JU achieves 21st Rank in State **Public Universities Category**

JAMMU:

University has marked a significant stride in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) 2025, reflecting its continued dedication to Academic Excellence, Innovation, and Institutional Growth.

In a notable development, University has improved its standing in the Public State Universities Category, rising from 23rd rank in 2024 to 21st rank in 2025. This progress highlights the University's sustained efforts toward enhancing Teaching, Research, Infrastructure, and overall Institutional Performance.

In the University Category, JU secured the 51st position demonstrating continued excellence and a strong national presence, follow-

ing its 50th rank last year. Additionally, the university retained its 87th rank in the Overall Category, reaffirming its consistent performance among India's top institutions. The NIRF assessment is based on multiple parameters, including Teaching and Learning Resources, Research and Professional Practice, Graduation Outcomes, Outreach and Inclusivity, and Perception

Prof. Umesh Rai, Vice Chancellor remarked that these rankings reflect the dedication of our faculty, students, and staff. He further said that focus remains on creating a stimulating learning environment and advancing research capabilities and University is motivated to push further and aim for higher rankings in the coming year.



The workshop was graced by Vijaya Rahatkar, Chairperson of NCW and a noted social activist, who attended as the Chief Guest. In her keynote address, she lauded the initiative as part of a larger journey to build a safe, sensitive, and gender-equal society. She stressed that empowering youth with awareness of gender equality and women's rights is central to strengthening the nation, adding that if India is to harness its demographic dividend by 2047, it must equip young people with the right knowledge, opportunities, and di-

Highlighting the importance of legal literacy, the Chairperson pointed out that laws for the protection of women particularly, against sexual harassment and cybercrime, will only achieve their purpose if young people are aware of their rights and confident enough to act on them. Citing the



example of Zero FIR, she observed that even educated students often lack awareness of such powerful provisions. She stressed that this knowledge not only protects women but also prevents youth, including boys, from making mistakes that could carry serious consequences.

Drawing inspiration from India's history of courageous and visionary women such as Rani Lakshmibai and Savitribai Phule, the Chairperson urged students to carry forward their legacy by embracing gender equality not as a slogan but as a movement. She also cautioned that in the digital era,

cybercrimes pose new challenges, making awareness of the Cyber

Act and safe social media use vital. Introducing NCW's Yashoda AI programme, she noted that it has been designed to address issues emerging in the age of artificial intelligence, and called upon the youth to work collectively to uphold women's rights, dignity, and safety.

JU mourns demise of Prof. R.R. Sharma, former Vice Chancellor

University mourned the demise of Prof. R.R. Sharma, an eminent academician, visionary leader, and former Vice Chancellor of the University (Dec 1996 – Nov 2002).

Expressing shock and deep grief over the sad demise, Vice Chancellor Prof Umesh Rai hailed the immense contribution of Prof R R Sharma in steering the University on the path of academic excel-

"Demise of Prof Sharma is a great loss for Jammu and Kashmir in general and the JU in particular ", the Vice Chancellor said, adding that his passing away has left the academic fraternity and the University

community deeply shocked and profoundly saddened.

'Prof Sharma's departure has created a huge void in the academic arena of Jammu and Kashmir, which is hard to fill", Prof

Educated in the Soviet Union, Prof R R Sharma was a distinguished scholar, who served with great distinction as a Senior Professor at the Centre for Russian, Central Asian, and East European Studies, School of International Studies, Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU) from 1973 until his retirement. He was later conferred the title of Professor Emeritus in recognition of his outstanding academic contributions and also

served as Dean of the School of International Studies. His intellectual depth, scholarly rigor, and global perspective shaped generations of students and researchers, leaving behind a legacy of excellence in international studies.

