





## THE MUMBAI BLASTS CASE



**J**USTICE delayed is justice denied is a truism. That's from the victim's perspective in any legal case. But what about justice delayed to the accused? After 19 years in jail, 12 persons charged with masterminding the 7/11 Mumbai blasts were acquitted as the judges of the Bombay High Court tore into the police investigation.
