STATUTES GOVERNING THE AWARD OF POST BASIC NURSING DEGREE COURSE

1. ADMISSION:

There shall be a full time regular course designated as "Post Basic B.Sc. Nursing Degree Course" spread over two academic years.

The admission shall be open to the candidate(s) having:-

- a) Passed 10+2 from a recognized Board/University.

However the candidates who have passed 10+1 before 1986 & 10th before 1999 will also be eligible for admission; and

- b) Obtained a certificate in General Nursing and Midwifery and registered as R. N & R. M with any State Nursing Registration Council.


- c) A male nurse trained before the implementation of new integrated course besides being registered as nurse shall produce evidence of training approved by Indian Nursing Council for a similar duration in lieu of midwifery in any of the following areas:-


- O.T. Techniques

- Leprosy Nursing
- T.B. Nursing
- Psychiatric Nursing
- Neurological & Neurosurgical Nursing
- Community Health Nursing
- Cancer Nursing
- Orthopedic Nursing

N.B

1. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each paper.
2. **If a candidate fails in either theory or practical paper, he/she has to appear in both papers (theory and practical).**
3. Maximum number of attempts permitted for each paper shall be 3.
4. A candidate failing in more than two subjects will not be promoted to the next year.
5. Candidate shall not be admitted to the subsequent higher examination unless he/she has passed the previous examination.
6. All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas.

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7. One internal and one external examiner should jointly conduct practical examination for each student.
8. Teaching of Anatomy, Physiology, Pharmacology & Pathology will be integrated with clinical subject.
9. Minimum of 50% marks in each theory & practical paper separately is required for passing.
10. A candidate has to secure minimum of 33% in qualifying subject (English) for passing.

4. EXAMINATIONS:

- 4.1 The examination for first and second years shall ordinarily be held in the months of May/June or on such dates as approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 4.2 Each examination will be held twice a year as approved by the Vice-Chancellor i.e. in May/June and November/December.
- 4.3 Applications on the forms prescribed by the University, for admission to the Examinations alongwith the prescribed fee must reach the Controller of Examinations atleast one month before the date of commencement of the regular examination. Such application may be accepted with a late fee of Rs. 120/- for delay upto 5 days and Rs. 190/- for a delay upto ten days from the last date fixed for the receipt of forms without late fee or as per fee prescribed by the University. After this date the applications may be accepted with an additional late fee of Rs. 40/- per day for the next count of five days. Thereafter with a late fee of Rs. 2530/- for ten days before the commencement of examination and further late fee of Rs. 3790/- with special permission from the Vice Chancellor upto 5 days before the commencement of examination, provided question papers are available and can be sent to the centre of examination. The fee so prescribed is subject to the change as per the University notification from time to time.
- 4.4 Admission forms and fees for the biannual examination must reach the Controller of Examinations within 30 days after the declaration of result of regular examination. Late fee as given in the statue 4.3 shall be charged if the forms and the fees are received thereafter.
- 4.5 The amount of examination fee to be paid by the candidate shall be as follows:

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5. **ELIGIBILITY FOR THE EXAMINATION:**

The Examination each year shall be open to:

- a) A regular student who produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department/Principal of the College:
 - i) Certificate of good character.
 - ii) Certificate that the student attended the required number of lectures as prescribed under statutes.
 - iii) Certificate that the student has qualified the sessionals/clinicals etc.
- b) A candidate who was otherwise eligible to appear in the examination in the particular year but:
 - i) could not appear due to genuine reason (to be certified by an appropriate authority).
 - ii) was unable to pass the examination in any paper(s).

6. **ATTENDANCE:**

Subject to the Provisions of these statutes no candidate shall be eligible to appear in the examination unless he/she has:


- i. Minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of the absence in theory and practical/clinical in each subject for appearing in the examination) is essential.
Where a candidate falls short of attendance in paper(s)/subject(s) and wants to pursue shall be required to remain on the rolls of college in next academic year to make up the shortage.
- ii. The teacher concerned shall submit the attendance statement of the concerned students to the Head of the Department/Principal within 5 days after the class work of that year is over.

7. **CONDONATION:**


Notwithstanding anything contrary contained in any provision of these statutes, where any candidate falls short of attendance in any year it may be condoned after sufficient cause is shown by him/her in writing in this regard:


- a) By the Head of the Department/Principal of the College upto Maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered in all the papers. In addition to this a maximum of 5% of the total lectures delivered may also be condoned by the Vice-Chancellor.

Provided that no condition in shortage shall be permitted by the Vice-Chancellor unless endorsed and recommended by the Head of the Department/Principal of the College.








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8. PARTICIPATION IN SPORTS EVENTS:

- i) Notwithstanding anything contrary contained in these statutes, where a candidate participates in any one or more of the activities as specified in the University Statutes, he/she may be treated as present on all working days not exceeding 30 days in one academic year.
- ii) The candidate participating in such event must produce a copy of certificate to the Head of the Department/Principal of the College within seven days from the end of the event, failing which no such benefit shall be given.
- iii) The authority competent to issue the candidate participation certificate shall bring to the notice of the Head of the Department, name, roll no. of the candidate and the date(s) on which the activities were conducted within a week's period from the end of the event.

9. PROMOTION:

Notwithstanding any thing contained in the statute or regulation promotion to the next higher class shall be open to:

A candidate from 1st year to 2nd year in case he/she has passed the first year class.

Provided the candidate carrying not more than two backlogs in the lower examination, viz. 1st, shall be allowed provisional admission to the next higher class viz. 2nd, as the case may be. However such a candidate shall be allowed to appear in the examination only after he/she passes the lower examination in full.

10. RE-APPEAR:

- i) A candidate who has failed to secure required percentage of marks in one or more papers of annual examination shall be permitted to reappear in such paper (s) at a subsequent examination of the same year.

Provided further that no candidate shall be entitled to re-appear in a subject(s) where he/she has secured 50% or more marks.

- ii) A candidate, who secures less than 50% marks in all the subjects and fails to make up such deficiency within the stipulated period shall not be entitled to the award of the degree.

11. IMPROVEMENT OF DIVISION/PERCENTAGE:

- i) Subject to the other statutory provisions, a candidate who has secured less than 60% marks in the aggregate may apply for improvement of Division/Percentage in not more than one theory paper in a year and shall appear in the examination(s) along with the regular candidates of the year (s) in which he/she seeks to improve the Division/Percentage.

Provided, that the candidate applies for division improvement within a period of one year from the date of declaration of result of 2nd (Final) year.
