seat will be withdrawn.

ii. Candidates who receive their first preferred seat will not be eligible for upgrades.

e. CASE II: If the allotted seat is other than first preference. Candidates who are allocated seats other than their first preference have the following options:

i. Freeze Option: By choosing Freeze, the candidate can proceed with the final admission process and seek admission within the given timeline.

- ii. Upgrade Option: By choosing Upgrade, the candidature will be considered for the next subsequent allocation round. If the candidate gets upgraded to a higher preference in the next subsequent round, they must freeze the newly allocated seat and proceed with the final admission. Their claim for previously allocated seat will be withdrawn thereafter. If the candidate does not get upgraded to a higher preference, they have to freeze the already allocated seat (from the previous round) and proceed with the final admission.
- f. In both the cases (Case I and Case II), If a candidate accepts the seat but does not take admission, their claim for the seat will be withdrawn. As a result, they will not be allowed to participate in subsequent rounds of admission.
- g. If a candidate shows no activity (i.e., does not accept the seat), their claim for the seat will be withdrawn, and they will not be allowed to participate in subsequent rounds of admission. However, it's important to mention that such candidates may have the opportunity to appearin the spot round of admission when announced, depending upon the availability of seats and such candidates shall not be allowed for late entry under any circumstances.

h. CASE III: If case of No-Activity (Candidate does not Accept/Freeze/Upgrade) If a seat is allocated to a candidate and they do not opt for Accept, Freeze, or Upgrade before the last date/time specified for the given allocation round for any reason:

i. No activity will be treated as a decline to the provisionally allocated seat and such candidates will no longer be able to participate in subsequent rounds of admission.

II. Such candidates may have the opportunity to appear in the spot round of admission whenannounced, depending upon the availability of seats.

III. Such candidates shall not be allowed for late entry under any circumstances.

(I) Seat Cancellation

a. Failure to 'Accept' or 'Freeze' the provisionally Allocated Seat within the stipulated timeline will lead to the cancellation of the Allocated Seat.

b. The provisionally Allocated Seat will be canceled if a candidate fails to pay the Admission fees within the stipulated time.

- c. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, any of the document(s)/certificate(s) is/are found to be invalid/fraudulent.
- d. The provisionally Allocated Seat/Admission will be canceled if, at any time, it is found that a candidate does not meet the Minimum Eligibility Criteria as laid down by the University.

e. A candidate whose provisionally allocated seat/admission is canceled due to the above - mentioned reasons will forfeit the right to seek admission.

f. Candidates who are already admitted in a particular Programme and wish to cancel the seat to appear in Spot round for any reason, have to cancel his/her admission by

visiting the Department/ Nodal Department before the start of the SPOT Round.

g. There will be no option to withdraw the admission once the Spot Admission round is announced.

(J) Fee Payment Process:

- a. Admission of a candidate will be deemed confirmed only after the successful reconciliation of the Admission Fee. The admission fee must be paid only through the candidate's dashboard. If the admission fee is not successfully remitted within the stipulated time, the admission will not be considered complete under any circumstances. For all payments, candidates should use any of these payment modes: Net Banking / Debit/Credit Card/ UPI.
- b. Once the Department/ Nodal Department gives the approval for admission to the candidate after document verification, the fee payment link will be activated and will be shown to the candidate in his/her user account. Candidate has to pay the full fee online through his dashboard.

(K) Refund Process:

- Those candidates who proceed for final admission and have already paid Rs 2000 as a token money can apply to the Department / Nodal Department for refund through e-NEFT Application Form.
- b. Candidates who have paid Rs 2000 as a token money and have not taken admission or did not get admission till the last round of admission, can apply for a refund. A separate notification for this kind of refund will be issued on the admission website/ public media.
- c. For those candidates who have already been admitted to a particular programme and want to cancel the admission, the refund process will be handled as per University norms. All refunds of any kind will be processed once the admission process is completed, as per the laid down rules and regulations of the University.

(L) Payment Making Guidelines:

- a. If the amount is not deducted while making an online payment, the candidate should try paying again before the payment deadline. It is important to ensure a stable internet connection when making the online payment.
- b. Candidates must use the correct credentials to ensure a successful payment.
- c. It is advisable to avoid the last-hour rush and make the payment well before the deadline.
- d. If the amount is deducted but a notification is not received, the candidate should seek confirmation from their source bank. In such cases, the candidate should not attempt another payment for the next 45 minutes.
- e. Before making online fee payment, candidates should ensure that Net Banking (Online Transaction) is enabled on their credit/debit card. Candidates and their parents/guardians should be familiar with other online payment methods like e-Banking, Debit / Credit Card, UPI, and their respective terms and conditions.
- f. Contact Payment Gateway Helpline: If a successful transaction is confirmed from the source bank but the payment failure continues to be reflected on the dashboard, the candidate may contact the University Helpline For gueries related to payment, use the standard format given below:

7. Display of Lists

The Programme wise allotment list shall be published on the Admission portal of the University webite.

Under no circumstances, the seats lying vacant in the Departments on the last prescribed date for completion of admission will be filled up by the Head of the Department/ Admission-cum-Counseling Committee unless the candidate falls immediately next in merit to the last admitted candidate. If some seats still remain vacant, these will be referred to the APPELLATE COMMITTEE for consideration.

NOTE:

 NO SEPARATE INTIMATION REGARDING SELECTION TO A PROGRAMME OF STUDY SHALL BE SENT TO THE APPLICANT. THE CANDIDATES ARE ADVISED TO REMAIN IN TOUCH WITH THE OFFICIAL WEBSITE FOR ADMISSION / CONCERNED DEPARTMENT/ NODAL DEPARTMENT FOR DAY TO DAY INFORMATION.

- 2. THE CONCERNED TEACHING DEPARTMENT OF THE UNIVERSITY SHALL ACT AS NODAL DEPARTMENT FOR FINALIZATION OF ADMISSION TO OFFSITE CAMPUSES/ AFFILIATED COLLEGES.
- 3. NO DOCUMENT SHALL BE ENTERTAINED BY THE DEPARTMENT AFTER THE PRESCRIBED LAST DATE AS NOTIFIED BY THE UNIVERSITY.

8. Warning

- a. Mere filing of online admission form doesn't ensure admission to a programme of study in the University. Each candidate shall ensure that he/she fulfill the Eligibility Criteria and that the particulars furnished in the Admission Notification are complete and correct in all respects. In case, it is detected at any stage that a candidate does not fulfill the eligibility criteria and/or has furnished incorrect information or suppressed any material information, his/her candidature will be cancelled and if already admitted, shall be liable to forfeit the benefits accrued there from, besides rustication from the University.
- b. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it comes to notice later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. However, if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given opportunity of hearing and if his/her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him / her from the Institution.

9. Appeal

In case a candidate, who has filled his/her online Admission form in time, paid the requisite fee, has any grievance and feels that the Statutes governing admission have not been adhered to, he/she may make an appeal to the Appellate Committee as notified on the Online Form prescribed for the purpose and remit the requisite fee latest by the prescribed date, or any other date notified for the purpose. Such an appeal shall be considered by the Appellate Committee. It shall be obligatory for the appellant to appear in person before the Appellate Committee, if called upon to do so. The decision of the Appellate Committee shall be final and binding on such Applicant. Appeal form can be downloaded from the University website for admissions. The same shall be deposited in the concerned Department/Nodal Department for redressal.

10. First Preference

A Programme of study in the University where eligibility for admission is on the basis of having passed in final examination of B.A/B.C/B.Com/B.B.A/B.C.A etc, with minimum 55% marks, 50% for SC/ST Categories, of the University of Jammu or any other recognized University within the Province of Jammu or any other University whose Degree is recognized as equivalent to the Degree of University of Jammu with not less than 60% of marks in the qualifying examination; would mean a Degree Programme of Three Years duration after 12 years of School Education under 10+2+3 pattern. Permanent residents living within the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu shall be considered under first reference.

NOTE :-

The seats in the first preference, in case the candidate is not permanent resident of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu and having 60% or more marks in the respective qualifying examination, shall not exceed 10% of total number of seats.

11. Second Preference

Notwithstanding anything contained in Regulation/ Instruction above, a candidate who has passed M.A./M.Sc./M.Com /LLB etc examination from the University after having passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com examination with minimum 55% marks, 50% for SC/ST Categories, shall also be eligible for admission under second preference category. This shall not be applicable to PG programmes viz. LLM/M.Ed/M.Lib/M.Tech/M.Ed.

12. Undertaking by the Candidate (Applicable to all Categories)

A candidate seeking admission under Open as well as Reserved Categories must submit an undertaking as per specimen given in Annexure-II (Admission Brochure 2023) self-attested by a candidate to the effect that the Information / category certificate uploaded/ enclosed by him/her is genuine and in the event of this having been proved otherwise, his /her admission shall be cancelled besides any other action that may be taken against him/her under law for his/her Civil or Criminal Liability.

NOTE:

- Admission in any of the University Department is no assurance for getting admission in the Hostels as the seats in the Hostels are limited which shall be filled as per the Statutes governing the allotment of the Hostels.
- II) Candidates graduated with one sitting are ineligible for admission in any academic course of the University of Jammu.

STATUTES GOVERNING ADMISSION TO THE POST GRADUATE DEGREE /DIPLOMA PROGRAMMES OF STUDY INCLUDING LL.B., LLM, MBA (OFFSITE CAMPUSES & AFFILIATED COLLEGES ONLY), M.TECH, MPA, B.ED etc. OF THE UNIVERSITY OF JAMMU / OFFSITE CAMPUSES/ GOVT. PG DEGREE COLLEGES/ AFFILIATED COLLEGES

1. GENERAL ELIGIBILITY:

A candidate to be eligible for admission to the Master Degree, LL.B, B.P.Ed, B.Ed, B.Eb.I.Sc and PG Diploma programmes in the University, must have passed in the final Semester / year of the qualifying Bachelor's degree examination of 10+2+3 pattern in (Honours or General) in Arts, Science, Home Science, Commerce or Business Administration or an examination qualifying for a professional degree of not less than 3 years duration or any other examination recognised as equivalent thereof, from a recognised university/institution with at least 55% of the aggregate marks (50% for the Scheduled Caste / Tribe candidates).

Candidates who have passed degree course of two years duration under 10+2+2 or 10+1+3 pattern and thereafter have passed bridge course of one year duration comprising Part-III of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com three years (General) course of the University of Jammu or any other recognized University shall also be eligible subject to the requisite aggregate qualifying marks as indicated above. A candidate who has passed M.A/M.Sc./M.Com. Examination under the old pattern of 10+2+2 or 10+1+3 shall also be eligible for admission under second preference category to:

- (a) a course where the minimum eligibility condition is pass in Three Year Degree (General) Course requisite aggregate qualifying marks after 12 years of schooling.
- (b) a Master Degree Course in an allied subject, if otherwise permissible under Statutes/Regulations of the University.

Candidates who are not permanent residents of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu, but have passed B.A/ B.Sc/ B.Com/ BBA/ BCA (General OR Honours examination) with not less than 60% marks from a University other than the University of Jammu shall also be considered for admission subject to the condition that the number of seats under this category shall not exceed 10% of the total number of seats available in the programme of study.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Statute 1, a candidate appearing in the final year of the qualifying examinations immediately preceding the Academic Session & expecting to fulfill the Statutory requirement of at least 55% of the aggregate marks in the Bachelor's Degree (50% in the case of candidates belonging to SC/ST) can also appear in the Entrance Examination (CUET-PG-2023) as prescribed by the University for the Academic Session.

2. SUBMISSION OF APPLICATION FORM:

Applications for admission to various programmes of study in the Teaching Departments of the University/ Offsite Campuses/Affiliated Colleges shall be submitted online as per the dates specified in admission notification. Admission to the MBA (Main Campus) and M.Sc Biotechnology (Except NRI/ Self Sponsored Seats) programmes shall be made through a separate Entrance Test to be notified by each concerned Department separately after approval from the Dean Academic Affairs.

3. GENERAL:

After the declaration of the result of qualifying degree the applicant shall have to apply online through the University website or as notified in the Admission Notification. Final Admission to a programme of study in a teaching Department of the University/ Offsite Campuses/ Affiliated Colleges shall be finalized by the Admission Committee of the concerned PG Department / Nodal Departments of the University with the approval of the Dean of concerned Faculty and the Dean Academic Affairs. The Admission Committees shall consist of members as given in Annexure I (A)

NOTE: For admission to Offsite Campuses / Affiliated Colleges the final admission shall be made by the Nodal Departments.

