## It's Historic: University of Jammu is A++

Jammu: In a historic achievement, the University of Jammu has secured the coveted A++ grade in the Cycle IV NAAC Accreditation, attaining an impressive CGPA of 3.72 on a 4-point scale—its highest ever.

Marking a significant leap from its previous A+ grade with a CGPA of 3.51 in Cycle III, this accomplishment reflects the University's unwavering commitment to quality enhancement and academic excellence. Expressing his pride, Vice Chancellor Prof. Umesh Rai stated, "This remarkable milestone stands as a testament to our dedication to academic innovation, research excellence, and institutional integrity."

Joined by senior university officials, Prof. Rai credited the collective efforts of the entire University community—faculty, scholars, officers, students, staff, and alumni—for this success. "This A++ accreditation is not merely a recognition; it's a reaffirmation of our shared vision to position the University of Jammu as a global leader in higher education and research," he added.

By allowing students to select courses from diverse fields of study, this four-year undergraduate degree programme equips them with a well-rounded education that nurtures critical thinking, creativity and adaptabilitytraits essential for thriving in the rapidly evolving global landscape.

The University of Jammu has also established twelve clubs under an umbrella of "Utsaah" The Clubs Consortium, which denotes the enthusiasm, vigour and vitality in the students. The main objective of establishing these clubs is to provide an extra space outside the structured curriculum, where a harmonious and holistic development of the personality can take place. By participating in the activities organised by these clubs, students will be able to explore their hidden talent and then exhibit it in a free and open ended space. The idea is to enhance their interest in creativity, which can help them in discovering something within their own self and all this shall be done in an environment of entertainment. As per National Education Policy-2020, Sports and Cultural activities are part of curriculum and these are no more considered as extracurricuoff-site campuses as well, considering the importance of border and far-flung areas.

JU POST: As Registrar, you interact closely with students. How do you ensure their grievances are addressed, and what's your approach to maintaining harmonious relations?

Dr. Neeraj Sharma: Students are the heart beat of the University; it is of the students, by the students and for the students. Today's students are IT-savvy, well-informed and they present convincing arguments. We follow transparency and fairness while addressing their genuine con-cerns. Since for the past many vears. # Journalism Department holds 3-day long Workshop on Post-Production Techniques