As Vice Chancellor of the University. Prof. Sharma's tenure was marked by remarkable academic growth and institutional advancement. His vision, integrity, and tireless efforts laid a strong foundation for the University's continued progress. In recognition of his lifelong dedication to education, he was honoured with the Gold Medal and Cash Award for Eminent Personalities of Jammu & Kashmir by the State Government in 2002 and 2006—a fitting tribute to his towering contributions to academia

Prof. Sharma is survived by his beloved wife, Mrs. Vijay Sharma, an alumna of the Department of Political Science, and their two children.

"Prof. Sharma's vision and leadership will continue to inspire generations of scholars and administrators. His legacy is deeply interwoven with the growth of this institution," the University said in its condolence message.

"May his noble soul rest in eternal peace, and may his life's work continue to illuminate the path of learning and leadership", the message read.



Dogri delicacy 'Kalari'—relishing foodies across J&K

Anyone who wants to relish the traditional Dogra cuisines then do not miss the mouth-watering delicacy of Udhampur district's 'Kalari', a fast emerging first choice for the foodies across the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

An all-weather street snack usually eaten with kulcha (bun), 'Kalari'-- a popular delicacy all over north India is a local milk byproduct that resembles mozzarella cheese, but different in taste.

It is endemic to Shivalik hills of Jammu, particularly District Udhampur.

Initiated by the Udhampur in collaboration with Jammu and Kashmir National Rural Livelihood Mission, 'Kalari' is now reaching almost every household on demand under "The Himalayan Bliss".

The members of Jammu and Kashmir National Rural Livelihood Mission are approximately preparing around two quintals of 'Kalari' and about 200 members are involved in the business.

Further, the District Co-Operative Department Udhampur has registered three milk and milk processing cooperatives focussing particularly on "Kalari".

The JKRLM, Basantgarh, District Udhampur has also recently started packaging of "Kalari" with the help of local entrepreneur and as far as licensing and marketing of the product is concerned, been taken care of and the packed 'Kalari' is also available at various departmental stores and supermarkets in Jammu.

The product is being prepared and packaged by Self Help Groups (SHG) members of block Basantgarh and being transported with the help of local transport to Jammu.

The JKRLM Udhampur had planned to take up this initiative to all SHGs as 'Kalari' being prepared in almost every household of district Udhampur and the co-operatives can certainly play a big role in flourishing the Kalari industry.

On its export across the country, after getting the GI registration certificate for Udhampur Kaladi, nearly 5000 people being benefitted directly who are engaged in the production of Milk, its processing, making, selling and trading of the product to other places from Udhampur."

Only the Udhampur made Kaladi will be treated as 'Udhampur Kaladi' under Intellectual Property Right as GI product and if any person beyond the district will sell in its name and title will be treated as illegal, said an official.

The facilities in the sector of Dairy Development like storage and freezing of milk, storage of raw Kaladi, branding at Delhi and other Metros are also into the pipeline.

The NRLM Basantgarh is serving two purposes, firstly providing income to women in rural areas and popularising the traditional cheese

NRLM is also mulling to tie-up with District Cooperative Department Udhampur to further increase the employment avenues for rural women through Kaladi on the lines of Amul Cooperatives," he revealed.

The District Udhampur Administration has already registered four Dairy Cooperative Societies and Cooperatives while 15 are proposed for the registration.

Notably, 'Kalari' is also in high demand at all the tourist destinations across the Union Territory and being relished by the tourists from different parts of the country.

Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh, who is also Member Parliament Kathua-Udhampur Lok Sabha Constituency had also said that under "One District One Product", #Udhampur in #JammuAndKashmir has designated milk product "Kalari" as the District Brand. Self Help Women Groups being encouraged to promote Kalari for consumption as well as livelihood.

'Purple Revolution', a game changer-in J&K's hilly belts



The story of lavender cultivation began through the intervention of CSIR-Indian Institute of Integrative Medicine (IIIM) Jammu under CSIR-Aroma Mission that over a span of time not only turned out to be a game changer but also bringing an economic prosperity vis-a-vis transforming the agricultural landscape in the Doda and Kishtwar districts of Jammu and Kashmir.