4. SEATS: NUMBER AND DISTRIBUTION

The number of seats in a programme of study in the Teaching Departments of the University shall be determined before the commencement of the academic session by the Dean of the Faculty and Head of the Department concerned in consultation with members of the teaching staff of the Department and with the approval of the Dean Academic Affairs and wherever necessary, of the Vice-Chancellor/Syndicate/University Council. The number of seats so determined shall be communicated by the Head of the Department concerned to the Dean Academic Affairs before commencement of admission process.

Kindly refer to the communication of even no, dated 01st August, 2023 on the above mentioned subject and to inform that provisions at page 58 of CBME is amended as under:

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- (ii) All the benchmark disabilities as mentioned in the Gazette of India be considered for reservation for the Category "Candidates With Disabilities". A disability of 40% and more is eligible for admission under category (11). Certificate shall be considered only if it is issued by the Head of the Department of the concerned Medical Fraternity or that of a Government Medical College/District Hospital. The Vice-Chancellor, if he so desires, may seek advice in the matter from a Committee to be appointed by him on the recommendations of the Dean Academic Affairs.
- (iii) Candidates with benchmark disabilities as defined in the Gazette of India shall be exempted from payment of all the fee including charges for supervision and amanuensis.
- (iv) For Single Girl Child, copy of the Ration Card and an affidavit duly sworn in before the First Class Magistrate on account of proof.
- (v) Ward of University Employee refers to Son/Daughter of the Permanent employee of the University of Jammu.
- (vi) Admission under Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) of society, are only for those who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribe, Socially and Economically Backward Classes etc. The reservation would be in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of 10% of the prescribed in-take capacity in each programme/ Course. These seats (EWSs) shall not be convertible ie. If the seat/s under this category remains vacant in any programme, it shall not be converted to Open or any other category. The definition of economically weaker sections shall be such as may be notified by the Union Territory from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage (Refer Annexure-VII).

EXPLANATION:

- i) In case only one seat is available under category 9(a), 9(b) or category 10(a), 10(b) the same shall be filled on the basis of comparative merit of all the candidates under category 9(a) and 9(b), or category 10 (a) and 10 (b) put together, as the case may be.
- ii) For determining the number of seats under any reserved category mentioned at Statute 5, fraction of less than one-half shall be ignored and fraction of one half and more shall be treated as one. The benefit of fraction shall be given to each category separately even if it means an overall marginal increase in seats in any course of study.
- iii) In case any of the seats remain vacant in a reserved category (which are convertible) for want of eligible candidates, the same will be offered to the candidates of non-reserved i.e. open merit group.
 - Only such candidates shall be eligible for consideration under reserved categories in accordance to Statute 5 who have not already availed
 of this concession for admission to any programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University of Jammu in the preceding session.
 - After selection of candidates is made on the basis of open merit, notwithstanding anything contrary contained in any law, S.O. or regulation
 in force in the UT, seats under the reserved categories shall be filled as per Statutes and seats under Achievement Categories shall be
 filled up in accordance with the criteria given at Statute 12.
 - Selection of candidates against reserved seats Statute 5 shall be made on the basis of comparative merit in the respective categories, except achievement categories.
 - To be a beneficiary of reservation, the candidate must be a permanent resident/domicile of J&K UT, except when applying under categories 9(a), 9(b) i.e. Sports/Cultural & Literary activities and 10(a), 10(b) i.e. N.C.C./National Service Scheme/ Bharat Scouts & Guides activities, for which he/she must have passed the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu or from any recognized University within the Jammu Province.
 - For selection under Achievement Category, inter-se-merit shall be determined in accordance to Statute 13 B.

7. LEFT OVER SEATS:

Under no circumstances, the seats lying vacant in the Departments on the last prescribed date for completion of admission as notified will be filled up by the Head of the Department/Admission Committee unless the candidate falls immediately next in merit to the last admitted candidate. If some seats still remain vacant, these will be referred to the Appellate Committee for consideration.

8. APPELLATE COMMITTEE:

In case a candidate has any specific grievance regarding deviation from Statutes governing admission, he /she may appeal to the Appellate Committee through Head of the concerned Department, on the prescribed form along with the requisite fee by the date notified for the purpose. Such an appeal along with the observation of the Head of the Department, shall be considered by the Appellate Committee whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding. It shall be obligatory for the appellant to appear in person before the Committee if called upon to do so. The Appellate Committee shall consist of members as given in Annexure I (B).

9. SELF FINANCE SEATS:

- (A) Should there be any need to augment the resources of the university for maintaining, developing and improving the standards of instruction in any programme of study or for starting a new programme of study in a teaching department of the University, the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of the admission committee of the department concerned and the Dean Academic Affairs, may sanction self-finance seats for such programme of study additionally to meet societal obligations. The number of such seats may not ordinarily exceed 15% of the seats determined for the programmes as per Statute 4. These seats shall be supernumerary and thus, shall not count towards determining the quantum of reservation specified at Statute 5 for the various categories. The admission committee shall make admission on the basis of merit determined as per Statute, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions for such supernumerary seats. Permanent residents of territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu /those having passed the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu, shall have priority in admission over the rest against these seats. The admission shall be granted after remittance of amount of fee (refer Annexure- IV) prescribed from time to time along with other fees/charges for the course by the candidates to the University. The payment made against the self-finance seat shall be refunded as per Statute 24.
- (B) In addition to the Self Financing seats, the Department of Environmental Sciences has eight (8) seats in M.Sc. course exclusively meant for the candidates who are sponsored by Govt. Departments/ Autonomous Bodies/Industry/ Recognised NGO's (as per UGC norms). Such candidates besides fulfilling all the conditions of eligibility prescribed for the course must have at least one year of permanent service in the sponsoring organisation, except in case of NGO's wherein they must have rendered at least one year of continuous voluntary service after having passed the qualifying degree examination. Admission shall be granted in order of merit, on the production of relevant documents/certificates from the sponsor after remittance of sponsorship amount (refer Annexure IV) prescribed from time to time along with other fees/charges for the programme by the candidates to the university. The vacant sponsored seats, if any, may be converted to Self-Financing seats subject to the fulfillment of conditions mentioned in Statute.
- (C) Subject to fulfillment of the eligibility criteria and other conditions prescribed for a programme of study by the candidates, seven (7) and four (4) seats respectively in B.Lib.I.Sc. and M.Lib.I.Sc. programme, will be filled up by nominees/deputees of the State Govt. and the University of Jammu who are permanent employees of these organizations. Similarly, in LL.B. (3 Year Professional) and Diploma in Business Management, two (2) seats each, will be filled up by permanent employees of the University.

Explanation

Permanent employees of the University to be deputed for the programmes (referred at (C) above), shall be nominated by the Vice- Chancellor for which he may seek advice of a Committee comprising Registrar and senior faculty members of the University.

10. ASSESSMENT IN ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORIES:

- (A) Credit for achievement in Sports, Cultural/ Literary Activities/ N.C.C./NSS / Bharat Scouts & Guides activities, i.e. reserved categories (9) and (10) at Statute 5 shall be given to a candidate seeking admission under these Reserved Categories as per Statute 12 below, subject to the following conditions
 - (i) Credit shall accrue only for those events/activities in which the candidate has participated during the three (3) years tenure of the qualifying degree when he has remained a regular student on the rolls of a College/Institution at the Under-Graduate level; in case of admission to M.Ed./M.P.Ed/M.Lib.I.Sc Course, on the basis of B.Ed./B.P.Ed/B.Lib.I.Sc which is qualifying Degree. Extra time spent for the qualifying degree and achievement during that period in the above activities will not fetch any credit and thus, shall not count in determining comparative merit of the candidates.
 - (ii) Credit for being active in the field of Sports to a candidate shall be given only for those games/sports* which the University recognizes/participates at various levels.
 * See Annexure VI-A & VI-B.
 - (iii) A candidate applying for consideration under the Reserved Categories mentioned above must accumulate an achievement score of at least12 points/marks for three years of qualifying degree, 08 points/marks in case of 2 years of qualifying degree and 04 points/marks in case of 1 year of qualifying degree in the respective fields.
 - (iv) Only such candidates shall be considered for admission under the Reserved Category (9) i.e. Sports/Cultural & Literary activities, who have not attained the age of 25 years on September 1 of the year in which the admission is being sought as per requirement of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU), New Delhi.
 - (v) The Department/School where a candidate is applying under Achievement Categories Sports/Cultural and N.C.C./National Services Scheme/ Bharat Scouts and Guides has been a regular student during the 3/2/1 year tenure of the qualifying degree/diploma, should maintain a record of participation and performance by the candidates in these activities to be signed by Teacher incharge of the activity and the Principal concerned. One counterfoil of the record is retained in the College and the other being sent to Sports/Cultural and N.C.C./N.S.S. wing of the university every quarter of the year so that claims of the candidates, if need be, could be verified.
 - (vi)
 - a. Under the Cultural/ Literary activities category, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying degree from the University of Jammu and has been awarded at least a certificate of merit in a competition organized by University of Jammu such as Display your Talent, the second preference shall be given to the domicile candidate who has passed qualifying degree from the university other than University of Jammu and have participated/awarded prizes in Zonal/National Competition organized by AIU and the third preference shall be given to the non-domicile candidate who has qualified from a University other than the University of Jammu and has participated / awarded prizes in Zonal / National Competitions organized by AIU.

- b. Under the sports category, the first preference shall be given to the candidate who has passed his/her qualifying degree from University of Jammu and has represented the University of Jammu in an Inter-University North Zone competition recognized by A.I.U./B.C.C.I, PROVIDED that if for unavoidable reason(s) the University cancels the participation of its duly selected team for such a competition, the player selected shall be deemed to have represented the University. The second preference shall be given to the domicile candidate who has passed qualifying degree from the university other than University of Jammu and has represented the concerned University in an Inter-University North Zone competition recognized by A.I.U./B.C.C.I, and the third preference shall be given to the non-domicile candidate who has qualified from a University other than the University of Jammu and has represented the University in an Inter-University North Zone competition recognized by A.I.U./B.C.C.I.
- c. Under NSS/Bharat Scouts and Guides/NCC first preference shall be given to the candidates who have qualified degree from University of Jammu and have participated in the activities organized by University of Jammu. The second preference shall be given to the domicile holders who have passed qualifying degree from the university other than University of Jammu, subject to participation in RD/Pre RD/National Integration Camp. And the third preference shall be given to non domicile candidate who has passed qualifying degree from the University other than the University of Jammu, subject to the participation in RD/Pre RD/National Integration Camp.

The talented applicants from the other universities of Jammu province who have participated in the international events, shall also be considered under first preference.

- (vii) The candidate seeking admission under Achievement Category shall have to furnish an affidavit (Annexure II) at the time of admission to the effect that he/she shall continue to take part in respective Achievement Category for which the candidate has taken the benefit of admission till he or she is otherwise eligible for participation; falling which, his/her admission shall be liable to be cancelled. For this purpose, he/she has to secure a certificate from the concerned office for seeking admission in the subsequent year/years.
- (B) The marks/points for achievement in Sports/Cultural and Literary, and N.C.C./National Services Scheme/ Bharat Scouts and Guides fields shall be calculated by a Committee to be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor in consultation with the Dean Academic Affairs, whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding on the candidates.

Separate marks/points for Achievement in each event/activity mentioned in the Schedule given hereinafter, shall be awarded on the basis of relevant certificate(s) submitted by a candidate applying under the Non Convertible Seats Categories (9) sub-categories (a) Sports, (b) Cultural and Literary activities) and (10) sub-categories (a) N.C.C., (b) National Services Scheme(NSS)/ Bharat Scouts and Guides). Achievement in an event/ activity participated in more than once, shall also be awarded separately. All these achievements, however, MUST pertain only to the 3/2/1 year tenure of the qualifying degree/diploma spent as a regular student. Also, each relevant certificate shall be evaluated ONLY for the event/activity for which it has been issued, (See Statute 12).

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11. ELIGIBILITY FOR ONGOING POST GRADUATE DEGREE / DIPLOMA/B.Lib&I.Sc/B.Ed/B.P.Ed/LLB (3 Yrs) PROGRAMMES: Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clauses, admission to the programme of study shall be done on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG-2023) conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA) subject to the ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS prescribed for various programmes of study as given under:

13. MERIT DETERMINATION:

Admission to PG/ PG Diploma/ B.Lib.I.Sc/B.P.Ed/B.Ed/LLB (3 Yrs) programme of study in a Teaching Department of the University of Jammu, Main Campus/ Offsite Campuses and Affiliated Colleges shall be made on the basis of the Common University Entrance Test (CUET-PG), conducted by National Testing Agency (NTA), by the Admission Committee of the concerned Department. 100 % weightage shall be given to the CUET-PG Score EXCEPT for candidates applying under Achievement Categories.

Inter-se-merit of a candidate seeking admission of a programme of study in a teaching department, shall be determined by the concerned Admission Committee and where necessary, in consultation with the committee constituted to assess Achievement In Reserved Categories of Sports/ Cultural & Literary and N.C.C./N.S.S/Bharat Scouts & Guides activities.

(A) ACADEMIC MERIT AS SELECTION CRITERION (IN CASE OF NON-CUET CANDIDATES): The criteria to determine merit shall be as follows:

The Academic Merit of the candidate shall be calculated on the basis of total marks obtained in all the semesters in BA/ B.Sc/ B.Com/ BBA/ BCA etc. course examination, (Semester I to Semester VI put together) under 10+2+3/4 pattern.

EXPLANATION:

 a) Merit of a candidate who has passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./B.C.A/Honours & General course examination (General, 10+2+3 pattern) from any other University shall be calculated in the manner prescribed above. b) The tie between candidates seeking admission shall be resolved by reference to the aggregate marks in the Semester VI/Final year of the Qualifying Examination & if the tie still persists then, to their higher marks in Semester IV/Part II of the said Examination. Higher marks in the said examination shall determine priority in Admission.

(B) SELECTION CRITERIA FOR ACHIEVEMENT CATEGORIES:

Merit of the candidates applying under Achievement Categories of Sports/Cultural & Literary, and NCC/NSS/ Bharat Scouts and Guides activities as specified at Statute 5 shall be determined on the basis of composite score:

(i) marks/points awarded to such a candidate for these activities, plus

(ii) one-fourth 1/4th of the PERCENTAGE of the CUET Score (for CUET candidates or 1/4th of the percentage of the total marks at the UG level (for Non-CUET candidates).

The composite score thus calculated, shall form the basis of admission,

PROVIDED that the candidate seeking admission has not been admitted to any programme of study in the University in an earlier session under the aforesaid reserved categories.

PROVIDED also, that where candidates have obtained equal composite score, the tie shall be resolved by reference to their Achievement Merit in the respective activity determined as per Statute. Higher achievement merit shall determine priority in Admission.

14. ORDER OF ADMISSION:

Subject to fulfillment of eligibility criteria and other conditions prescribed for a course of study, admission in a teaching department of the University shall first be given to a candidate who:

(i) has passed in the qualifying examination from the University of Jammu OR

(ii) is a permanent resident/domicile of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu but has passed in the qualifying examination or an equivalent examination from a University other than the University of Jammu; OR

(iii) is an employee of the Central or a State Government or a Public Undertaking or any other organisation recognised for the purpose by the Syndicate, posted

within the territorial jurisdiction of the University or son/daughter/spouse of such an employee; OR

(iv) is not permanent resident/domicile of the territorial jurisdiction of the University of Jammu, but has passed in B.A./ B.Sc./ B.Com./ B.B.A/ B.C.A. (General or Honours examination, 10+2+3 pattern) with not less than 60% marks from a University other than the University of Jammu, subject to the condition that the number of seats under this category shall not exceed 10% of the total number of seats available in a programme of study.

Note:

i. After making admission of students falling under Statute 14(A) if seats in any course of study remain vacant these shall be open to such other candidates who have passed in the qualifying examination from any recognised University provided they have applied in time and are otherwise eligible.

ii. In view of rampant reports of fake certificates and fake Universities, the University reserves the right of screening applicants seeking admission who have obtained their qualifying degrees from Universities other than the University of Jammu/Board of School Education, and evaluating their competence before considering them

for admission in a manner as would be notified by the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs from time to time.

III. In pursuance of the decision taken by the Standing Committee of the Academic Council at its meeting held on 5th September 2005 vide Notification No.F.Acd/V/128/05/6368-6517 dated 05/10/2005 and Academic Council at its meeting held on 11/09/2013 vide Notification No.F.Acd/11/13/9362-9521 dated 22/10/2013, any course run by Study Centres/franchises of any University in the Country except IGNOU and Maulana Azad national Urdu University (MANNU), is not recognised.

No course will be run, for the session, in the University of Jammu/ Offsite Campuses if the number of students admitted is less than 5 (five). For non Government affiliated Colleges/ Institutions, no course will be allowed to run for the session, if the number of students are less than 20 or less than

50% of the sanctioned intake of the College/ Course (whichever is lower).

- 15. Unless otherwise provided for in these Statutes, a person after having passed in the B.A/B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A / B.C.A. (General Examination, 10+2+3 pattern) or an examination recognised equivalent thereto, seeks admission for the first time to a Post-Graduate programme or a Diploma Course in a department of study of the University shall be given preference over a person who has already undergone any Post-Graduate Course or LL.B. (Professional 3 Years) programme in any University. However, this shall not be applicable to PG programmes viz: LLM/M.Lib/MPEd/M.Ed/M.Tech.
- 16. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Statutes, a student who having fallen short of attendance for reasons beyond his/her control becomes ineligible to appear in the University examination shall be considered for re-admission in the next consecutive year in the same programme of study in which he/she fell short of lectures in the preceding year along-with those who apply for admission to a programme of study in the University for the first time. This concession shall be available to a candidate only once.

17.

- (i) The University may, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions, consider the admission of one candidate in each programme belonging to Kashmiri migrant families, in the order of merit, not exceeding one in a particular programme, provided that such a candidate produces documentary evidence of belonging to a family registered as Kashmiri migrant subject to production of the said Certificate from the Relief Commissioner. Such admission may be authorised by the Dean Academic Affairs against a seat which shall be over and above in a programme of study in the department.
- (ii) The University may, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions consider the admission of one candidate in each programme belonging to the wards (Son/daughter) of permanent employees of the University of Jammu (Teaching/ Non-Teaching), in order of merit, not exceeding one in a particular programme. Such admission may be authorised by the Dean Academic Affairs against a seat which shall be over and above in a programme of study in the Department subject to the production of a certificate to this effect to be issued by the Registrar.
- (iii) The University may, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions consider the admission of SINGLE GIRL CHILD in each programme, in order of merit, not exceeding one in a particular programme, provided that such a candidate produces documentary evidence and an affidavit duly sworn in before the First Class Magistrate for being single girl child. Such admission may be authorized by the Dean Academic Affairs against a seat which shall be over and above in a programme of study in the Department.
- (iv) The University may, subject to fulfillment of eligibility conditions consider the admission under the Economically Weaker Section (EWSs) of society, are only for those who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservations for the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribe, Socially and Economically Backward Classes etc. The reservation would be in addition to the existing reservation and subject to a maximum of 10% of the prescribed in-take capacity in each programme/ Course. These seats (EWSs) shall not be convertible ie. if the seat/s under this category remains vacant in any programme, it shall not be converted to Open or any other category. The definition of economically weaker sections shall be such as may be notified by the State /UT from time to time on the basis of family income and other indicators of economic disadvantage.
- 18. Any person in employment or self employment or engaged in a business or profession, is not eligible for admission to any whole time programme i.e, a programme conducted during the day time, in the University teaching departments. Such a person may, however, be considered for admission, PROVIDED that:
 - if in employment, he/she will produce a certificate from his/her employer that the employer has no objection to his/her pursuing a whole time programme in the University, and that the employee is on authorised leave for the purpose of study in the University;
 - (ii) If self employed or engaged in a business or a profession, he/she will give a written undertaking to devote his/her whole time for studies as a student during the period he/she remains on rolls of the University teaching department and he/she shall not engage in any business or profession or a vocation during this period or engage in any activity which is likely to interfere with his/her studies in the University. Such cases will be examined by the Admission Committee which will make appropriate recommendations to the Dean Academic Affairs

EXPLANATION: All programmes shall be treated as whole time programmes of study, except if provided otherwise.

19. CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

Each candidate who is granted admission shall not take up any employment or engage in any business or profession so long as he/she is on the rolls of the University. Any student who takes up an employment or engages in business or profession in violation of the Statutes, his/her name shall be struck off from the rolls of the teaching department of the University.

- 20. The Admission Committee concerned, with the approval of the Dean Academic Affairs, shall have the authority to refuse or cancel admission of a candidate/student who:
 - either fails to produce the requisite certificate in original within the time prescribed or provides information in his/her application form which is found incorrect or produces a certificate which is not genuine.
 - (ii) in the opinion of the Admission Committee, has taken up employment or a vocation which is likely to interfere with his/her studies in the University.
 - (iii) fails to pay the fees and deposits including Hostel fees and deposits, within the time prescribed by the Warden of the Hostel concerned.
 - (iv) Indulges in anti-national activities/ Ragging.
- 21. The Head of the Department shall be competent to cancel admission of a student enrolled for a programme of study in the department if the student remains absent without permission of the Head of the Department concerned for a period of 15 days continuously and/or attend less than 50% of the total lectures delivered in the Semester concerned.

PROVIDED that before cancellation of admission, the concerned Head of the Department will provide an opportunity to such a candidate to explain within 07 days why action be not taken against him/her.

22. NOTIFICATION AND FEE:

Names of the candidates selected for admission shall be declared online on the University Admission website from time to time. The candidates shall be required to keep in touch to the said website for day to day notifications and comply with the instructions given in all respects failing which their selection shall be cancelled and no complaint will be entertained in this regard.

23. ADMISSION FEE AND OTHER CHARGES

payable by each student selected for admission to a programme of study shall be such as may be prescribed from time to time. Provided that if a student having been admitted to a programme in a teaching department and having deposited the required fees is selected subsequently, in the same session, in any other department of the University, shall be allowed transfer of fee deposited by him/her, by the Admission Committee.

24. REFUND OF FEE:

If a student having been admitted to a programme discontinues, deduction of fee deposited shall be as under:

Note:

- (a) In case of (1) above not more than 5% of the fees paid by the student, subject to a maximum of Rs. 1000 (Rupees One Thousand only), will be deducted as processing charges;
- (b) The last date of admission shall be the date of admission as permitted to the appellants in the meeting of the Appellate Committee.

25. CONTINUED ENROLMENT:

A regular student who after having passed all the prescribed courses of I and II or IV or V Semester examinations of Degree Programme discontinues his/her study for good and sufficient reasons to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department concerned, may be considered for admission to III or IV or V or VI Semester of the course, as the case may be,

PROVIDED that not more than one year has elapsed after his/her having passed. I and II OR III OR IV OR V Semester examination in the concerned programme of study. Such a break shall be allowed only once during a programme of study.

PROVIDED further that such a student will have to opt courses which are prescribed for the session to which admission is being sought unless it leads to repetition of any course(s) of the Programme of study.

26. If as a result of re-evaluation, a candidate passes in the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./BBA/BCA Part-III/Semester VI examination, he/she shall be considered for admission in a Teaching Department only if seat/s is/are available and the merit of such a candidate is higher than that of the candidate who is at the top of the waiting list of the concerned teaching department.

Provided further that no admission shall be made in the teaching department of the University after 07 days after the meeting of the Appellate Committee. The attendance of a candidate who is granted admission under the statute shall be counted from the date of his/her admission.

27. PERIOD OF STAY:

No student can remain on rolls in the teaching departments of the University exceeding the period indicated against each, if he/she has pursued more than one programme of study

i) Master's Degree Programme and Diploma Programme:	4 year
ii) Master Degree & LL.B:	6 year
iii) LL.B (Professional) & Diploma Programme:	5 Year
iv) B.A. LL.B (5 year) & Diploma Programme:	7 year
v) B.A. LL.B (5 year) & Master Degree:	8 year

EXPLANATION:

- (i) Stay in the University would mean stay in all teaching departments of the University put together,
- (ii) 4/5/6/7/8 years would include the period required for completion of the programme in which admission is sought.
- (iii) Admission of a candidate who has already pursued two Master Degree Programmes OR Ph.D / M.Phil Programme is / are not eligible to seek admission to another PG/Diplome Programme.

28. INTERPRETATION OF STATUTES

There shall be a Committee consisting of the following members to interpret these Statutes whose decision shall be final and binding.

- i) Dean Academic Affairs (Chairman/Chairperson)
- Deans of Faculties of Arts, Social Sciences, Education, Business Studies, Mathematical Sciences, Law, Science and Life Sciences
- iii) Registrar
- Asstt / Dy. Registrar, Academic Affairs (Member Secretary)

Majority of the members shall form the quorum.