The CSIR-IIIM initiated a revolutionary journey aimed at transforming society with a plan to provide an alternative to traditional crops and improve farmers' income and then Lavender, a well known aromatic crop was selected under the CSIR-Aroma Mission.

Moreover, a series of awareness and training programs where farmers were educated and trained on the benefits of lavender cultivation, cultivation techniques, and the subsequent utilization of the crop led to the 'Purple Revolution' in Jammu and Kashmir.

'Purple Revolution' originating from Jammu and Kashmir offers attractive avenues and those who have entered the lavender sector are making a fortune out of it

Purple revolution is a new avenue of lavender startups that has put J&K on the World map and this is now known as the birthplace of 'Purple Revolution'.

It is a new avenue of agri start-ups because mostly is being talked in terms of IT start-ups without exploring indigenous resources at national assets. For the Himalayan resources, they were never explored and usually were carried by the western concept.

Nearly 5000 start-ups have already started

making a handsome livelihood and some of the youngsters have given up their corporate jobs and joined this mission considering it as a highly profitable vocation.

The youth of J&K associated with the Aroma StartUps ecosystem have emerged as brand ambassadors of 'Purple Revolution' across the country.

It was started on a very small note as 'Aroma Mission' because nobody was aware

Jammu and Kashmir has also become a role model for the rest of India, which was exemplified by the depiction of lavender farms of Bhaderwah town of district Doda.

Lavender, which was earlier only disseminated in Kashmir valley, has been covered under so got introduced to the temperate regions of the Jammu division, four states and Union Territory Ladakh.

In addition, the Syndicate endorsed the introduction of the Ph.D. programme in Philosophy and Mass communication and Journalism, further expanding the University's research landscape.

Further, the introduction of the Ph.D. Programme in Engineering at GCET, MIET (Autonomous College/Institute), and UIET, thereby opening new avenues for advanced research in engineering disciplines, was also endorsed.

The formation of an IT Club under the Centre for IT Enabled Services and Management (CITED&M) to nurture digital skills, innovation, and technological engagement among students was also endorsed.

The Syndicate also confirmed the minutes of the 121st meeting of the University Syndicate held on 29.01.2024 and 04.04.2024.

Earlier in the day, a meeting of the Finance Committee was also held, where key financial matters and budgetary allocations were thoroughly discussed and recommendations of the same were also endorsed.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks to the Chair, with members emphasizing their commitment to guiding the University towards greater excellence in teaching, and research.



Prof. Dipanker SenGupta, MAKAIAS, stressed the need to revisit the traditional knowledge system from time to time to keep its relevance. He talked about Greater India where Indian culture went beyond the Indian periphery. He hoped that the conference would help develop the understanding of traditional knowledge systems in Central Asia.

Prof. P. Stobdan, Former Ambassador to Kyrgyzstan, talked about the historical advent of Buddhism. He explained that Buddhism began with the early Thertradition, preserving Buddha's teachings in Sutra and Vinaya traditions. From thereon, he moved to the Sarvastivada Buddha's teachings in the Abhidharma - a text based on the science of mind.

Prof. Ajay Choudhary from Symbiosis International University talked about Buddhism and local values. He added that words like equality, fraternity, and prosperity written in the Constitution were inspired by it. Buddhism was not based on science but science was based on Buddhism. All the Fundamental Rights in the Constitution were basically part of Buddhism. He further said in his speech that the concept of a Welfare State mentioned in the Constitution was the same as the concept of Madhya Marg in Buddhism.

The function was attended by various faculty members from Jawaharlal Nehru University, Delhi University, Symbiosis University, and the University of Jammu. Dr. Chhering Tandup, Convener of the Conference, presented the formal vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the funding agencies and all the speakers and participants.


DSRS commemorated Birth Anniversary of Shaheed Bhagat Singh