29. STUDENT AID FUND

The University has also adopted a scheme called Student-Aid Fund under which Financial Assistance is extended to poor and needy students belonging to low income group families as per Regulations/ Guidelines for Students' Aid Fund:

The following factors shall determine the eligibility of the students for the benefits out of the fund:

- The family income slab shall be upto Rs 20,000/- per month.
- ii) The cap of Students Aid Fund shall be Rs 15,000/- per student.

- iii) Social backwardness and factors like a student coming from rural or comparatively inaccessible areas;
- iv) The student must be having a BPL Ration Card.
- v) The HOD concerned shall recommend upto 05 applications of the students after conducting initial screening through the DAC.
- vi) The student/s must be regular in attendance, maintain proper discipline in the campus and the HOD is satisfied about his/her progress in studies. (Certificate in this context has to be attached along with application)

30. PERMISSION FOR PRACTICALS TO PRIVATE CANDIDATES:

A Science Department may accord permission to members of the Laboratory Staff of the University of Jammu, and such Teachers who hold at least 5 years of teaching experience in a school recognized by the J&K government, to perform the required number of practicals to earn eligibility for appearing in the Master's Degree Examination as a Private Candidate subject to the fulfillment of eligibility criteria and other conditions prescribed for a Programme of Study. Required teaching experience certificate issued/endorsed by the Director, School Education, Jammu will have to be enclosed with the application form.

This permission may be granted to one candidate each year on the basis of merit. This facility will not encreach upon the number of seats meant for open merit category. If any seat falls vacant after the last date of admission, that may also be used for granting similar permission to the other beneficiaries in the above category and the Scientific Staff of the Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine, Jammu (Erstwhile Regional Research Laboratory, Jammu) in accordance with the Statute provided that such a permission shall not be granted after one week of the close of admission.

NOTE:

All admitted students have to submit an online undertaking at the start of the session every year to the effect that he/she shall not indulge in any ragging activity and shall abide all University rule and regulations at www.antiragging.in

31. INTERNATIONAL/ FOREIGN STUDENTS ADMISSION POLICY

INTRODUCTION: National Education Policy (NEP) - 2020 has emphasised that India is committed towards revamping and reinvigorating the higher education system by taking its rightful place amongst the best higher education systems in the world. The NEP extensively focuses on attaining the highest global standards in the quality of higher education. Further, it reinforces the need to attract a greater number of international students and achieve the goal of "internationalisation at home" which means integrating the dimensions of international learning environment within our higher education institutions. This policy appreciates the critical need to promote India as a "global study destination providing premium education at affordable costs thereby helping to restore its role as "Vishwa Guru".

University of Jammu is an A+ University and ranks among the top 100 universities in the country. Besides, Commonwealth University Ranking (CWUR) has recently listed the University of Jammu among the top 2000 global universities. Keeping in mind the interest among the foreign students for their admission in Indian universities in general and University of Jammu in particular the students from abroad including Foreign Nationals, Non-Resident Indian (NRI) and Persons of Indian Origin (PIO) will be admitted to the University of Jammu subject to the fulfilment of their eligibility under different graduate, post graduate and doctoral programmes. The candidates shall have to meet the eligibility conditions for admission as laid down for the respective undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral (Ph. D.) programmes.

A. MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

The medium of instruction at University of Jammu is ENGLISH only for all the courses except those which have defined script and instructions.

B. COURSES OFFERED, ELIGIBILITY AND ACADEMIC QUALIFICATIONS

All Programmes of Study running at The Main Campus as well as Offsite Campuses of the University of Jammu

Eligibility: The students having qualification recognized as equivalent by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) are eligible for admission to various academic programme in the University as per the following norms:



- (i) A candidate shall have completed 18 years of age on or before 31st December each year;
- (ii) Foreign national having passed the qualifying examination from any reorganized Indian/foreign School / Universities shall only be considered.
- (iii) Student migrating/transferring from other University in India, have to produce the Migration Certificate within the two months of reporting to be considered for final admission.

NOTE:Submitting appropriate documents in time is the responsibility of the student and no complaint or excuse will be entertained thereafter, and the University will not be responsible for any losses incurred in any case and in any form. For other details please refer to the University of Jammu website http://www.jammuuniversity.ac.in

Seats: Maximum 10% Supernumerary seats as of the sanctioned intake capacity of the various programme of the University shall be offered to the Foreign Students. However, the number of these seats can be increased with the prior approval of the competent authority.

C. CATEGORIES OF ADMISSIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

The following categories of foreign students can seek admission in different courses offered by the University of Jammu in the following order of preference.

- Foreign Students under Cultural Exchange Fellowship Programme, ICCR, Government of India Candidates seeking admission under a Cultural Exchange Fellowship programme by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) are required to apply through the Indian High Commission/Embassy in their respective countries. In case the applicant is found suitable for admission, the admission offer letter will be sent to the candidate through the Indian Council for Cultural Relations, New Delhi

D. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Applications from self financing foreign nationals for admission to the various undergraduate, postgraduate and doctoral programmes at the University of Jammu shall be received directly by the Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu every year by the end of March for the session commencing in July/August of that year. For doctoral (Ph.D.) Programme, applications may be made latest by end of June for the session commencing from October of the year. The interested foreign nationals will submit their complete curricula vitae and credentials with regard to their academic qualifications indicating clearly the following details with all supporting documents:

- i) Proof of clearance from Ministry of Education MoE / Ministry of External Affairs MEA, GOI as applicable.
- ii)Proof of all educational qualifications (10+2, Schooling and Pre-university studies)
- iii) Duration of the undergraduate programme/qualifying examination completed
- iv) Class obtained/Percentage of marks where marks are awarded
- v)Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) where grades are awarded
- vi) Transcripts of all the courses cleared in the undergraduate /qualifying examination (with explanation of assigned grades)
- Proof of English proficiency (A certificate indicating that the undergraduate courses are taken in English or IELTS Academic score of 5.0 and above or equivalent)

- viii) Two recommendation letters either from faculty members who have taught the applicant earlier or persons under whom the applicant may have worked.
- ix) Scanned copy of relevant passport pages showing nationality and personal details
- x)Statement of purpose (one page maximum) for Ph.D. programme.
- xi) Applicants are requested to attach a MEDICAL FITNESS CERTIFICATE from a doctor attesting to their physical and medical fitness
- xii) Two (2) passport size coloured photographs.

The online/offline applications containing detailed information and particulars as stated above along with relevant supporting documents should be submitted to Director, Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu, Jammu 180 006 (INDIA). The admission will be subject to clearance from the Govt. of India, New Delhi. The University of Jammu does not charge application/processing fees from foreign applicants.

E. MODES OF ADMISSIONS:

(i) Students under cultural exchange fellowship programme

Applications received for various undergraduate, Postgraduate and doctoral Programmes from foreign nationals/NRI/PIO, routed through the Indian High Commissions/Embassies, or the Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) as the case may be, will be considered for admission.

(ii) Students under Memorandum of Understanding

This provision shall be available only for admission to doctoral (Ph.D) Programmes. Admission of foreign nationals to the Ph.D. programme at the University of Jammu, under the Memorandum of Understanding, will be made in accordance with the terms and conditions spelt out in the MOU agreed between University of Jammu and the foreign country / University / Institution concerned.

(iii) Self Financing Foreign National Students

This provision is available for admission to undergraduate, Postgraduate and doctoral Programmes. Applicants can directly apply to the Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu subject to the clearance of MEA/ MHA as mentioned in section G.

In all the above-mentioned modes, the University of Jammu will examine each application in accordance with its prescribed eligibility criteria as mentioned in section B and documentation as mentioned in section D. If the applicant is found eligible, he/she will be admitted to the desired programme, as per the rules and guidelines of the University of Jammu, which will be binding on him/her.

F. SELECTION CRITERIA / ADMISSION COMMITTEES

Selection Criteria: Foreign candidates shall be exempted from the Jammu University Entrance Test (JUET). However, they have to qualify a basic proficiency test followed by personal interview as devised and deemed appropriate by the concerned Teaching Department of the University.

The admission to foreign nationals shall be finalised by the following admission committees:

1. Centralised Admission Committee for Foreign Students (UG/PG)

Dean Academic Affairs; Dean of the concerned Faculty; Head of the concerned Department; Director, Office for International Affairs; Deputy/ Assistant Registrar, Academic Affairs

2. Centralised Admission Committee for Foreign Students (Doctoral Programmes)

Dean, Research Studies; Dean of the concerned Faculty; Head of the concerned Department; Director, Office for International Affairs; Deputy/ Assistant Registrar, Research & Award

Admission offers will be made based on the recommendation of the concerned Admission Committee and the admission offer letters shall be communicated by the Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu.

ADMISSION-CUM-COUNSELLING COMMITTEE / INTERPRETATION COMMITTEE & APPELLATE COMMITTEE SHALL BE THE SAME AS NOTIFIED FOR THE VARIOUS REGULAR COURSES OF THE UNIVERSITY

G. VISA AND NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE

Only persons with the purpose of studying in India and entering the country on STUDENT VISA shall be eligible to apply for admission to a particular course. Foreign students seeking admission to Ph.D. programmes must obtain RESEARCH VISA from the MEA / Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.

Every foreign student intending to gain admission into research programmes such as Ph. D. must obtain a "No Objection Certificate" (NOC) (No need of NOC for UG and PG courses) from the Ministry of External affairs (MEA), Government of India, One can apply for an NOC from Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) Government of India while applying to the University by sending a copy of the filled-in 'Application Form for Admission Eligibility' with the required enclosures. Otherwise they can wait till they get their 'Provisional Admission Letter' and then only apply to the MoE, Government of India with a copy of the 'Provisional Admission Letter'. Without the NOC from MEA, they cannot procure 'Research Visa' and consequently, the University cannot finalize their admission.

NOTE: This condition does not, however, apply to the international students sponsored by ICCR, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, since all these students will be issued 'Research Visa' at the time of their departure to India.

H. FEE STRUCTURE

All selected Self Sponsored foreign students for different programmes will be required to pay a prescribed tuition fees in addition to the regular fee to be paid by the local students. The food/Mess charges are not covered under the prescribed fee and shall be borne by the candidate.

The candidate will be required to pay the fees at the time of registration. The fee can be transferred in to the account of the Director, Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu, Jammu -180 006 INDIA. The candidate is required to ensure his eligibility, fitness and documentation support for his admission to avoid any future inconvenience. The students selected under cultural exchange programme shall be required to pay a prescribed tuition fees in addition to the regular fee to be paid by the local students. The food/Mess charges are not covered under the prescribed fee and shall be borne by the candidate.

I. GENERAL GUIDELINES

All the interested foreign candidates seeking admission in the University of Jammu must read the rules, regulations and conditions for admission carefully before signing and submitting their applications and documents. No change in the application form would be allowed once the final application is submitted. Please note that the signature of a foreign student comes as an undertaking as part of process and it is mandatory to follow all the rules and regulations as laid down by the University of Jammu from time to time. It is compulsory to maintain the same email and telephone number throughout and during the application process. Any inconvenience or loss of communication will be responsibility of the applicant. No excuse or complaint in this regard would be entertained.

Please note that provisional admission does not guarantee final admission to course. The admissions will be granted based on the merit and the number of seats available for the said course. The admission will be confirmed only on reporting of the candidate to the University and Department with original documents, eligibility form (shall be provided at the time of enrolment) and eligibility is cleared by verifying the documents (academic and visa stay documents). Acquiring appropriate visa is the responsibility of the student and reporting without appropriate visa will not be considered for enrolment.

The candidates must ensure that all their documents bear exact name as is written in their passports and academic records. Documents must be written in English or be official certified translations approved by the authorities. For further details please contact at: The Director, Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu, Jammu-180006 (India) Email: directoroia@jammuuniversity.ac.in

Rules and Regulations:

For admission process, all the applicants are required to submit all the relevant photocopies of the documents, including passport and the photograph. After preliminary verifying the documents, provisional admission letter would be issued with the condition that the final admission letter would be given only after confirmation of the eligibility. Provisional admission letter along with required documents could be used for obtaining appropriate student/research visa from the Indian Embassy in respective countries. It is to be noted that final admission will be considered and granted only when the candidate reports with appropriate student/research visa endorsed for University of Jammu. Research visa is mandatory for reporting to the University in case of a Ph.D. student. The provisional admission letter does not warrant admission to the said course in the university. On arrival in University of Jammu, the candidates need to submit and verify their original documents (including passport, student/ research visa, academic documents) at Office for International Affairs in University of Jammu for initiating the admission process.

The international student who's last degree is from a foreign country (outside India) has to produce Association of Indian Universities (AIU) equivalence certificate for the qualifying degree which could be obtained from AIU either prior to submitting the application or after reporting to the University within the period of two months or else the admission will be deemed cancelled. In case a student migrating/transferring from other University in India, it is mandatory to produce the Migration Certificate within the two months of reporting to be considered for final admission. Submitting appropriate documents in time is the responsibility of the student and no complaint or excuse will be entertained thereafter, and the University will not be responsible for any losses incurred in any case and in any form. On arrival in India or University of Jammu, it is necessary to complete the registration process in the "Foreigners Registration Office (FRO)" within 14 days from the date of arrival. The Office for

International Affairs, University of Jammu will only provide the required documents for the process only on reporting with original documents and verification of the same. University will not be responsible for any delay in reporting to and registration in FRO, Jammu. One time full payment of academic and other fees will have to be paid at the time of joining or in advance from the beginning of the academic year for enrolled students. Please note that, the fees including tuition fees once paid would not be refunded in any case.

Procuring Medical insurance from the date of reporting till valid period of the course is mandatory and has to be procured before or immediately of arrival in India. It is mandatory for all the foreign students to strictly follow the rules and regulation stipulated by the University from time to time. Violation of rules and regulations would result in strict action against the concerned student which might lead to cancellation of the admission and no excuses/objection in this matter would be entertained and the student would be responsible for the consequences.

It is responsibility of the students to submit the updated documents in Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu like change in residence, address, Residential permit, etc. Document with Prior permission from concerned Guide/Head of Department has to be submitted to Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu in case student/Research Scholar is visiting other city for academic/personal reasons during the academic year. Any discrepancy in the record will be reported to the nearest police station, FRO Jammu and respective Embassy for record purpose as per the provisions of the law. Violation of visa rules would not be entertained in any case.

Once admitted for particular course in University of Jammu, it is the responsibility of the student to maintain the required attendance in the class as stipulated by UGC and University rules and regulations. Admissions will be cancelled for students not following the University rules. The students admitted in the university and residing in university hostel have to abide by the rules as per the University Hostel Guidelines available on website of University of Jammu (www.jammuuniversity.ac.in)

Admissions to all the postgraduate and undergraduate courses being offered in the university have been centralized and admission letters to International Students shall be issued by the Office for International Affairs, University of Jammu. An International student wishing to undertake Ph.D. or any other research degree in the University MUST have prior security clearance from the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi and MUST BE on "RESEARCH" visa endorsed to University of Jammu only.

DECLARATION BY THE CANDIDATE

I, declare that I fulfil the minimum eligibility requirements as prescribed by the University of Jammu for the admission to the programme of study for which I have applied. I further declare that entries made by me in this form and the documents submitted in support of the information furnished by me in the Application Form are true in all respects and in case any entry or information or documents are found to be false, this shall entail automatic cancellation of my admission besides rendering me liable to such action as the University may deem proper. I note that my admission to the University and my continuance on its rolls are subject to the provisions of the Statutes of the University of Jammu. In the event of my selection/joining the University I will pay the required fee and incidental charges and shall not ask for any financial assistance or waiver in fee during the tenure of the Programme of Study. I shall abide by the rules of discipline and proper conduct which may be framed in this regard.



To consider the matter w.r.t. introduction of Two Years Master's Degree Programme in Political Science in the Reasi Campus, University of Jammu from the Academic Session 2024-25.

NOTE:

The Reasi Campus of University of Jammu has been functioning in the district Reasi since 2007 with the objective of providing the higher education to the deserving students of the rural and far-flung areas of the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir. The Reasi Campus offers only one course i.e. Master Degree Programme (MDP) in Sociology since its inception. The Reasi Campus could not open any other courses due to the space constraints. As it seems now that our upcoming Campus buildings shall be completed soon and the newly constructed Campus shall be made functional. Since the Campus has sufficient space in order to cater more students. We could attract the students only in one stream till now due to space constraints but now there is no space constraints as the buildings are already constructed. Further, opening of the new course shall attract more students of the Reasi area to the Reasi Campus, University of Jammu.

Therefore, it has come to our attention to open new course in the Reasi Campus. In this aspect, it is observed that the subject of Political Science, an equally significant discipline, has not been offered as a regular Master's degree program course at any offsite Campuses as well as GDC Reasi.

There is a substantial interest among students at Reasi Campus to pursue higher education in Political Science. Currently, the students are compelled to migrate to the main campus or other places to pursue this discipline, causing inconvenience and added expenses. By offering a Master's degree program in Political Science, the same can fulfill the aspirations of these students and provide with an opportunity to specialize in this field closer to their home.

Political Science is the study of government, its policies, and the political behaviour of different organizations. A degree in political science is a gateway for you to lead a powerful career in state and local government or the organizations related to them. Candidates with a degree and great knowledge of political science can pursue a career in many fields such as law, journalism, marketing research, teaching, and civil services. This course will include entire spectrum of discipline such as Political Theory; Western & Indian Thought; International Relations & International Political Economy; International Organization and International Law; India's Foreign Policy; Comparative Politics and Politics in South Asia; Indian Politics, State Politics & Political Economy; Public Administration and Indian Administration and Politics in Jammu & Kashmir.

The opinion regarding employability potential of the said programme has been obtained from the Dean Students Placement which is reproduced below:

"the subject of Political Science has got multiplicated potential in various sectors such as Journalism, Law, Administrative services, Professional services in addition to that in Academics. Therefore, inception of Master's Degree Programme in Political Science is good concept at Reasi Campus as it would benefit the local students for pursuing their career."

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The Convener/Head, Department of Political Science, University of Jammu has opined that the Master's Degree Programme in Political Science in Reasi Campus may be started as proposed from the next academic session, however, the required infrastructure including Library and faculty should be in place before stating this programme."

The proposal was sent to the Dean, Planning and Development, University of Jammu in view of teaching, non-teaching staff and infrastructure in the Reasi Campus and the Dean, Planning and Development has stated that the Master's Degree Programme in Political Science in Reasi Campus, University of Jammu may be started as proposed from the next academic session, keeping in view the fact that adequate infrastructure is available in the Campus and it needs to be put to optimal nor. The request for non-teaching positions has already been sent to Higher Education Department through office of the Registrar, which also include Reasi Campus (Annexure-I). The detailed proposal is placed as Annexure-II.

Moreover, the Statutes for Master's Degree Programme under CBCS and Syllabus offered in the Main Campus shall be applicable for the Reasi Campus.

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Introduction about Reasi Campus

The Reasi campus of University of Jammu has been functioning in the district Reasi since 2007 with the objective of providing the higher education to the deserving students of the rural and far-flung areas of the Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir. The Reasi Campus offers only Master Degree Programme (MDP) in Sociology since its inception. The Reasi Campus has introduced CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) from the last academic session 2021-22. Presently, the campus is running in the DIET complex at Reasi. The new upcoming Reasi Campus is being constructed approximately in 63 Acres of land at village Jadh, Reasi, which is comprised of an Academic block, Girl's and Boy's hostel. The newly constructed campus is near completion and likely to be made functional soon in future.

Course Overview and its implementation in Reasi Campus

I am writing to present proposal on behalf of the faculty, staff, and students of Reasi Campus and requesting the introduction of a Master's degree program in Political Science at our institution.

Firstly, I would like to commend the continuous efforts of the University of Jammu in expanding educational opportunities and fostering academic excellence in the region. Since its establishment in 2007, Reasi Campus has been operating successfully, catering primarily to the field of Sociology through the existing Master's degree program. By introducing a Master's degree program in Political Science at Reasi Campus, we can provide a comprehensive education in the field and meet the increasing demand for qualified professionals in political analysis, governance and public administration.

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Justification for the introduction of M.A. Political Science in Reasi Campus, University of Jammu:

We have several reasons to support the implementation of this program at Reasi Campus:

- 1. Academic Demand: There is a substantial interest among students at Reasi Campus to pursue higher education in Political Science. Currently, the students are compelled to migrate to the main campus or other places to pursue this discipline, causing inconvenience and added expenses. By offering a Master's degree program in Political Science, we can fulfil the aspirations of these students and provide them with an opportunity to specialize in this field closer to their home.
- 2. Regional Relevance: The region of Reasi and its surrounding areas have witnessed significant political developments in recent years. - 3. We could attract the students only in one stream till now due to space constraints but now there is no space constraints as the buildings are already constructed. Further, opening of the new course shall attract more students of the Reasi area to the Reasi Campus, JU.
- 4. Interdisciplinary Opportunities: The introduction of a Master's program in Political Science at Reasi Campus will encourage interdisciplinary collaboration between Sociology and Political Science departments. This synergy will enable students to gain a more comprehensive understanding of societal and political issues, leading to a holistic approach to their research and analysis.

In light of the above factors, we kindly request your favourable consideration and support for the initiation of two years Master's degree program in Political Science at Reasi Campus. We are confident that this step will not only contribute to the academic growth of our institution but also create new opportunities for the students and facilitate the overall development of the region.

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We are prepared to work closely with the university administration, faculty, and staff to ensure the smooth implementation of this program. Furthermore, we are committed to meeting all the necessary requirements, including faculty recruitment, infrastructure development, and curriculum design, to maintain the high standards that the University of Jammu is known for. Therefore, it is proposed that the Post-Graduate Department of Political Science may be opened at the Reasi Campus of University of Jammu from the academic session 2024-25.

Scope of Political Science

Political science is the study of government, its policies, and the political behaviour of different organizations. A degree in political science is a gateway for you to lead a powerful career in state and local government or the organizations related to them. Candidates with a degree and great knowledge of political science can pursue a career in many fields such as law, journalism, marketing research, teaching, and civil services. This course will include entire spectrum of discipline such as Political Theory; Western & Indian Thought; International Relations & International Political Economy; International Organization and International Law; India's Foreign Policy; Comparative Politics and Politics in South Asia; Indian Politics, State Politics & Political Economy; Public Administration and Indian Administration and Politics in Jammu & Kashmir.

Objectives and Learning Outcomes

The revision of curriculum of Master Degree Programme is done keeping in view its objectives and learning outcomes. The broader objectives of programme are to impart knowledge to the students in the foundational/core courses of discipline, applied dimension of politics at international, national, state and local levels and the dynamics of discipline of Political Science which have always been in the constant process of change in the context of changing time and space. The changing modes of politics at all the levels and thereby the nature of discipline of Political science have also been the objective of the curriculum. The Learning Outcomes Based Curriculum (LOBC) was one of the core considerations while revising the syllabus of Master Degree Programme. The learning outcomes of programme will enable the learners to develop an understanding about the universal principles, institutions, processes, actors, structures &

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structural differentiation, structural harmony and structural conflict. The curriculum revision intends to introduce greater degree of flexibility, inter-disciplinarily and comparability in the teaching learning and assessment of students learning levels. The learning outcomes of programme are spelled out in terms of sound knowledge base, critical thinking and comprehension ability, problem solving & communication skills, organizational behaviour & team work and professional integrity.

It is pertinent to mention that tourism and hospitality industry is a vibrant and growing both at the national and UT level with government laying emphasis on this sector. United Nations World Tourism Organization (UNWTO) recently laid emphasis on building adequate knowledge, skills and competencies among the local communities in order to leverage the benefits of the tourism sector. In Jammu & Kashmir tourism is a primary economic activity which has to potential to create entrepreneurs and also employment. It is therefore pertinent to introduce tourism as a subject at all levels of education so as to orient the younger generation about the benefits and impacts of this industry. Further, students undergoing this course at UG level will be more inclined to pursue higher studies in this discipline and shall seek admission at the University level.

At present, the colleges affiliated to University of Jammu are not offering tourism and travel management (TTM) at the UG level as the Four Year Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) as per National Education Policy 2020 of University of Jammu notified vide F.Acd/I/22/10083-10142 dated 23-11-2022 does not include Tourism and Travel Management (TTM) under the list of subject and disciplines offered from academic session 2022-2023. On the other hand, colleges affiliated to University of Kashmir are offering the subject as major/minor in accordance with their notification F(UG-Statutes-NEP-2020)/Acad/KU/23 dated 04-08-2023.

In light of this, Board of Studies in Hospitality and Tourism Management in its meeting held on October 9, 2023 proposed that Tourism and Travel Management may be included under the list of subjects and disciplines of FYUGP of University of Jammu and also introduced from academic session 2024-25. It was resolved that the matter may be placed in the Academic Council for approval. Upon approval, the BoS will prepare the detailed outline of the courses and syllabus for consideration and approval. The minutes of the Board of Studies is placed as **Annexure**.

Item 1: To confirm the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies in Hospitality and Tourism Management which was held on 04-05-2023

Resolved that the minutes of the meeting of the Board of Studies held on 15-03-2022 be confirmed.

Item 2: To discuss the syllabi and courses of study of MBA (TTM) for Master Degree Programme of Semester – Illrd and IVth under Choice Based Credit System.

The syllabi of Semester IIIrd and IVth was placed for discussion. It was proposed that content should incorporate additional industry specific knowledge and skills. Resolved that the same shall be incorporated and revised syllabus shall be placed in the next meeting of BoS for consideration and approval

Item 3: To formulate the syllabi and courses of studies in the subject of BBA(HM) Programme of Four Year Under Graduate Programme (FYUGP) as per NEP-2020 from the Academic Session 2024-25

The matter regarding inclusion of the Under Graduate Programme currently being run in the School of Hospitality and Tourism Management (SHTM), University of Jammu as part of Four Years Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) as per National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 with a new nomenclature BBA (TTM) in accordance with UGC Specification of Degrees Gazette notification dated July 5, 2014 was placed in the BoS (under Item 3). However, as per letter F.Acd./II/23/5747-5781 dated 27-06-2023 the same was not approved as per the remarks it is proposed that instead of BBA (TTM) the nomenclature be changed to Bachelors in Hotel Management (BHM).

The matter was placed in the BoS and a threadbare discussion was held. I was deliberated that since hotel management degree as a technical education comes under the purview of All India Council of Technical Education (AICTE), before beginning to offer it, AICTE approval and accreditation shall become mandatory. Similar issue was raised in Performance Audit Report under para 2.2.1 as per letter F.Acd./I/23/10384-10388 dated 22.9.2023 (Copy attached as Annexure - Å).

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The members further deliberated this keeping in view the AICTE norms as per their APH 2023-24. As per the norms, the requirement is to have Laboratory (Guest Room / House Keeping / Front Office / Kitchen) separately for the First year students and subsequent years. In addition Kitchen with Dining Hall (No – 1), Restaurant (No-2) are required for effective running of the courses. Further as per Appendix -7 the faculty requirement is 1:20, which will make it to a minimum seven (7) faculty members for SHTM for a four year program with an annual intake of 35 students (Refer Annexure - 8). At present the department does not have physical infrastructure as mentioned above and neither have any permanent faculty to teach the technical courses under hotel management.

In view of this, it was resolved that as proposed earlier the nomenclature of the current degree being offered should be changed to BBA (Tourism & Travel) from BBA (Hotel Management) instead of BHM. This will (Amagement)

- The UG degree shall be aligned with the PG Degree offered by SHTM which is Master of Business Administration (Tourism & Travel Management)
- The basic degree i.e. BBA shall remain the same and will be in the interest of the students who have passed earlier
- While the major courses under this programme have been proposed related to Tourism & Travel industry, the minor courses are related to Hospitality industry. A minimum of 20 credits (out of 120 credits) have been allocated to courses related to hotel management and hospitality sector. This will enable the student to have a holistic understanding of both the hospitality and tourism sector and hence enhance their employability and enable them to explore entrepreneurial opportunities.
- The students shall be oriented towards the proposed skills (Level 7) of NSQF framework identified by Tourism and Hospitality Sector Skills Council

However, the department should work towards creating infrastructure in accordance with the norms of AICTE and then consider starting an additional BHM degree.

The revised programme shall be governed as per the Statues Governing Four Years Under Graduate Programmes (FYUCP) as per National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 of University of Jammu as notified vide F.Acd/I/22/10083-10142 dated 23-11-2022.

Item 4: To review the syllabi and courses of studies in the subject of BBA(HM) for Semester I to VI under CBCS for the regular candidates for the examination to be held in the Academic Year 2023-24

Resolved that the existing syllabus & curriculum as approved by earlier BoS and currently in vogue shall be applicable for the failure and reappear candidates for the

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examination be held in 2023-24 onwards till the new curriculum and syllabus is adopted

Item 5: To prepare a panel of paper setters / examiners to be sent to the Controller of Examinations, University of Jammu

On the other hand, colleges affiliated to University of Kashmir are offering the subject as major / minor in accordance with their notification F(UG-Statutes-NEP-2020)/Acad/KU/23 dated 04-08-2023. (Augustus)

In light of this, it is proposed that Tourism and Travel Management may be included under the list of subjects and disciplines of FYUGP of University of Jammu and also introduced from academic session 2024-25. Resolved that the item may be placed in the Academic Council. Upon approval the detailed outline of the courses to be offered and the syllabus shall be prepared for consideration and approval.



The matter w.r.t. SPORTS POLICY for the outstanding sportsperson/s of the U.G and P.G Courses of the University of Jammu was placed before the Academic Council at its meeting held on 19.07.2023 and the Academic Council vide Resolution No. 3.26 resolved that –

"the matter be agreed in principle. A Committee comprising Prof. Neelu Rohmetra (Convener), Prof. Jasbir Singh, Dean Students Welfare, Director, Sports and Physical Education be constituted to re-examine and workout the detailed policy."

In pursuance of above resolution, a Committee was constituted under the convenership of Prof. Neelu Rohmetra, vide order No. F.Acd/I/23/9133-9138 dated 28.8.2023 to re-examine the Sports Policy.

The Committee in its meeting held on 05.12.2023 recommended as under:-

"The Committee discussed the draft Sports Policy in detail. After deliberations, members are of the opinion that the component of Part (a) pertaining to the admission of the candidates in various programmes based on the achievements in sports may not be included in the proposed Sports Policy, as it is not in sync with the existing practice of admitting students in other achievement categories i.e. NCC/NSS/Cultural etc. Therefore, the committee recommends that:-

 Component 'Part (a)' in the Sports Policy under reference may be dropped.

2) The other Components of Sports Policy from 'Part (b)' to 'Part (i)' may be adopted."

The recommendations of the said Committee have been approved by the Competent Authority.

As per the mandate, the Committee re-examined the proposed 'Sports Policy', which stands approved in principle in the Academic Council Meeting held on 19.7.2023.

After deliberations, members are of the opinion that the component of Part A pertaining to the admission of the candidates in various programmes based on the achievements in sports may not be included in the proposed Sports Policy, as it is not in sync with the existing practice of admitting students in other achievement categories i.e. NCC/ NSS/ Cultural etc. Therefore, the committee recommends that:-

- 1) Component 'Part A' in the Sports Policy under reference may be dropped.
- The other Components of Sports Policy from 'Part B' to 'Part I' may be adopted.

The meeting terminated with Vote of thanks to the Chair.

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Item: To consider the "SPORTS POLICY" for the outstanding sportsperson/s of the U.G and P.G Courses of the University of Jammu.

Background

As Sports is now a compulsory component according to National Education Policy. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India Shri Narendra Modi initiated various programmes in Sports-Khelo India Games, Drug Free India, Promoting Sports, Promoting Sports among females, Fit India campaign, etc in order to make India strong physically as well. Equal opportunity is given to the female sportsperson also. To attract the students towards sports and to make career opportunities in sports, the University of Jammu is going to make SPORTS POLICY that will surely benefitted the outstanding sportsperson/s.

Part (a) To award additional percentage /extra credits to outstanding sportsperson/s in addition to the final percentage secured in the examination during admission to P.G courses in order to enhance their overall percentage. The outstanding sportsperson/s must be given 10% and 5% additional percentage according to the level of participation as mentioned below.

The detail of the percentage to be enhanced during admission is as under:

Upto 18 marks per subject shall be awarded to the outstanding sportsperson/s who have different levels of participation and achievements by following the conditions as per the given table.

The incentives/cash awards shall be given according to the levels of participation and achievements of the players as per given table.

Minimum Rs 8000 and Maximum Rs 1 lakh shall be awarded to the outstanding sportsperson/s as mentioned in following table.



NOTE:

The IT policy of the University was adopted many years ago and is no longer able to cater to the requirements of IT facilities in the University, neither for the CITES&M nor for the users. In the post COVID scenario the use of IT and allied services has risen many time and also the threat to security of the University IT network both from within and outside has increased many fold. The Centre for IT has drafted a new comprehensive IT policy which covers almost all the aspects of IT, the expectations as well as responsibilities of the users.

The existing IT Policy of the University of Jammu is placed as Annexure-I.

The proposed new IT Policy of the University of Jammu is placed as Annexure-II.

Hence, the matter is submitted for consideration.

IT Policy:-Policy for Computer and Network Usage


University of Jammu provides a fully Networked, Computing environment to all the faculty members, researchers, students and staff for their academic use. All the users, using computing and IT-facilities are expected to abide by the certain rules in the form of IT-Policy. These rules are intended to preserve the utility and flexibility of the system, protect the privacy and work of the students and faculty and also to preserve the right to access the international networks to which the system is connected. The policy establishes University-wide strategies and responsibilities for protecting the Confidentiality, Integrity, and Availability of the information assets that are accessed, created, managed, and/or controlled by the University. Information assets addressed by the policy include data, information systems, computers, network devices, intellectual property, as well as documents. In case of complaints, appropriate action to be taken, will be decided and taken by the competent authority of the University of Jammu. The various aspects covered under the policy are:

- Faculty, staff, and students with authorized accounts shall be allowed to use the computing and IT facilities for academic purposes, official University business, and for personal purposes so long as such usage:
 - a) Does not violate any law, University policy or IT act of the Government of India
 - Does not interfere with the performance of the University duties or work of an academic nature.
 - Does not result in commercial gain or private profit other than that allowed by the University of Jammu.
- 2. Users are expected to respect the privacy of other users and they may not allow any other person to use their password or share their account. It is the user's responsibility to protect his/her account from any unauthorized use by changing passwords periodically and using passwords which cannot be easily hacked/cracked by others. Sharing of passwords for any purpose, whatsoever, is strictly prohibited.
- Any attempt to circumvent system security, guessing others passwords, or in any way
 gaining unauthorized access to local or network resources is strictly forbidden. Users
 must not use another person's computing account, attempt to forge an account to
 identity, or use a false account or e-mail address.
- Transferring copyrighted materials to or from the University systems without the
 consent of the owner is a violation of international law. In addition, use of the internet
 for commercial gain or profit is not allowed. If done so, it will be the sole responsibility
 of the user.



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- Downloading and installing of new software has to be done with the explicit consent of the respective facility in-charges. Installation of unlicensed software on the University facilities, or on an individual machines connected to the campus network, is strictly prohibited.
- 6. To the extent possible, users are expected to use only their official email addresses provided by the University of Jammu for official communications with other members of the University. All communication though e-mail can be authenticated if sent through the University domain (@jammuuniversity.in) implying that all other mails sent through other domains may not be considered official and no action can be taken on that..
- 7. It is forbidden to use electronic mail and other network communications facilities to harass, offend, or annoy other users of the network, including impeding their computing systems, software, or data. Commercial advertising or soliciting using the university resources is strictly prohibited. Spamming/malware/ransomware is strictly disallowed. Subscribing to mailing lists outside the Institute is an individual's responsibility.
- Sharing of email accounts for any purpose whatsoever is not allowed. Any special
 accounts, if need to be set up for conferences and other valid reasons as determined by
 the university authorities, must have a single designated user.
- 9. The Centre for IT has assigned an IP address to every computer system connected to the university network. The computer systems in various buildings have been allocated a range of IP addresses using a systematic approach. Therefore, any computer system connected to the network within a building is allocated an IP address only from a particular pool of IP address scheme allotted to that building. Hence, an IP address allocated for a particular computer system should not be used on any other computer even if the other computer belongs to the same individual. If required, an IP address for a new machine should be obtained separately.
- 10. To the extent possible, users are expected to connect only to the official University wi-fi network i.e. JU wi-fi for wireless access. Setting up of unsecured Wi-Fi systems on the University campus network is strictly prohibited. Securing of University Wi-Fi facility key and IP Address is the prime responsibility of the User. In case of any mishap users shall report the matter to the Centre for IT to block the compromised IP address.
- 11. The Centre maintains a proper location and corresponding IP address of each system. Hence Computer system, if required, may be moved from one location to another only with the prior written permission from the Centre for IT. Any deviation in this regard may lead to deactivation of the network connection which may be restored only through a written request from the end user after meeting the compliance.
- 12. All the computers and peripherals should be connected to the electrical points strictly through UPS. Power supply to the UPS should never be switched off, as continuous power supply to UPS ensures its proper charging and backup.
- Playing of Games in University laboratories or using University facilities for same is strictly prohibited.



- 14. Display and storage of offensive material like storing pornographic material on the disk, viewing pornographic material on the terminals is strictly disallowed and serious action shall be taken against the offenders.
- 15. The policy may change as and when it is considered appropriate. New policy or the changes in the existing policy will take effect immediately after incorporating the proposed changes.
- 16. An employee who leaves the University after retirement/re-employment or otherwise ,can have his e-mail account validated up to six months which may be extended after due approval of the Director IT by another six months with a proper request letter.
- 17. All Computer systems in the university should have anti-virus software installed, and it should be active at all times. The primary user of a computer system is responsible for keeping the computer system compliant with this virus protection. The user should make sure that the anti-virus is updated and running correctly.
- 18. As far as possible, all the departments / sections should procure all IT equipment's that comply with the green technology initiatives like energy saving technology, Green packaging etc.
- 19. Violations of IT-policy shall be treated as academic misconduct or indiscipline and depending upon the nature of the violation, the university authorities may fine or /and take an appropriate action. In extreme cases, the access to the campus network may be completely disabled and the matter be referred to the University authorities.







2. Introduction

University of Jammu provides IT resources to support the educational, instructional, research, and administrative activities of the University and to enhance the efficiency and productivity of the employees. These resources are meant as tools to access and process information related to their areas of work. These resources help them to remain well informed and carry out their functions in an efficient and effective manner.

This document establishes specific requirements for the use of all IT resources at JU. This policy applies to all users of computing resources owned or managed by JU. Individuals covered by the policy include (but are not limited to) JU faculty and visiting faculty, staff, students, alumni, guests, external individuals, organizations, departments, offices, affiliated colleges and any other entity which fall under the management of University of Jammu accessing network services via JU's computing facilities.

For the purpose of this policy, the term 'IT Resources' includes all university owned, licensed, or managed hardware and software, and use of the university network via a physical or wireless connection, regardless of the ownership of the computer or device connected to the network.

Misuse of these resources can result in unwanted risk and liabilities for the university. It is, therefore, expected that these resources are used primarily for university related purposes and in a lawful and ethical way.

3. Scope

This policy governs the usage of IT Resources from an end user's perspective. This policy is applicable to all individuals/ users/ entities, who use the IT Resources of JU.



4. Objective


The objective of this policy is to ensure proper access to and usage of JU's IT resources and prevent their misuse by the users. Use of resources provided by JU implies the user's agreement to be governed by this policy.

- University IT policy exists to maintain, secure, and ensure legal and appropriate use of Information technology infrastructure established by the University on the campus.
- This policy establishes University-wide strategies and responsibilities for protecting the Confidentiality, Integrity, and Availability of the information assets that are accessed, created, managed, and/or controlled by the University.
- Information assets addressed by the policy include data, information systems, computers, network devices, intellectual property, as well as documents and verbally communicated information.

5. Roles and Responsibilities

The following roles and responsibilities are envisaged from each entity respectively.


- JU shall implement appropriate controls to ensure compliance with this policy by their users. Centre for IT shall be the primary implementing Agency and shall provide necessary support in this regard.
- Centre for IT shall ensure resolution of all incidents related to the security aspects
 of this policy by their users. Implementing Agency shall provide the requisite
 support in this regard.
- Use JU's IT resources for those activities that are consistent with the academic, research and public service mission of the University and are not "Prohibited Activities".
- 4) All users shall comply with existing national, state and other applicable laws.
- Abide by existing telecommunications and networking laws and regulations.
- Follow copyright laws regarding protected commercial software or intellectual property.




- 7) As a member of the University community, JU provides use of scholarly and/or work-related tools, including access to the Library, certain computer systems, and servers, software and databases and the Internet. It is expected from University Community to have a reasonable expectation of unobstructed use of these tools, of certain degrees of privacy and of protection from abuse and intrusion by others sharing these resources. Authorized users can expect their right to access information and to express their opinion to be protected as it is for paper and other forms of non-electronic communication.
- Users of JU shall not install any network/security device on the network without consultation with the IA.
- 9) It is responsibility of the University Community to know the regulations and policies of the University that apply to appropriate use of the University's technologies and resources. University Community is responsible for exercising good judgment in the use of the University's technological and information resources. Just because an action is technically possible does not mean that it is appropriate to perform that action.
- 10) As a representative of the JU community, each individual is expected to respect and uphold the University's good name and reputation in any activities related to use of ICT communications within and outside the university.
- 11) Competent Authority of JU should ensure proper dissemination of this policy.

6. Acceptable Use

- An authorized user may use only the IT resources he/she has authorization. No user should use another individual's account, or attempt to capture or guess other users' passwords.
- 2. A user is individually responsible for appropriate use of all resources assigned to him/her, including the computer, the network address or port, software and hardware. Therefore, he/she is accountable to the University for all use of such resources. As an authorized JU user, he/she should not engage in or enable unauthorized users to access the network by using IT resources of JU or a personal computer that is connected to the JU campus wide Local Area Network (LAN).







University, based on approval from competent authority, reserves and retains the right to access and inspect stored information with the consent of the user.

9. User Compliance

When an individual uses JU's IT resources, and accepts any University issued computing accounts, it means that the individual agrees to comply with this and all other computing related policies. It is the responsibility of the individual to keep oneself up-to-date on changes in the IT policy of JU and adapt to those changes as necessary from time to time.

10. Access to the Network


Access to Internet and Intranet

- A user shall register the client system and obtain one-time approval from the competent authority before connecting the client system to the University Campus wide LAN.
- 2) JU shall maintain two independent networks, i.e. Internet and Intranet. Both the networks shall not have any physical connection/devices between them. End point compliance shall be implemented on both the networks to prevent unauthorized access to data.
- 3) Users shall not undertake any activity through any website or applications to bypass filtering of the network or perform any other unlawful acts which may harm the network's performance or security.

10.2. Access to JU's Wireless Networks For connecting to a JU's wireless network, user shall ensure the following:

 A user shall register the access device and obtain one-time approval from the competent authority (Centre for IT) before connecting the access device to the JU's wireless network.

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
- The university is bound by its End User License Agreement (EULA), respecting certain third party resources; a user is expected to comply with all such agreements when using such resources.
- Users should make a reasonable effort to protect his/her passwords and to secure resources against unauthorized use or access.
- No user must attempt to access restricted portions of the network, an operating system, security software or other administrative applications without appropriate authorization by the system owner or administrator.
- Users must comply with the policies and guidelines for any specific set of resources to which he/she have been granted access.
- When other policies are more restrictive than this policy, the more restrictive policy takes precedence.

7. Privacy and Personal Rights

- All users of the university's IT resources are expected to respect the privacy and personal rights of others.
- Do not access or copy another user's email, data, programs, or other files without authorization and approval of the Competent Authority (CA).
- 3) While the University does not generally monitor or limit content of information transmitted on the campus wide LAN, it reserves the right to access and review such information under certain conditions after due approval of the competent authority.

8. Privacy in Email

While every effort is made to ensure the privacy of JU email users, this may not always be possible. Since employees are granted use of electronic information systems and network services to conduct University business, there may be instances when the



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- Wireless client systems and wireless devices shall not be allowed to connect to the JU's wireless access points without due authentication.
- To ensure information security, it is recommended that users should not connect their devices to unsecured wireless networks.

10.3. Filtering and blocking of sites:


- Centre for IT or any other Implementing Agency (IA) may block content over the Internet which is in contravention of the relevant provisions of the IT Act 2000 and other applicable laws or which may pose a security threat to the network.
- Centre for IT or any other Implementing Agency (IA) may also block content which, in the opinion of the university, is inappropriate or may adversely affect the productivity of the users.

11. Monitoring and Privacy

- Centre for IT or any other Implementing Agency (IA) shall have the right to audit networks and systems at regular intervals, from the point of compliance to this policy.
- 2) IA/Nodal Agency, for security related reasons or for compliance with applicable laws, may access, review, copy or delete any kind of electronic communication or files stored on University provided devices under intimation to the user. This includes items such as files, e-mails, posts on any electronic media, Internet history etc.
- IA may monitor user's online activities on University network, subject to such Standard Operating Procedures of Gol norms.

12. E-mail Access from the University Network

 E-mail service authorized by JU and implemented by the Centre for IT shall only be used for all official correspondence and only for private use sparingly.







2) More details in this regard are provided in the "E-mail Usage Policy of JU".

13. Access to Social Media Sites from JU Network

- Use of social networking sites by JU users is governed by "Framework and Guidelines for use of Social Media for Government Organizations".
- User shall comply with all the applicable provisions under the IT Act 2000, while posting any information on social networking sites.
- 3) User shall adhere to the "Terms of Use" of the relevant social media platform/website, as well as copyright, privacy, defamation, contempt of court, discrimination, harassment and other applicable laws.
- 4) User shall report any suspicious incident as soon as possible to the competent authority. 5) User shall always use high security settings on social networking sites.
- 6) User shall not post any material that is offensive, threatening, and obscene, infringes copyright, defamatory, hateful, harassing, bullying, discriminatory, racist, sexist, or is otherwise unlawful.
- User shall not disclose or use any confidential information obtained in their capacity as an employee of the university.
- User shall not make any comment or post any material that might otherwise cause damage to JU's reputation.
- 9) Users shall be bound by the JU's social media policy and employees shall also be bound by the state government's social media directions issued from time to time.

14. Use of IT Devices Issued by JU

IT devices issued by the JU to a user shall be primarily used for academic, research and any other university related purposes and in a lawful and ethical way and shall be governed by the practices defined in the Section "Use of IT Devices on JU Network". The aforesaid section covers best practices related to use of desktop devices, portable devices, external storage media and peripherals devices such as printers and scanners.



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15. Security Incident Management Process

- A security incident is defined as any adverse event that can impact the availability, integrity, confidentiality and authority of University's data.
- 2) IA reserves the right to deactivate/remove any device from the network if it is deemed as a threat and can lead to a compromise of a system under intimation to the competent authority of the university.
- Any security incident noticed must immediately be brought to the notice of the Indian Computer Emergency Response Team (ICERT) and the IA.
- 4) Notwithstanding anything in the above clause, the disclosure of logs relating to or contained in any IT Resource, to Law Enforcement agencies and other organizations by the IA shall be done as per the IT Act 2000 and other applicable laws.
- S) IA shall neither accept nor act on the request from any other organization, save as provided in this clause, for scrutiny or release of logs.

16. Intellectual Property SITY OF JAMANU

Material accessible through the JU's network and resources may be subject to protection under privacy, publicity, or other personal rights and intellectual property rights, including but not limited to, copyrights and laws protecting patents, trademarks, trade secrets or other proprietary information. Users shall not use JU's network and resources in any manner that would infringe, dilute, misappropriate, or otherwise violate any such rights.

17. Enforcement

- This policy is applicable to all the users of JU. It is mandatory for all users to adhere to the provisions of this policy.
- Each entity of JU shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with the provisions of this policy. The Implementing Agency would provide necessary technical assistance to the user entities in this regard.

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18. Deactivation

- In case of any threat to security of JU's systems or network from the resources being used by a user, the resources being used may be deactivated immediately by the IA.
- Subsequent to such deactivation, the concerned user and the competent authority of the university shall be informed.

19. Audit of JU Network Infrastructure

The security audit of NIC network infrastructure shall be conducted periodically by an organization approved by the university.

20. Review

Future changes in this Policy, as deemed necessary, shall be made by the Technical Committee (ICT) with the approval of the Competent Authority of the university.

21. IT Hardware Installation Policy

University network user community needs to observe certain precautions while getting their computers or peripherals installed so that he/she may face minimum inconvenience due to interruption of services due to hardware failures.

A. Who is Primary User

An individual in whose room the computer is installed and is primarily used by him/her, is considered to be "primary" user. If a computer has multiple users, none of whom are considered the "primary" user, the department Head should make an arrangement and make a person responsible for compliance.

B. What are End User Computer Systems

Apart from the client PCs used by the users, the university will consider servers not directly administered by Centre for IT, as end-user computers. If no primary user can be identified, the department must assume the responsibilities identified for end-users. Computer systems, if any, that are acting as servers which provide services to other users







on the Intranet/Internet though registered with the Centre for IT, are still considered under this policy as "end-users" computers.

C. Warranty & Annual Maintenance Contract

Computers purchased by any Section/ Department/ Project should preferably be with 3 years onsite comprehensive warranty. After the expiry of warranty, computers should be under annual maintenance contract. Such maintenance should include standard repair and maintenance procedures as may be defined by Centre for IT from time to time.

D. Power Connection to Computers and Peripherals

All the computers and peripherals should be connected to the electrical point strictly through UPS. Power supply to the UPS should never be switched off, as continuous power supply to UPS is required for battery recharging, till such instances wherein the UPS is to be left unattended. Further, these UPS systems should be connected to the electrical points that are provided with proper earthling and have properly laid electrical wiring.

E. Network Connection


While connecting the computer to the network, the connecting network cable should be away from any electrical/electronic equipment, as they interfere with the network communication. Further, no other electrical/electronic equipment should be shared with the power supply from where the computer and its peripherals are connected.

F. File and Print Sharing Facilities

File and print sharing facilities on the computer over the network should be installed only when it is absolutely required. When files are shared through network, they should be protected with password and also with read only access rule.

G. Maintenance of Computer Systems provided by the University

For all the computers that were purchased by the university centrally and distributed by the Estate Branch, University Computer Maintenance Cell attached with Centre for IT will attend to the complaints related to any maintenance related problems.



22. Software Installation and Licensing Policy

Any computer purchases made by the individual departments/projects should make sure that such computer systems have all licensed software (operating system, antivirus software and necessary application software) installed.

Respecting the anti-piracy laws of the country, University IT policy does not allow any pirated/unauthorized software installation on the university owned computers and the computers connected to the university campus network. In case of any such instances, university will hold the department/individual personally responsible for any pirated software installed on the computers located in their department/individuals' rooms.

A. Operating System and its Updating

Individual users should make sure that respective computer systems have their OS updated in respect of their service packs/patches, through internet. Checking for updates and updating of the OS should be performed at least once in a week or so.

University as a policy encourages user community to go for open source software such as Linux, Open office to be used on their systems wherever possible.

B. Use of software on Desktop systems

- a. Users shall not copy or install any software on their own on their desktop systems, including privately owned shareware and freeware without the approval of the competent authority.
- b. Any software installed should be for activities of the university only.

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C. Antivirus Software and its updating

Computer systems used in the university should have anti-virus software installed, and it should be active at all times. The primary user of a computer system is responsible for keeping the computer system compliant with this virus protection policy.

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Individual users should make sure that respective computer systems have current virus protection software installed and maintained.

D. Backups of Data

Individual users should perform regular backups of their vital data. Users should keep their valuable data backups in external storage devices such as pen drives, external HDD etc.

23. Use of IT Devices on JU Network

This section provides the best practices related to use of desktop devices, portable devices, external storage media and peripheral devices such as printers and scanners on JU's network.

23.1. Desktop Devices

1) Use and Ownership


Desktops shall normally be used only for transacting university's works. Users shall exercise their own good judgment and discretion towards use of desktop devices for personal use to the minimum extent possible.

2) Security and Proprietary Information

- User shall take prior approval from the IA to connect any access device to the JU's network.
- b. User shall keep their passwords secure and not share their account details. Users shall keep strong and secure passwords as per the password policy of the application.
- c. All active desktop computers shall be secured with a password-protected screensaver which should be set with automatic activation at 10 minutes or less, or log-off when the system is unattended.
- d. Users shall ensure that updated virus-scanning software is running in all systems. Users shall exercise due caution when opening e-mail attachments received from unknown senders as they may contain viruses, e-mail bombs, or Trojan horse code.

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- e. User shall report any loss of data or accessories to the IA and competent authority of JU.
- f. User shall obtain authorization from the competent authority before taking any JU issued desktop outside the premises of the university.
- g. Users shall properly shut down the systems before leaving the office/ department.
- h. Users shall abide by instructions or procedures as directed by the Centre for IT from time to time.
- i. If users suspect that their computer has been infected with a virus (e.g. it might have become erratic or slow in response), it should be reported to the IA (Centre for IT) for corrective action.

23.2. Sharing of data

Users shall not share their account(s), passwords, Personal Identification Numbers (PIN), digital signatures certificate or similar information or devices which is used for identification and authorization purposes.

23.3. Use of Portable devices

Devices covered under this section include JU issued laptops, mobiles, iPads, tablets, PDAs etc. Use of the devices shall be governed by the following:

- a. User shall be held responsible for any unauthorized usage of their JU issued access device by a third party.
- b. Users shall keep the JU issued devices with them at all times or store them in a secured location when not in use. User should not leave the devices unattended in public locations (e.g. classrooms, meeting rooms, restaurants etc.).
- c. User shall ensure that the portable devices are password protected and auto lockout enabled. The password used should be as strong as the device may support and should be as per the password policy of the application.







- d. Centre for IT shall ensure that the latest operating system, anti-virus and application patches are available on all the devices, in coordination with the User. Firewalls shall be enabled, if possible.
- Users shall wipe or securely delete data from the device before returning/ disposing it off.
- Lost, stolen, or misplaced devices shall be immediately reported to the IA/ and the competent authority.
- g. When installing software, user shall review the application permissions to ensure that unwanted information regarding the user is not shared with the application provider.

24. Network (Intranet & Internet) Use Policy

Network connectivity provided through the University, referred to hereafter as "the Network", either through an authenticated network access connection or a Virtual Private Network (VPN) connection, is governed under the University IT Policy. The Centre for IT is responsible for the ongoing maintenance and support of the Network, exclusive of local applications. Problems within the University's network should be reported to Centre for IT.

A. IP Address Allocation

Any computer (PC/Server) that will be connected to the university network, should have an IP address assigned by the Centre for IT. Following a systematic approach, the range of IP addresses that will be allocated will be based on Virtual LAN (VLAN) created against each entity or objective. Any device connected to the network will be allocated IP address only from that address pool. Further, each network port in the room from where that computer will be connected will have binding internally with that IP address so that no other person uses that IP address unauthorized from any other location.

As and when a new computer is installed in any location, it will be allocated as per the DHCP pool policies.

An IP address allocated for a particular computer system should not be used on any other computer even if that other computer belongs to the same individual and will be

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connected to the same port. IP address for each computer should be obtained separately by filling up a requisition form meant for this purpose.

B. DHCP and Proxy Configuration by Individual Departments /Sections/ Users

Use of any computer at end user location as a DHCP server to connect to more computers through an individual switch/hub and distributing IP addresses (public or private) should strictly be avoided, as it is considered absolute violation of IP address allocation policy of the university. Similarly, configuration of proxy servers should also be avoided, as it may interfere with the services run by the Centre for IT.

Even configuration of any computer with additional network interface card and connecting another computer to it is considered as proxy/DHCP configuration.

Non-compliance to the IP address allocation policy will result in disconnecting the port from which such computer is connected to the network. Connection will be restored after receiving written assurance of compliance from the concerned department/user.

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C. Running Network Services on the Servers

- a. Individual departments/individuals connecting to the university network over the LAN may run server software, e.g., HTTP/Web server, SMTP server, FTP server, only after bringing it to the knowledge of the Centre for IT in writing and after meeting the requirements of the university IT policy for running such services. Non-compliance with this policy is a direct violation of the university IT policy, and will result in termination of their connection to the Network.
- b. Centre for IT takes no responsibility for the content of machines connected to the Network, regardless of those machines being University or personal property.
- c. Centre for IT will be constrained to disconnect client machines where potentially damaging software is found to exist. A client machine may also be

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
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disconnected if the client's activity adversely affects the Network's performance.

- d. Access to remote networks using a University's network connection must be in compliance with all policies and rules of those networks. This applies to any and all networks to which the University Network connects. University network and computer resources are not to be used for personal commercial purposes.
- Network traffic will be monitored for security and for performance reasons at Centre for IT.
- f. Impersonation of an authorized user while connecting to the Network is in direct violation of this policy and will result in the termination of the connection.

D. Internet Bandwidth obtained by Other Departments

- a. Internet bandwidth acquired by any department of the university under any research programme/project should ideally be pooled with the university's Internet bandwidth, and be treated as university's common resource.
- b. Under particular circumstances, which prevent any such pooling with the university Internet bandwidth, such network should be totally separated from the university's campus network. All the computer systems using that network should have separate VLANs based on grouping criterion.
- c. IP address scheme (private as well as public) and the university gateway should not be specified as alternative gateway. Such networks should be adequately equipped with necessary network security measures as laid down by the university IT policy. One copy of the network diagram giving the details of the network design and the IP address schemes used may be submitted to Centre for IT.
- Non-compliance to this policy will be direct violation of the university's IT security policy.



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25. Email Account Usage Policy

JU provides official email access privileges to its users. In an effort to handle the efficient information dissemination among the administration, faculty members, staffs and students, it is recommended to avail official email with University of Jammu's domain. The general e-mail address format used for faculty, staff, office is username@jammuuniversity.ac.in, unless specifically requested and for research scholars is username_box@jammuuniversity.ac.in.

In an effort to increase the efficient distribution of critical information to all faculty, staff and students, and the University's administrators, it is recommended to utilize the university's e-mail services, for formal University communication and for academic & other official purposes.

E-mail for formal communications will facilitate the delivery of messages and documents to campus and extended communities or to distinct user groups and individuals. Formal University communications are official notices from the University to faculty, staff and students. These communications may include administrative content, such as human resources information, policy messages, general University messages, official announcements, etc.

To receive these notices, it is essential that the e-mail address be kept active by using it regularly. Staff and faculty may use the email facility by logging on to http://gmail.com with their User ID and password. For obtaining the university's email account, user may contact Centre for IT for email account and default password by submitting an application in a prescribed proforma.

Users may be aware that by using the email facility, the users are agreeing to abide by the following policies:

- The facility should be used primarily for academic and official purposes and to a limited extent for personal purposes.
- 2) Using the facility for illegal/commercial purposes is a direct violation of the university's IT policy and may entail withdrawal of the facility. The illegal use includes, but is not limited to, the unlicensed and illegal copying or distribution of software, sending of

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unsolicited bulk e-mail messages. And generation of threatening, harassing, abusive, obscene or fraudulent messages/images.

- 3) While sending large attachments to others, user should make sure that the recipient has email facility that allows him to receive such large attachments.
- 4) User should keep the mail box used space within about 80% usage threshold, as 'mail box full' or 'mailbox almost full' situation will result in bouncing of the mails, especially when the incoming mail contains large attachments.
- 5) User should not open any mail or attachment that is from unknown and suspicious source. Even if it is from known source, and if it contains any attachment that is of suspicious in nature or looks dubious, user should get confirmation from the sender about its authenticity before opening it. This is very much essential from the point of security of the user's computer, as such messages may contain viruses that have potential to damage the valuable information on your computer.
- 6) User should not share his/her email account's credentials with others, as the individual account holder is personally held accountable, in case of any misuse of that email account.
- User should refrain from intercepting, or trying to break into others email accounts, as it is infringing the privacy of other users.
- 8) While using the computers that are shared by other users as well, any email account that was accidentally left open by another user, should be promptly closed without peeping into its contents, by the user who has occupied that computer for its use.
- Impersonating email account of others will be taken as a serious offence under the IT security policy.
- 10) It is ultimately each individual's responsibility to keep their e-mail account free from violations of university's email usage policy.
- (11) All the mails detected as spam mails go into SPAM_MAIL folder of the respective users' mail accounts. Users are requested to open these folders periodically to check any important mail wrongly stamped as SPAM mail and went into this folder. It is recommended to empty this folder as frequently as possible.

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The above laid down policies particularly 1 to 11 are broadly applicable even to the email services that are provided by other service providers such as Gmail, Hotmail, Yahoo, RediffMail etc., as long as they are being used from the university's campus network, or by using the resources provided by the university to the individual for official use even from outside.

26. Disposal of ICT equipment

The disposal of ICT hardware equipment shall be done as per the Standard Operating Procedures of the E-Waste Management of the university.

27. Breach of This Policy

Users are encouraged to be vigilant and to report any suspected violations of this Policy immediately to the IT Helpdesk centrefor(T@jammuuniversity.ac,in .On receipt of notice (or where the University otherwise becomes aware) of any suspected breach of this Policy, the University reserves the right to suspend a user's access to University's Data.

If any breach of this Policy is observed, then (in addition to the above) disciplinary action up to and including dismissal in the case of Staff, expulsion in the case of Students or contract termination in the case of third parties may be taken in accordance with the University's disciplinary procedures.

28. Revisions to Policy

The University reserves the right to revise the terms of this Policy at any time. Any such revisions will be noted in the revision history of the policy, which are available on the JU website and by continuing to use the University's IT Resources following any update it is considered acceptance on the revised terms of this Policy.
